Some Details For 1971 Feed Grain **Program Announced By Ag Secretary**

1970, announced major provisions of the 1971 feed grain program. "At this time, however," the Secretary explained, "There are many unknowns in the feed grain situation.

"Consequently, we are not announcing the final set-aside percentage until we have additional information on factors affecting the 1971 crops.

"For the purpose of the January Farmers' Planting Intentions Report, the Department will tentatively plan for a 20 per cent set-aside for feed grain. The decision on the actual percentage will be made prior to the program signup period, March 1 through April 9, 1971."

The Goldthwaite "B" boys were defeated by the Lometa "B" team 28-25.






