





Mills Agriculture Agent Advises Spraying Now For Peach Leaf Curl

ing preparations to prevent Peach Leaf Curl next spring, George Reese, County Agricultural Agent, notes.

"Each spring, homeowners and commercial farmers involved in growing peaches become alarmed at the appearance of malformed leaves." Reese said. "The diseased leaves appear curled and thickened and are light green to dark red in color.' Leaf Curl is caused by a fun-

gus which damages the leaf to such an extent that the normal growth pattern is altered. "This disease isn't a respecter

of any variety, attacking all parents and enter school in varieties equally," he said. "When the leaves appear, there is nothing that the grower can by hand."

This doesn't mean that the Zephyr; Mr. and Mrs. Larry disease can't be controlled chemically. Fixed coppers such Jimmy Smith and Paula Green. as Kocide 101, COCS or TC90 can be used in the fall as the ices now stationed at Ft. Ord, leaves begin to fall with excellent success, Reese said.

> "Fixed coppers are compounds in which the copper breaks down slowly," the plant pathologist said. "Copper compounds other than Fixed coppers should not be used because the copper breaks down too quickly and causes severe burning of the plants."




