Tidwell also announced Tuesday that the entire Tiger Squad wished to congratulate the Eagles on their district co-championship. He stated, "We will be there backing the Eagles at bi-district, and we hope that they will go all the way to state this year."

The Tigers took a whopping 61-14 victory over Gustine last Thursday on Tiger Field, to take their fifth straight district game.

Charles Miles led the scoring attack for Star last Thursday night, with a 23-yard run from scrimmage, two 10-yard runs, and a 50-yard pass interception play. He also made TD passes of 34 and 27 yards to Dennis Coffman, and 38 yards to Ronnie Beard.

Edward Sanders scored on a 26-yard pass play from Robert Hunt, and freshman Jesse Beard scored on a 12-yard pass from Barry Miles with seven seconds left in the game.

Tidwell stated that Robert Hunt, Charles Miles, Dwight Head, Ronnie Beard, Barry Miles and Ed Sanders showed exceptionally well on defense.

The second string Tigers, Glyndon Sanders, Darrell Head, Marvin Hunt, Virgil Galbreath, Jesse Beard, and Jackie Sims, played nearly all the last quarter, and showed some very good potential, according to Tidwell.

## Eagles Become District Co-Champs After 10-6 Upset By Early Friday

### Eagles Meet Ranger In Coleman For Bi-District Game Saturday

The Goldthwaite High School Fighting Eagles, district 9-A co-champions for 1968, will meet the Ranger Bulldogs, district 10-A champions for 1968, in the bi-district play-off this Saturday night, November 23, at Coleman. Game time is 7:30 p. m., in Bluecat Stadium.

Ranger comes into the play-off with an 8-1 season record. Goldthwaite holds a 4-6 season, and a 3-1 district record.

Details for the bi-district play-off were worked out last Saturday morning, when officials from both schools met at Coleman. Those who attended from Goldthwaite were Superintendent LeRoy Beard, Principal Hoyett Browning, and Head Coach Les Johnson.

Charles Conrad, who is in

charge of ticket sales, announced that reserve seat tickets and student general admission tickets for the game went on sale Tuesday and will be on sale here at the Production Credit Association until 1:00 p. m. Friday.

Advance sale reserve seat tickets are \$2.00 and student general admission tickets for the student section are \$1.00. All tickets sold at the gate will be \$2.50. This includes student tickets.

Everyone is urged to pick up their reserve seat tickets at the PCA office before the deadline on Friday. Those who have not purchased their reserved seat tickets are reminded to do so as early as possible — while some are still available.

It was decided at the meeting Saturday that Goldthwaite will be designated as the home team and Ranger will be designated as the visiting team. Goldthwaite will have the West side of the stadium, and Ranger will have the East side.

The Bulldogs will wear maroon jerseys, and the Eagles will wear their gold jerseys.

The Dallas Officials Association will furnish five officials for the game. Four officials will be on the field and one will serve as statistician.

In case of a tie, the winner of the game will be determined under the official Interscholastic League rules as follows: 1st—Penetrations; 2nd—First Downs; and 3rd—Total Yards Gained.

### PEP RALLIES

Two pep rallies will be held prior to the bi-district game, one Friday night at 8:00 o'clock in the high school gym, and the other in the gym Saturday afternoon, at 3:30.

Coach Johnson urges all parents, townspeople and Eagle fans to attend the rallies. "We want the biggest crowd possible at each pep rally, since they play such a big part in getting the boys ready to play a game."

According to Johnson, Ranger is rated fourth in the State, while Goldthwaite is rated 110th. Ranger is picked to beat Goldthwaite by a 30-point margin. "The Eagles are rated the lowest of any class A team in the state play-offs and the game will be a real challenge, but we definitely feel like our boys can rise to the occasion if they have to," said Johnson.

The 1968 Goldthwaite High School Homecoming will be held Saturday, November 30, at 7:30 p. m., in the Goldthwaite Elementary School Lunchroom. All ex-students and former and present faculty members of Goldthwaite High School, along with their families and friends, are invited to the Homecoming, according to O'Donnell Newton, president of the Goldthwaite Ex-Students and Teachers Association.

Coach Les Johnson's GHS Eagles were nosed out of the District 9-A championship Friday night by the Early Longhorns, who came from behind in the fourth quarter to outlast the Eagles 10-6.

The tilt placed the Eagles in the co-championship spot with Bangs, both supporting a 3-1 district record. However, by virtue of a 14-9 victory over Bangs earlier in the season, Goldthwaite won the right to represent the League in the bid for bi-district against Ranger this Saturday night. Early finished with a 2-2 district mark, sweetened by their first victory ever over the Eagles.

A 45-yard field goal booted by Longhorn Joey Grissam in the second period, gave Early a 3-0 halftime lead. The first half was strictly a defensive battle on both sides.

Eagle sophomore back, Joe Dan Hardgrave, gave the Eagles a 6-3 edge in the third quarter, with a 45-yard scamper. Richard Scott's PAT was blocked.

Longhorn running back, Dale Dodson, provided the winning score for Early. The senior went over from three yards out, to climax an 80-yard drive. Grissam kicked the extra point to give Early their 10-6 winning score.

Johnson singled out Mack Casbeer and Sam Watson as outstanding players. Friday night.
