proximately 19,000 turkeys during 1969, according to estimates and surveys made by Texas Parks and Wildlife Department ame management officers

The kill was down from the 1968 kill of 24,000, but still high compared to the 1967 kill of 10,000 birds.

Pierce Uzzell, wildlife coordinator for the Department, said the successful 1968 and 1969 seasons were the result of a virtual turkey population explosion from approximately 206,300 turkeys in 1967 to ap proximately 575,000 in 1968, Although the population of turkey dropped approximately 15 per cent for the 1969 season, hunters were still able to kill far better than average numbers of the big birds.

Counties with big kills were: Blanco with 408; Callahan, 500; Edwards, 500; Gillespie, Kendall, 720; Kerr, 1,443; Medina, 3,100; Real, 707; Sterling, 405; and Sutton, 520.
