Mike Conratt Was A "Happy Feller" After Baylor-Army 10-7 Victory

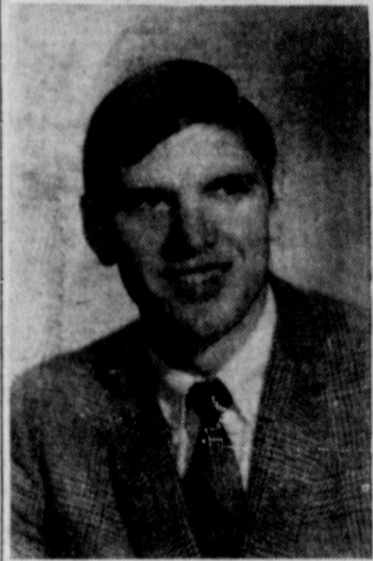

WACO—Before the September 19 Baylor-Army contest at West Point, N. Y., a suburban New York newspaper, for reasons known only to its sports editor, listed University of Texas place-kicker Happy Feller as the Baylor booting specialist.

And, when the final gun had sounded and the Cadets had fallen by a 10-7 margin, there was a "happy feller" all right, but it was Fightin' Bear sophomore Mike Conratt of Goldthwaite and not the UT performer.

It was Conratt who was "placed in shock" when called upon by Baylor Head Coach Bill Beall to boot the extra point following the Baylor touchdown. He came through to give the Fightin' Bears a 7-0 lead. Then, only minutes later following one of a hundred big Baylor defensive plays, Conratt also got the call on a 36-yard field goal... and there was never any question about it as the ball sailed through the uprights for the winning points.

Listed on the Baylor roster as the No. 2 kicker, Mike didn't have any idea he would be called upon. However, after Barry Brunson's field goal effort early in the game fell short and his second-half kickoff was also short, Coach Beall said he decided that Conratt would get the nod. And, he came through in championship fashion.

The 20-year-old sophomore came to Baylor with top credentials. At Goldthwaite he was a member of the Eagle basketball team that went undefeated in district play in 1968 to give the school its first title in history. He was an all-district football and basketball performer, made all-state football and competed in the state track meet. Off the field he was elected class president twice, FFA president two years and a member of the student council two years.

On his publicity questionnaire at Baylor, Conratt (in August) stated that his biggest sports thrill had been the district basketball championship. Now the charged-up, 6-3, 193-pounder has his mind on more game-winning extra points and field goals.

He says the Fightin' Baylor Bears are coming back... and he has a battle plan toward being an important cog in the venture.

Mike is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Conratt of Goldthwaite.
