Choice Native Grasses Come Back After Aerial Spraying Of Shinoak

Brush control by aerial spraying of shinoak along with a growing season's rest has resulted in amazing recovery of choice native grasses on the J. E. Dryman Farm located 13 miles northeast of Goldthwaite. Grasses, such as Indiangrass, big and little Bluestem, and Sideoats grama gained in vigor and seeded out where last year these plants made very little growth in the dense growth of brush.

Small grass seedlings are coming into areas where there has been no grass for many years due to competition from brush. The recovery in the choice grasses has been attributed to reduced moisture and shading competition along with defoliation, according to Charles Studer, Soil Conservation Service, District Conservationist at Goldthwaite.

Many acres in the Mills portion of the Brown-Mills Soil and Water Conservation District are suppressed by brush to the point that grasses cannot survive. Natural re-vegetation on these areas will not be realized unless brush competition is reduced, Studer points out.

Aerial spraying on low growing shinoak has proven to be a fairly effective method of reducing brush competition. Two sprayings are needed in most cases to be effective. In some cases, a third spraying may be needed.

Dryman has been pleased with the results of his brush control and defoliation program. He states, "It was a pleasant surprise to see these choice grasses reappear." He had felt that these plants no longer existed on his place in sufficient quantity to make a good stand.

Caution should be practiced in the application of chemicals and to avoid unnecessary danger of pollution. Some chemicals should not be used around water areas, homes, or recreational areas. All chemicals are labeled for permissive use and should be used accordingly, Studer reminds.
