Dove Season To Open Monday

The annual dove season in the north zone of Texas will open this year this coming Monday, September 1.

Shooting hours for mourning doves in the north zone, in which Mills County is located, will be 12 noon local time to sunset.

Bag limits for mourning doves will be 10 per day and 20 in possession.

Use of rifles is prohibited by both federal and state laws. All shotguns must be permanently plugged to a shell capacity of three, including one in the chamber.

Hunters are reminded that shooting from public roads and hunting from motor vehicles on public or private lands is prohibited by law, according to Benny R. Schriver, Game Management Officer for Mills County.

Prospects for dove hunting in the Goldthwaite area look good this year, according to Schriver who asks that all hunters practice safety first and consideration for their hosts, the landowners.

Cary Owens Pig Foot Ranch Tour Attended By 65 Conservationists

Knee-deep grass at the end of a 90-day grazing system was viewed on the Cary Owens Pig Foot Ranch four miles south of Star by over 65 grass-oriented ranchers and government workers Saturday, August 16th.

The ranch tour was co-sponsored by the Brown-Mills Soil and Water Conservation District and the Texas Section, American Society of Range Management.

Conservationists from as far as Abilene, San Angelo, Big Spring, Brady, Temple and College Station attended to see what is possibly one of the largest areas of high condition rangeland in Central West Texas, E. J. Hughes, area conservationist, said.

At stop three Don Dorsett of the Texas Research Foundation at Renner spoke on speeding up range recovery by seeding and finally the last stop on the ranch was for group comments and observations and American Society of Range Management objectives by Bobby Ragsdale, range specialist from the extension service at College Station.

Owens started his conservation program in the early 1940's by developing a plan with the district that emphasized attention to the grasses.

Livestock at the Owens Pig Foot Ranch are sold when grass gets scarce during the dry periods for assurance of not hurting the grass production in years ahead, Owens told the gathering.

It was interesting to note, says Doug Sellars, District Conservationist at Goldthwaite, that 50 per cent of those attending the tour were ranchers. This is a high percentage, says Sellars, who also pointed out that the other 50 per cent consisted of SCS, Extension Service and research personnel.
