FIRST MILLS COUNTY COURTHOUSE-This is a picture of the first Mills County Courthouse. Construction on the building started in 1889 and the corner stone carried a date line, June 25, 1890. The building was destroyed by fire on May 5, 1912 and was then replaced with the present courthouse building.

This scene taken from the Northwest corner of the square looking Southeast doesn't show the jail building which is behind the courthouse. At the left across the street on the corner is the Eagle building as it looked at that time. The fenced courthouse at that time covered smaller area than the present grounds. This left more parking area for the horse and buggy traffic of the day.


