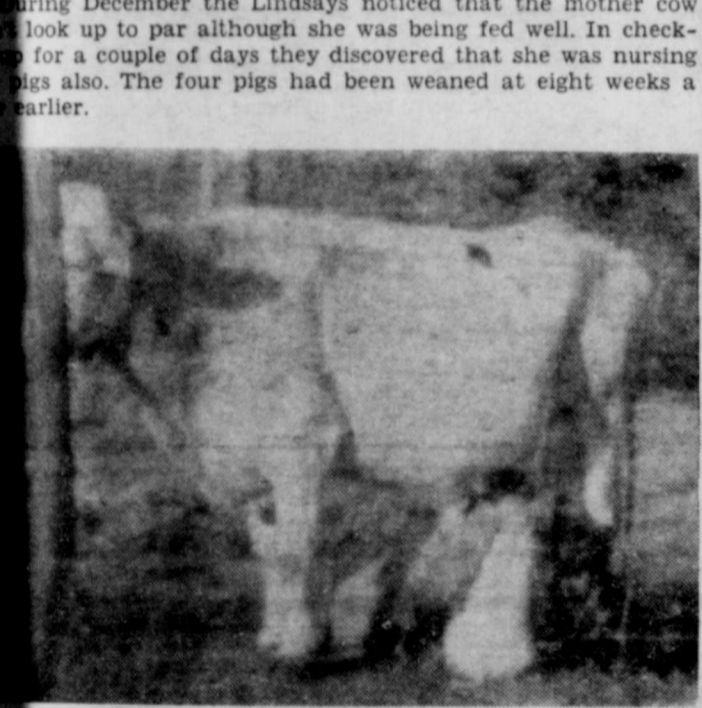

Mr. and Mrs. M. L. Lindsay bought the cow from Arnold Head Dairy at Center City last October. Mills Co. To Launch County-Wide Rubella Immunization Campaign

Mills County is one of the counties in Texas to launch a county-wide rubella immunization campaign aimed at eradicating the disease in Texas and the entire nation. The March of Dimes, The Texas State Health Department, and the City and County Health officers urge parents of children ages one through ten to take advantage of the availability of this vaccine.

Parents are reminded that this vaccine is for rubella, a commonly called German or 3-day measles, and should not be confused with the vaccine that has been offered in the past for measles for regular red or 10-day measles which does not protect against rubella.

Since many childhood diseases look and act like rubella, it is impossible to know for sure that a child has had the disease without a special blood test. So it is recommended that all children ages one through ten years be given the vaccine, even though it is believed that a child has already had the disease. It is safe for a child who has had the disease to receive the vaccine.

Change Of Location Announced For New Home For Masonic Lodge

A change of location has been announced as the construction site for the new home being planned for the Goldthwaite Masonic Lodge.

Keilis Landrum, Worshipful Master of the Lodge, stated this week that the new lodge building will be located on a one acre tract of land located just south of the American Legion Hall, on highway 183 south of Mills County Park.

The Lodge had formerly announced plans to erect a building on some lots that were purchased between East Third and Fourth Streets at the highway 84 city route.

The new location will provide a more suitable site for the new lodge home and plans are proceeding for the new building, according to Landrum.

The acre of ground was donated to the Masons by Mr. and Mrs. W. P. Woody. It was donated as a Memorial to the memory of their fathers, the late Sam H. Woody and Sam P. Rahl.

Landrum announced this week that there will be no material changes in the building plans, which are being finalized at this time by Floyd Manuel.

After the plans have been completed the building committee is expected to secure some additional cost figures so that construction plans may be formalized.

It was also reported that financial pledges for the new building total about \$24,000.00 at this time. Total cost is estimated to be between \$30 and \$32 thousand. This leaves the finance committee about \$8,000 short of their goal.
