September 1, Texas' Motor Ve- the inspection certificate. hicle Inspection stations started tions will come due one year Public Safety Patrolmen. after the month shown on the inspection certificate.

All cars inspected during September 1969, will be due their next inspection during September 1970. Those inspection certificates during October 1969, will be due for a new inspection during October

The current inspection certificate will be used until December 31 - - but with a difference. Before a certificate is placed on a windshield, the number of the month is placed on the face of the certificate. As September is the ninth month, '9" will be used; in October, the number "10" will be placed on the certificate, and so on through December.

Beginning January 1, 1970, a different inspection certificate will be used, and the numbering system will begin with the numeral "1."

Beginning September 1, 1969, the Inspection Certificate will be placed in the lower left hand pus Christi have come for their corner of the windshield.

Another change in the inspection law is the increase in the inspection fee from \$1.75 to \$2.00. The increase was given to compensate for the additional items included in the present inspection law.
