## \$255,443 Paid County Producers For '69 Wool & Mohair Incentives

Mills County wool and mohair producers earned \$255,443 under the 1969 wool incentive program. This compares with \$507,000 earned under the 1968 incentive program, according to a statement by Bob Jarvis, county manager of the Mills County ASCS.

The payments were broken down as follows:

WOOL	\$208,618
MOHAIR	46,825

Payments went to 561 wool producers and 311 mohair producers.

On a national basis, Government incentive payments on wool and mohair production will total about \$9.6 million for the 1968 marketing year. The lower payments for 1969 result from reduced margins of these two commodities and from substantially lower market returns for mohair.

The National Wool Act of 1954, which also covers mohair, provides incentive payments to encourage them to produce more wool and to improve the quality and marketability of it. The 1969 payment rate for wool is based on the difference between the incentive price of \$1.06 and the 1969 National average price for wool of 41.8 cents received by growers. Each grower's wool payment is figured by multiplying his dollar return from the sale of his wool, less marketing charges, by the payment rate of 85.1 per cent which is the difference between the 69 cent incentive price and the average of 90.58 cents grower earned from the sale of his wool in 1969, he also received an additional \$95.10 in

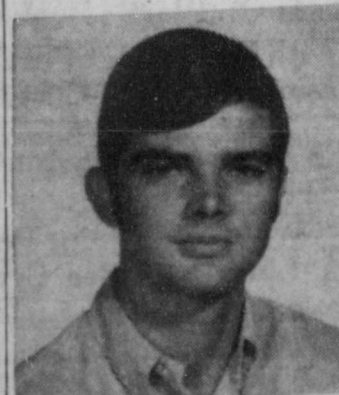

The total for four months this year is just slightly less than the 8.79 inches measured during the corresponding period in 1969.

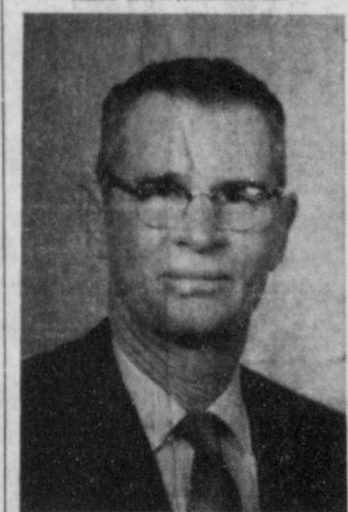
## Bank Deposits Show Big Gain During Past Year

Deposits in Mills County State Bank made another big gain during the past year according to official statement of condition from the bank call as of April 30.

Deposits on April 30, 1970 were \$10,484,936.58 while on March 31, 1969, they were \$9,979,276.81.

Loans and discounts went up from \$4,801,945.90 on March 31, 1969 to \$5,879,774.50 on April 30, 1970.

Total resources increased from \$10,894,904.23 on March 31, 1969 to \$12,085,189.79 on April 30, 1970. This reflects an increase of over one \$million for the 11 months period.

## Slight Decrease In Mills County School Census

## Contract Let For Highway Job In Mills County

AUSTIN (Spl.) — A contract for highway construction in the Brownwood district has been awarded by the Texas Highway Commission.

The work will be under the supervision of District Engineer E. M. Pritchard, and will be in Mills and Lampasas Counties.

H. L. Freeland, Inc. and George M. Amthor of San Antonio were awarded a contract for hot mix cold laid asphaltic concrete pavement level-up and seal shoulders on 20.1 miles of US Highway 183. Low bid was \$178,332.13.

The project extends from State Highway 16 in Goldthwaite southward to US 190 south of Lometa. Glenn Trotter of Comanche and Paul Henderson of Goldthwaite are the Highway Department engineers in charge of the project which will take an estimated 100 working days.

## Council Hears Progress Report On Sewer System Improvements

The City Council meeting in regular session last Monday night in the City Hall heard a progress report on sewer system improvements and expansion that has been underway.

City Manager W. C. Barnett told the Council how much work has been done since the project got underway last October and the amount of money spent.

Some 5,100 feet of six inch tile pipe line has been installed along with some four inch pressure line and two lift stations with the project moving along ahead of schedule.

Most of this work has been done by the regular city crews

from all other departments. The work schedule will fluctuate some in the coming months with other activities coming into the picture that will require more time and attention.

However, work on the sewer system will continue, Barnett stated, as funds are available, and the work schedule allows.

Barnett also presented monthly operating reports of receipts and disbursements for the various departments.

The Council approved purchase of some insurance to cover members of the Volunteer Fire Department.

A petition was read from G. C. Head and Partners, requesting a franchise to furnish radio frequency cable TV service for the city. The matter was taken under advisement.

Illegal parking in many places, especially around corners at intersections in the business district, was discussed and will receive further attention with the city, the sheriff's department and the State Highway Patrolman cooperating to try and correct the problem.

The second study in which Representative Ward will participate, that on programs in Texas designed to assist, provide services for, and rehabilitate all segments of the handicapped in Texas, is funded jointly by the federal government and the Texas Legislative Council. This committee will also make its report, including recommendations and proposed legislation, to the 62nd Legislature.
