## Sgt. Richard Farley Heath, 22 Buried Tuesday With Military Rites

A full military funeral honors were conducted for Sgt. Richard Farley Heath, 22, Tuesday, April 22, at 2:00 p. m. in the First Baptist Church of Goldthwaite. Interment was in the Goldthwaite Memorial Cemetery. Minister Ross Blasingame

and Rev. Dale Gore conducted the services. Eulogy was read by Ronald Heath, brother of the victim. Wilkins Funeral Home was in charge of arrangements.

Sgt. Heath passed away Monday, April 13, 1970 at 2:00 p. m. at the 249th General Hospital, a U. S. hospital, in Camp Drake, Japan, from wounds he received during combat duty near the Cambodian border in Vietnam. Born November 20, 1947 in Brownwood, Texas, he was the son of Martin L. Heath and Dona Lillian Young Heath. He was a member of the First Baptist Church.

He attended Goldthwaite Public Schools and was a graduate of Goldthwaite High School. Soon after graduation, he joined the Army and completed his basic training at Fort Polk, Louisiana, and then went to helicopter school at Fort Rucker, Alabama to become a helicopter crew chief. Following his helicopter schooling, he went to Vietnam for a tour of duty plus a six months extension, and home for thirty days. He was then stationed at Fort Carson, Colorado, for four months.

After a short discharge period, he re-enlisted for another Vietnam tour of duty. This tour also had a six months extension.

Sgt. Heath, who served in Vietnam two months less than three years, was wounded April 3, 1970. He was then moved to the 249th General Hospital at Camp Drake in Japan on April 5, 1970.

Honorary pallbearers were Wayne Ables, Lemon Ables, Jimmy Carter, Jerry Dellis, Ronnie Head, and Franklin Rind. Master pallbearer was Sgt. Jerry Mathis and escort was Harry Johnson.

His sister, Mrs. Jeane Heath Shaw, preceded him in death, March 6, 1962.

Survivors include his parents, Mr. and Mrs. M. L. Heath of Goldthwaite; one brother, Ronald Heath of Goldthwaite; one sister, Mrs. Jeanette Reid of Brownwood; and his great-grandmother, Mrs. W. A. Heath of Goldthwaite.

## Girls District Track Meet Held; G'waite Has Regional Qualifiers

The Goldthwaite Girls Track Team traveled to Stephenville last Tuesday, April 14, to take part in the district meet. The girls placed 4th in the meet with 60 points and qualified all three relay teams for the regional meet. Along with the re-

lays, Liz Sparkman qualified in the 60 and 100 yd. dashes and Marilyn Roberts qualified in the 440 yard dash.

The regional meet will be held in Comanche Friday, May 1. Those placing 1-3 in regional will go on to the State meet to be held in Abilene the 15th and 16th of May.

All of the Goldthwaite girls really showed a great team effort at the district meet. There were also some very fine individual performances, the most exciting of these came in the prelims when Liz Sparkman tied the State record in the 60 yd. dash with a 7.1 timing. Liz also won both the 60 and 100 yd. dashes in the final and turned in the fastest times of the day in those events.

Marilyn Roberts was also outstanding in the 440 yd. dash. She turned in the 2nd best time of the day and placed 1st in the "B" division.

The sprint relay composed of Patti Harris, Amy Page, Elizabeth Arnold and Liz Sparkman, placed 3rd in that event with a time of 54.3. They will be working hard this week and next to better this time.

Elizabeth Arnold, Frances Long, Patti Harris and Marilyn Roberts placed 3rd in the 880 yard relay with a time of 201.3.

The mile relay with Lonita Poer, Chris Berry, Elaine Harper and Marilyn Roberts placed 3rd with a 4:54 timing.

"We are real proud of all the girls on the track team and are especially glad to get a girls program started in Goldthwaite. Girls track will become a UIL event beginning with the 70-71 school year," Coach Randy Baker announced this week.

## Time Schedule Change To Begin Sunday Morning

This coming Sunday morning is the time.

It may cause some confusion when people get up to go to church — as usual — unless they will remember to move their clocks ahead for one hour for the daylight savings time schedule.

The new schedule will go into effect at 2 a. m. Sunday, April 26.

So, people in this area will have a choice of moving the clock up Saturday night before they go to bed, or get up at 2 a. m. and change their clock, or they can get to church or Sunday School an hour late.

The time change, however, can be a blessing. Everyone will have an additional hour of daylight after getting off work in the afternoon. This will mean more time to go fishing, play, moonlighting on another job to help make ends meet in the family budget, loafing, or there is always YARD WORK.

All summer Texans will have an extra hour of daylight because their clock is set ahead. If you get off work at 5 p. m., for example, your clock will say 5, but the sun or daylight will be 4.

It will all come out even though next October 25, when Texas will go back to standard time at 2 a. m. by moving clocks back one hour to 1 a. m.
