

The definition given "refuse" is broadly interpreted to include all foreign substances and pollutants other than mubottles, spurning the thrownicipal sewage from streets and ewers in a liquid form.

Under this Act there is a sort of a bounty involved. Individuals who find industry refuse being discharged into navigable waters without a Corps of Engineers permit, may inform proper Federal officials whose duty it is to prosecute offenders.
