Mesdames Roy Wilkins, R. Glynn Raley, Robert McCoy, Robert Butler and Jack Elms attended the Texas 1970 Symposium, "Expanding Horizons," at the Royal Coach Inn, in Houston, September 28-30, 1970.

Dr. Charles H. Walkinshaw, with degrees in Botany, Plant Pathology, Biochemistry and Mammalian Pathology from the Universities of Florida and Wisconsin, has served as Plant Pathologist, U. S. Forest Service, Gulfport, Mississippi. Detailed now to the office of Principal Plant Pathologist Biomedical Research at N. A. S. A. in Houston, was given official approval to lecture at this symposium on "Response of Germ-Free Plants to Lunar Material."

Mrs. Orval C. Sutter, who applies business analysis to the art of flower arranging, is past president of the Missouri Federation of Garden Clubs. Mrs. Sutter is listed in Who's Who of American Women, and is the author of "New Approach To Design Principles," and has lectured in twenty-three states.

She lectured on the "New Approach to Design Principles" at the Houston Symposium. Her lecture brought out many new principles of value in flower arranging, in keeping with the times, yet held fast to the fundamental rules and laws of flower arranging.

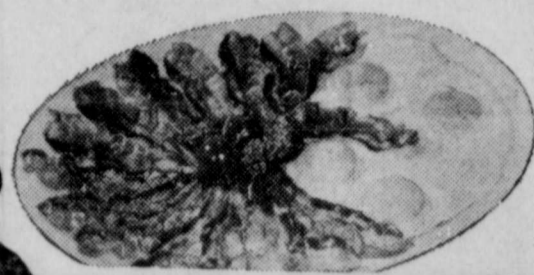

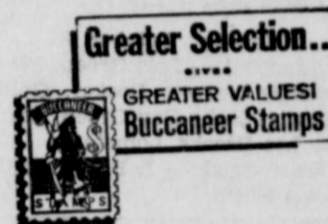
