

1969 License Plates To Go On Sale February 1

New 1969 license tags for cars, trucks and trailers will go on sale in Mills County at the tax assessor-collector's office starting next Saturday, February 1. With the tax office being closed on Saturday the tags will actually go on sale on Monday morning, February 3.

All car owners are urged to bring their certificates of title and license receipts from the last year when coming in to the tax office to purchase their new tags. This will save time in getting new license issued, according to Tax Assessor-Collector, H. G. Brooks, and Deputy Collector, Billie Helen Jernigan. The deadline for buying the new license plates without penalties is April 1.

The membership meeting was held last Wednesday, January 15, at 7:30 p. m. in the community room of Mills County State Bank in Goldthwaite.

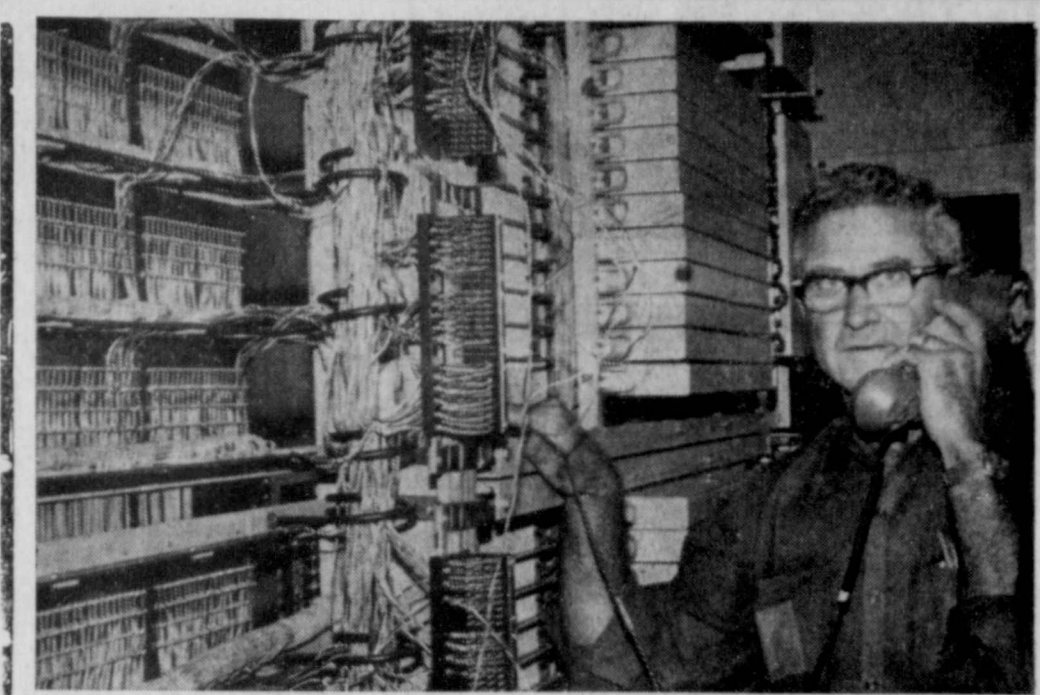

hibition stock for sale. Forty-two head of hogs and lambs sold. The sale included 20 hogs and 22 lambs. Also one fat calf was sold.

The committee expressed satisfaction with the sale results. Arrangements were made in advance for buyers for all hogs and lambs that were to be offered for sale.

Black stated: "Business and professional people responded again in a splendid way to support the sale for the benefit of Mills County club boys and girls." Those who failed to get in on the buying this year will be given another opportunity next year, the committee reported this week in commenting on the sale results. 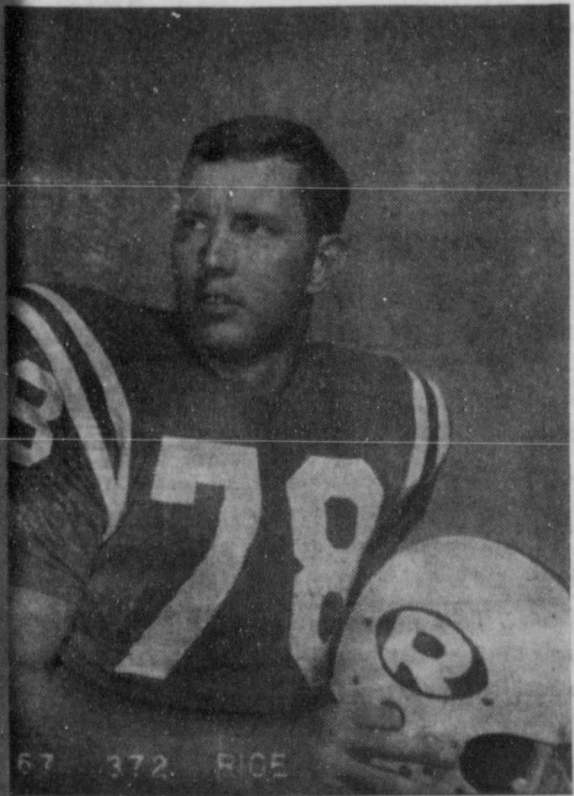
