W. C. Barnett spoke words of praise and appreciation to Mr. Huffman, for his many years of loyal and faithful service to the city.

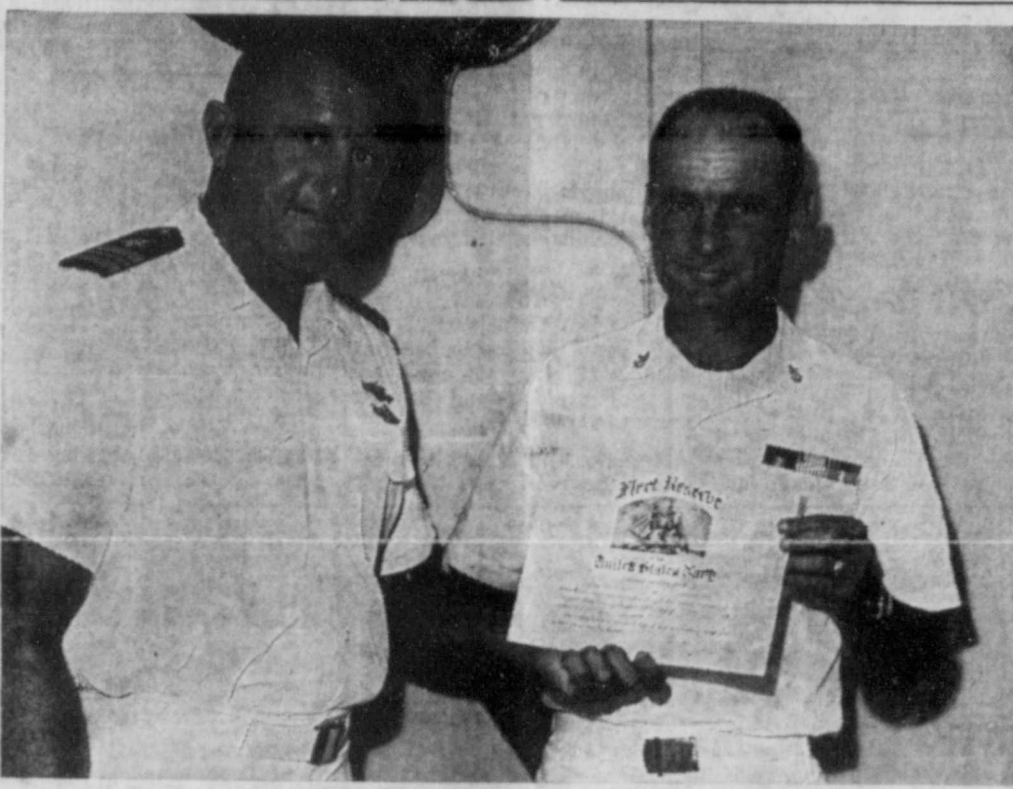
A series of colored slides showing some of the work projects where Mr. Huffman was involved in one way or another were shown by G. R. Mullings.

## City Council Hears Many Reports At Routine Session Monday Night

The City Council meeting in regular session Monday night at the City Hall heard a number of reports on activities as the city ended its official year on June 30.

City manager W. C. Barnett presented monthly operating reports of receipts and disbursements for the various departments and the quarterly treasurer's report.

He also reported that the additional new Christmas decorations have been received and are now in storage here. Work is to get started soon on building poles and brackets to take care of the additions.

Report was made on paving streets and seal coating others with work now in progress in several locations. Also plans for additional street work and inquiries from property owners for paving on more streets.

Barnett reported that the City hosted a dinner meeting for the Pecan Valley Water Works Association in June. The meeting was held at Horton's Cafe with the association presenting the program.

The dump ground came in for another report and discussion and it was decided that the entire council will make plans to meet with the County Commissioners Court to talk to that body about the situation.

The City and County Governments are being faced with providing land fill dump ground facilities to meet requirements of the Texas State Department of Health.

On request from O. O. Smith the council accepted a plat of a new addition for proposed housing in the northwest section of the city. The new addition is located just south of the Procter Drive Addition. By accepting the plat the city automatically created a new street which is included in this plat.

Dale Allen reported on the meeting at the L. C. R. A. in Austin attended by Barnett, Duren and Allen.

The council was informed by Barnett that plans are underway for the regular city audit which will cover operations for the past two years.

Hazards created by illegal parking in a number of places over the city were discussed and will be given further consideration.

The council discussed updating the city ordinances and the matter was tabled for further study.

Further discussion took place regarding the request from G. C. Head and Associates for a Cable-Vision franchise from the city. A council committee is looking into the possibilities of the City going into the Cable Vision business and the Head request was again tabled until a later meeting.

## 2nd Patrolman Is Assigned To Mills County

The second highway patrolman has been assigned to Mills County by the Texas Department of Public Safety, it was announced the past week by Mills County Sheriff H. G. Brooks.

## Bank Deposits Show More Gain During Past Year

Deposits in Mills County State Bank show another gain during the past year, according to condensed statement of condition appearing in this issue of the paper.

The statement as of June 30, reflects a smaller amount of growth than was recorded the year before when the bank showed a record one year growth in the history of the institution.

Local deposits did show a nice increase while a number of banks over the territory are showing a decrease in deposits.

Deposits as of June 30, 1970 were \$11,004,419.32 while on June 30, 1969 they were \$10,702,149.46.

Loans went up from \$5,108,815.27 on June 30, 1969 to \$5,788,593.27 on June 30, 1970.

Total resources of the bank went up from \$11,643,247.03 on June 30, 1969 to \$12,405,789.32 on June 30, 1970.

## Texas Turkey Owners To Vote On Research And Promotion Program

Texas turkey owners will vote this month on a proposal to impose a self-tax to pay for programs of research and promotion, according to the Texas Turkey Federation office.

Already the state's peanut and grain sorghum producers have passed such a check-off program authorized by the 61st Session of the Texas Legislature. The Texas Commodity Referendum Act of "Agricultural Check-off Act" was passed to allow producers to assess themselves for funds to be used for promotion and research.

The tax, in the amount of two cents per live hundredweight plus an additional one cent per head on mature birds, will be administered by a 15-man board of producers elected at the time of the referendum.

Ballots were mailed from the Turkey Federation office on July 7 and must be returned by July 27. Only producers (owners) will be allowed to vote in the check-off referendum. Should the proposal pass, funds will be collected at the processing plants. The TTF requested and received authority to conduct the poll in a May 21 hearing before Texas Agriculture Commissioner John C. White.

"We feel a check-off is the fairest method of raising the money needed to carry out programs that will benefit the industry. If passed, the check-off would generate approximately \$30,000 per year," Texas Turkey Federation Executive Vice President Bill Powers testified at the May 21 hearing.

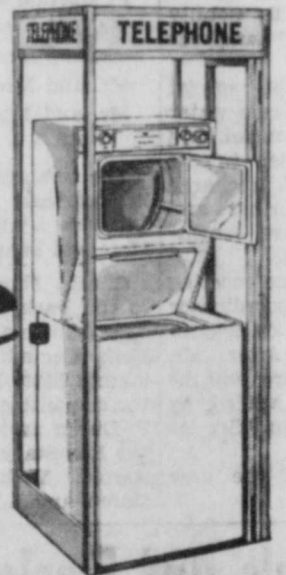

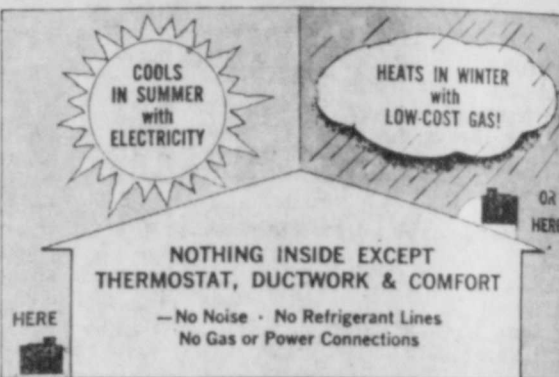

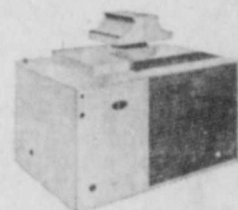
