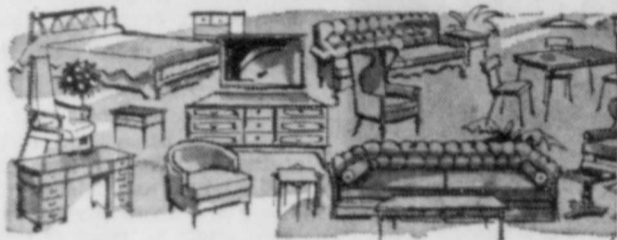

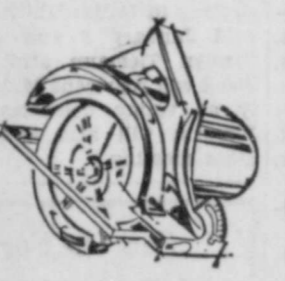

## Savings Bonds Sales In County Short Of Goal

October sales of United States Savings Bonds and Freedom Shares totaled \$1,103 in Mills County, according to a report received from Mr. W. P. Duren, Chairman of the Mills County Savings Bonds Committee. Sales in the county for the ten month period, January through October, totaled \$29,838 and 33 per cent of the 1968 goal has been achieved.

Statewide sales of Savings Bonds reached an all-time high of \$151,715,504 for the first ten months of 1968. During 1967 sales totaled \$139,007,131—a 9.1 per cent increase over the same period for 1967. ## Mills County Oldsters Reminded To Review Doctor Bill Insurance

The oldsters of Mills County covered by the doctor bill insurance part of Medicare since 1966 should spend some of December reviewing whether Medicare owes them some money. This is most important for those who had medical expenses between October 1, 1966 and September 30, 1967, says Glen McNatt, of the Brownwood Social Security Office. Any claim for payment for such expenses during that period must be filed no later than December 31, 1968.

McNatt pointed out that some Medicare beneficiaries who had not paid the doctor or medicare supplier thought they could not file a claim. "These people are in danger of short-changing themselves," McNatt said. "Change in the law before 1968 provides that an unpaid bill, even if unpaid, is subject for collecting from Medicare. He issued a reminder that the annual \$50 deductible met until the last 3 months of a year, that part of the deductible in those last 3 months used for the deductible carried over to the following year as part of the deductible for that year, also.

All social security offices prepared to help people with these last-minute claims. Doctor bill insurance because of expenses during October 1966 through September 1967 on which no claim had been filed.


## Christmas Party Saturday Night For Homemakers

That there shall be one polling place for said election, which shall be at the City Hall, City of Goldthwaite, Mills County, Texas, within said District and none but qualified voters of such District shall be entitled to vote at said election. For the purpose of holding said election the following are hereby appointed as Presiding Judge and Alternate Judge:—  
V. C. Bradford, Presiding Judge,  
Lucille Conro, Alternate Judge.

The Presiding Judge shall appoint not more than five nor less than two (2) Clerks to assist in the holding of the election.  
The City Secretary of the City of Goldthwaite is hereby appointed as the Clerk for absentee voting for said election; and the Office of the said City Secretary is hereby designated as the place at which absentee voting shall be conducted for said election. That for the period absentee voting is permitted by law, the hours designated for absentee voting shall be from 9:00 A. M. to 5:00 P. M. on each day except Saturdays, Sundays, and State holidays, and said City Secretary shall keep his office open during such hours for absentee voting.  
3. The ballot for said election shall be in the usual statutory form and shall contain five lines and each person voting at said election is authorized to insert on each of said lines the name of a person for whom he desires to vote as Supervisor of said District.  
4. The President and Secretary of the District shall issue notice of this election, stating the time and place of holding the election, and the names of the presiding officers appointed for holding said election, and said notice shall be posted at the Mills County Courthouse door and at two other public places within said District for not less than twenty (20) days prior to the date of the said election. A substantial copy of this Resolution shall constitute sufficient notice of election.  
5. The Secretary is directed to provide election supplies for said election, including ballot boxes, polling lists, tally sheets and all other supplies which may be necessary or proper.  
6. Immediately after said election has been held the officers holding the same shall make return of the results thereof to this Board.

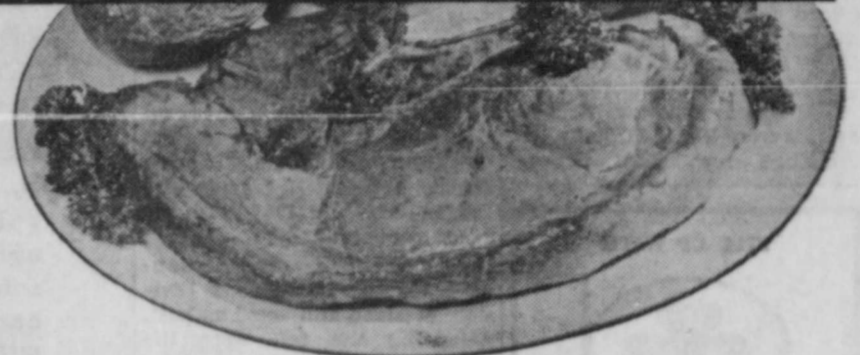

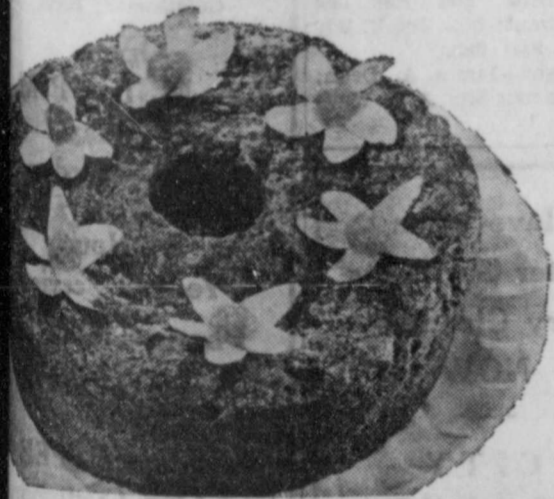

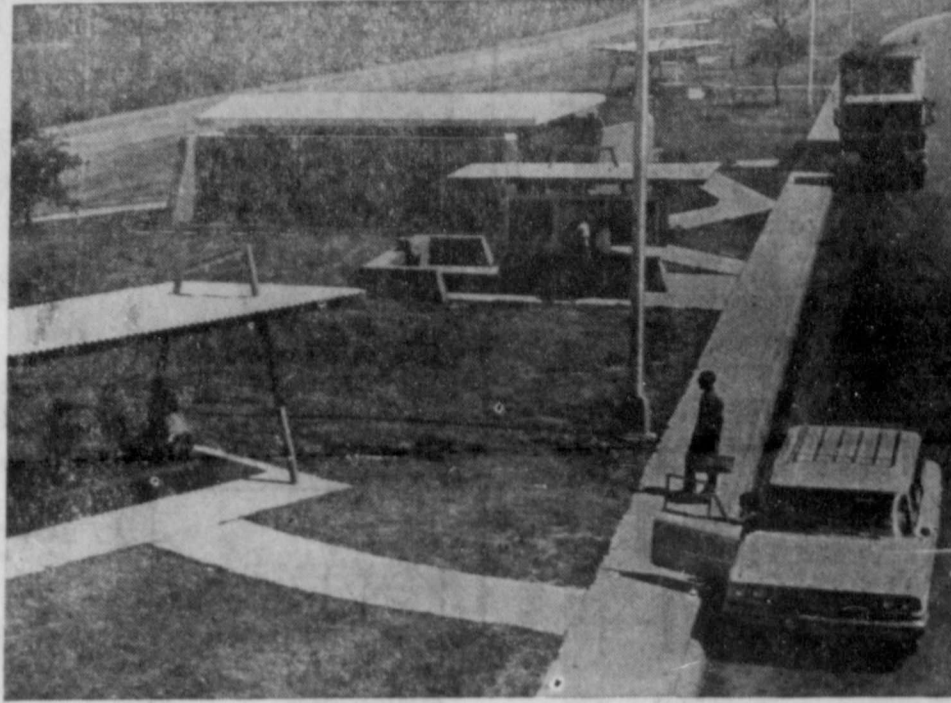
Employees receiving 20 year awards were Elmer D. Cosby, Jr., exchange repairman, Brown-
