## Sheep And Goat Raisers Approve Continued Program Of Promotion

The adoption of resolutions regarding the continuation of the per pound deduction for wool and mohair for advertising and promotional purposes 7½ cents per hundred pounds on lamb was one of the points of interest February as the second tri-annual meeting of the Texas Sheep and Raisers' Association closed here.

The Meat Inspection Act of 1906 caused what was probably the most controversial discussion during the meeting.

A resolution the directors members of the TS&GRA for the Secretary of Agriculture to rescind sections of new meat labelling regulations which are felt to be detrimental to the marketing of slaughtered goats. These regulations require that goat meat, which has for the past 60 years been called "Boneless Mutton" in Texas, be labelled goat meat in all products in which it is used.

A TS&GRA director said consumers have developed a resistance to the term "goat" and as a result, large quantities of goat meat, which is ordinarily used in the manufacture of frankfurters, sausage and other meat products, is stockpiling in packing houses across the state. It was also suggested that consideration be given to labelling young goat meat "cabrito," a Spanish name for young goat.

Lamb Committee chairman, John Cargile of San Angelo, said a delegation from the association will go to Washington this week to confer with a representative of the Agriculture Department's Consumer and Marketing Service, Dolph Briscoe, Uvalde banker and TS&GRA director, conferred with TS&GRA President Louis L. Farr III following the meeting in regard to choosing a committee for the trip.

Other resolutions passed during the two-day meet include support of the usage of 2-4-5-T, a plant control chemical used in range and brush management, and support of the work of the recently established Lamb Promotion Coordinating Committee, set up to develop more orderly marketing of lamb in the U. S. by Australian and New Zealand meat producers.

Also passed were resolutions reaffirming TS&GRA support of proposed legislation limiting textile imports to be introduced in the 92nd Congress and one commending Elroy Pohle and the staff of the Wool and Mohair Standardization Laboratory of the USDA at Denver, Colorado, for work done in establishing grease mohair grade standards which have been published in the Federal Register. Also passed was a resolution stating that prompt attention should be given to the formation of the Schleicher County water district.

Another resolution urged prompt attention to the inadequacies of the Captive Water Law. A member of the Water Committee told those attending the general session that it is imperative legislation be forthcoming to protect underground water resources from early depletion because of indiscriminate and unfair withdrawal.

J. Alisdair Innes, general manager of Midwest Wool Marketing Cooperative of Kansas City, Mo., and featured speaker at the Tuesday morning session, urged TS&GRA members to do everything possible to promote the industry and to strive for better production standards.

The group was told that the Department of Agriculture has tentatively set the date for the wool and mohair referendums for June 8-19 and April 19-30, respectively. The referendums, if passed, will continue the work of the American Sheep Producers Council and Mohair Council of America.

TS&GRA members and directors hosted members of the 62nd Legislature to a reception and dinner featuring French cut lamb chops Monday evening. Governor and Mrs. Smith and Speaker of the House Gus Mutscher were among the special guests. The annual convention of the TS&GRA has been set for July 19-21 in Del Rio.

The seniors will also audition for band and music scholarships.

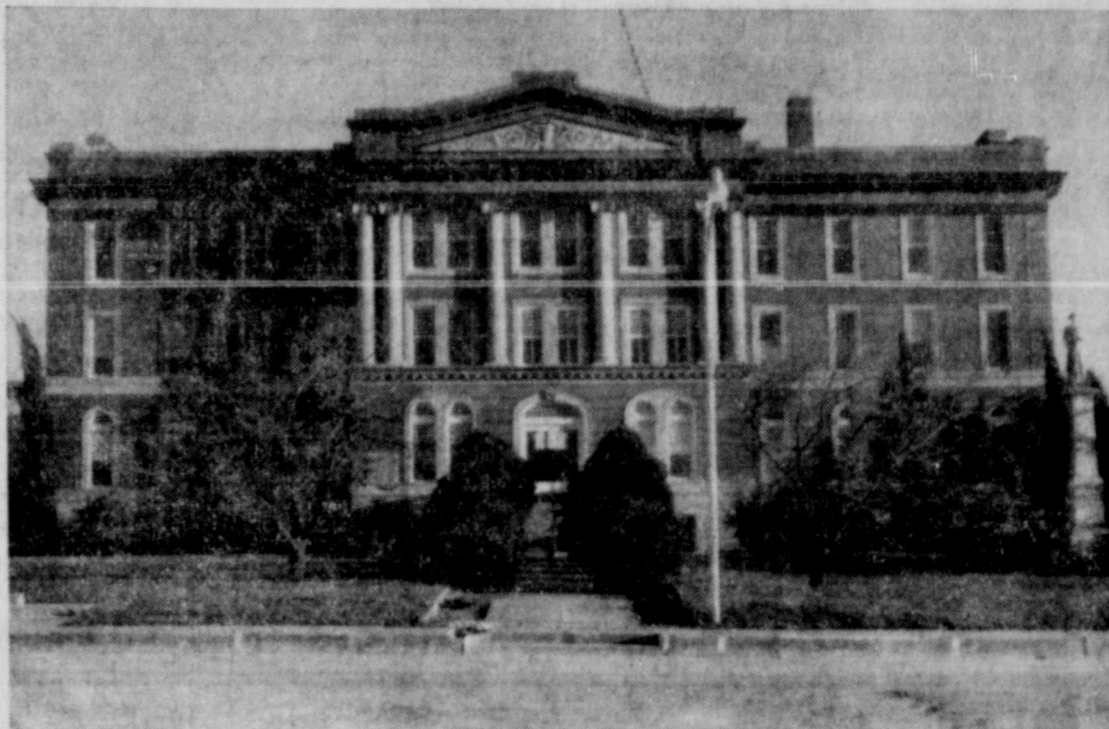
Mrs. Arnold Roberts and Ephraim Garcia will accompany the students to Denton.

As part of a long range improvement and maintenance program, planned by the Commissioners' Court for the structure, 20 new aluminum frame windows were installed recently, according to announcement by County Judge Cecil Egger.

## VA Announces Mills Co. 1970 Expenditures

The Veterans Administration today announced that expenditures for Texas for fiscal 1970 totaled \$522,997,791 of which \$124,399 was for Mills County.

Jack Coker, Director of the VA Regional Office in Waco, said that the bulk of the money was \$311,680,001 in disability compensation and pension payments for Texas veterans — \$93,504 for Mills County veterans.

Other VA expenditures in Mills County for fiscal 1970, Coker said, were for GI Bill and other VA education programs, \$17,900, and insurance and indemnities, \$12,995.

In announcing these figures, Coker invited Mills County veterans to contact the nearest VA office for information on any program, including the GI Bill.

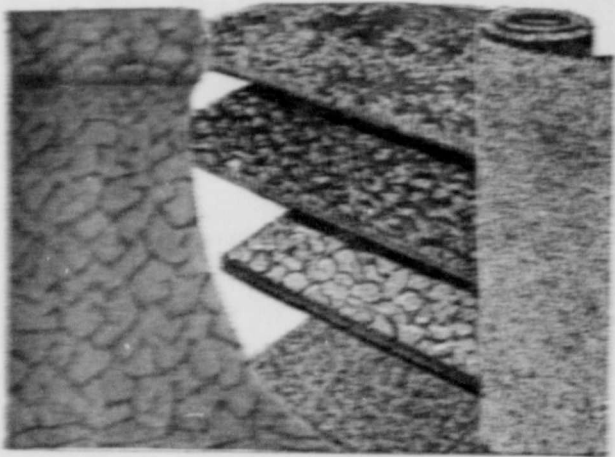

### PUBLIC NOTICE

Proposed CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT  
NUMBER TWO ON THE BALLOT (HJR 21)  
Special Election May 18, 1971

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: Section 1. That Article XVII, Section 1 of the Texas Constitution, be amended to read as follows:

"Section 1. The Legislature by a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each House to be entered by yeas and nays on the journals, may propose amendments to the Constitution, to be voted upon by the qualified electors for members of the Legislature, which proposed amendments shall be duly published once a week for four weeks, commencing at least three months before an election, the time of which shall be specified by the Legislature, in one weekly newspaper of such county, in which such a newspaper may be published; and it shall be the duty of the several returning officers of said election, to open a poll for, and make returns to the Secretary of State

of the number of legal votes cast at said election for and against said amendments; and if more than one be proposed, then the number of votes cast for and against each of them; and if it shall appear from said returns, that a majority of the votes cast, have been cast in favor of any amendment, the said amendment so receiving a majority of the votes cast, shall become a part of this Constitution, and proclamation shall be made by the Governor thereof."

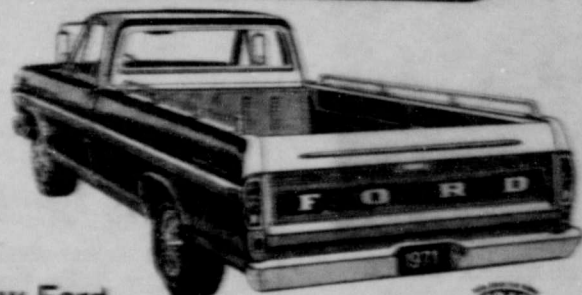
Sec. 2. The foregoing constitutional amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this state at an election to be held on May 18, 1971, at which election the ballots shall be printed to provide for voting for or against the proposition: "The constitutional amendment providing that the Legislature may propose an amendment of the Constitution at any session of the Legislature."

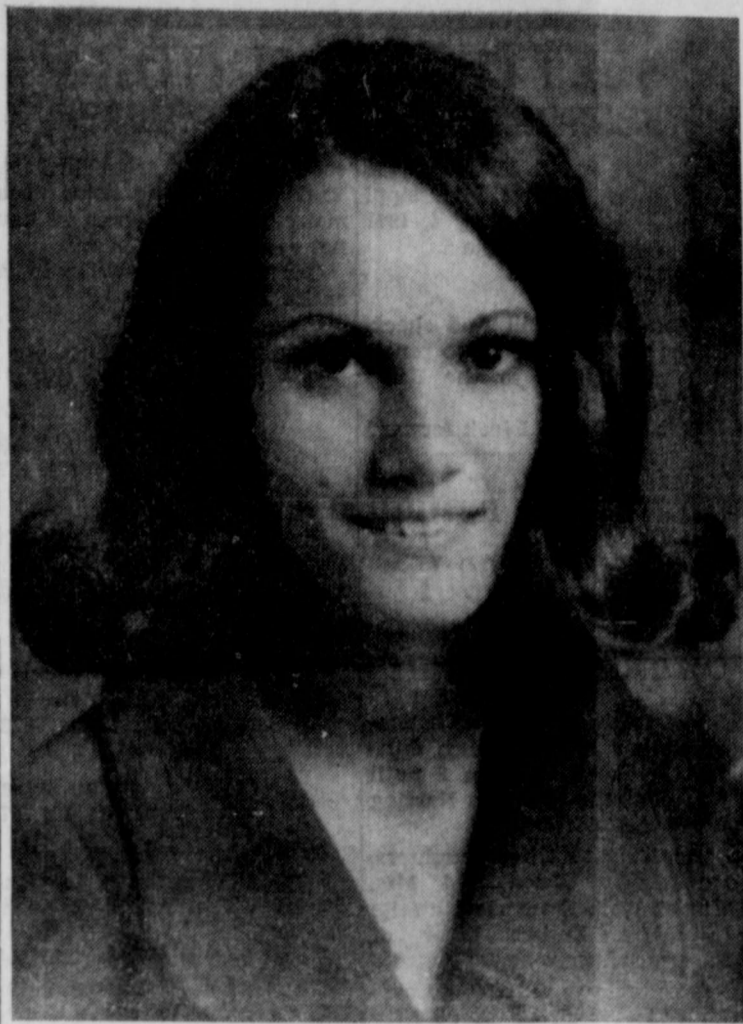
Glenn Hamilton

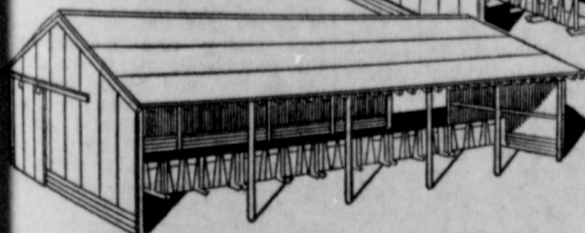

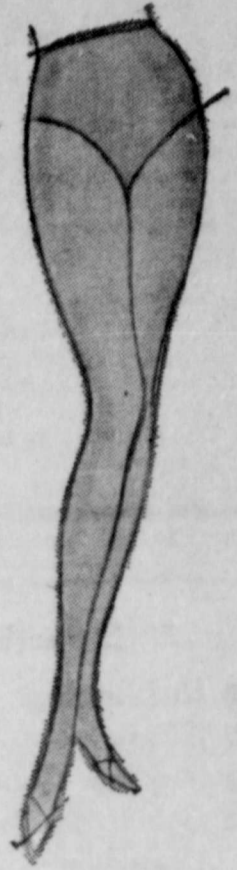

to discuss and act on proposed amendments to the TSTA constitution, new policies, recommendations of standing committees, and other business.

The official delegates are elected from the 433 TSTA local associations throughout the state and certified by districts on the basis of one delegate per 100 members or fraction of 100. Every local association in the

state is entitled to at least one official delegate.

### PUBLIC NOTICE Proposed CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NUMBER FOUR ON THE BALLOT (SJR 17) Special Election May 18, 1971

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

Section 1. That Article III of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended by adding thereto a new Section 49-d-1 to read as follows:

"Section 49-d-1. (a) The Texas Water Development Board shall upon direction of the Texas Water Quality Board, or any successor agency designated by the Legislature, issue additional Texas Water Development Bonds up to an additional aggregate principal amount of One Hundred Million Dollars (\$100,000,000) to provide grants, loans, or any combination of grants and loans for water quality enhancement purposes as established by the Legislature. The Texas Water Quality Board or any successor agency designated by the Legislature may make such grants and loans to political subdivisions or bodies politic and corporate of the State of Texas, including municipal corporations, river authorities, conservation and reclamation districts, and districts created or organized or authorized to be created or organized under Article XVI, Section 52, or Article III, Section 52 of this Constitu-

tion, State agencies, and interstate agencies and compact commissions to which the State of Texas is a party, and upon such terms and conditions as the Legislature may authorize by general law. The bonds shall be issued for such terms, in such denominations, form and installments, and upon such conditions as the Legislature may authorize.

"(b) The proceeds from the sale of such bonds shall be deposited in the Texas Water Development Fund to be invested and administered as prescribed by law.

"(c) The bonds authorized in this Section 49-d-1 and all bonds authorized by Sections 49-c and 49-d of Article III shall bear interest at not more than 6% per annum and mature as the Texas Water Development Board shall prescribe, subject to the limitations as may be imposed by the Legislature.

"(d) The Texas Water Development Fund shall be used for the purposes heretofore permitted by, and subject to the limitations in Sections 49-c, 49-d and 49-d-1; provided, however, that the financial assistance may be made pursuant to the provisions of Section 49-c, 49-d and 49-d-1 subject only to the availability

of funds and without regard to the provisions in Section 49-c that such financial assistance shall terminate after December 31, 1982.

"(e) Texas Water Development Bonds are secured by the general credit of the State and shall after approval by the Attorney General, registration by the Comptroller of Public Accounts of the State of Texas, and delivery to the purchasers, be incontestable and shall constitute general obligations of the State of Texas under the Constitution of Texas.

"(f) Should the Legislature enact enabling laws in anticipation of the adoption of this amendment, such Acts shall not be void by reason of their anticipatory character."

Sec. 2. The foregoing constitutional amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this State at an election to be held on Tuesday, May 18, 1971, at which election all ballots shall be printed to provide for voting for or against the proposition: "The constitutional amendment to authorize the issuance of One Hundred Million Dollars (\$100,000,000) bonds to provide financial assistance to cities and other public agencies for water quality enhancement purposes, providing for the improvement and continuance of the water resources program, and establishing an interest ceiling on Water Development Bonds at 6% per annum."

### PUBLIC NOTICE Proposed CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NUMBER THREE ON THE BALLOT (SJR 5) Special Election May 18, 1971

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

Section 1. That Article III, Section 51-a, of the Texas Constitution, be amended to read as follows:

"Section 51-a. The Legislature shall have the power, by General Laws, to provide, subject to limitations herein contained, and such other limitations, restrictions and regulations as may be by the Legislature be deemed expedient, for assistance grants to and/or medical care for, and for rehabilitation and any other services included in the federal laws as they now read or as they may hereafter be amended, providing matching funds to help such families and individuals attain or retain capability for independence or self-care, to accept and expend funds from the Government of the United States for such purposes in accordance with the laws of the United States as they now are or as they may hereafter be amended, and to make appropriations out of State funds for such purposes; provided that the maximum amount paid out of State funds to or on behalf of any needy person shall not exceed the amount that is matchable out of federal funds; provided that the total amount of State funds paid for assistance grants for needy dependent children and the caretaker of the children shall not exceed Fifty-Five Million Dollars (\$55,000,000) during any fiscal year.

"Provided further, that if the limitations and restrictions herein contained are found to be in conflict with the provisions of appropriate federal statutes, as they now are or as they may be amended to the extent that federal matching money is not available to the State for these purposes, then and in that event the

Legislature is specifically authorized and empowered to prescribe such limitations and restrictions and enact such laws as may be necessary, in order that such federal matching money will be available for assistance and/or medical care for or on behalf of needy persons.

"Nothing in this section shall be construed to amend, modify or repeal Section 51 of Article XVI of this Constitution; provided further, however, that such medical care, services or assistance shall also include the employment of objective or subjective means, without the purpose of ascertaining and measuring the powers of vision of the human eye, and fitting lenses or prisms to correct or remedy any defect or abnormal condition of vision. Nothing herein shall be construed to permit for any defect whatsoever in any manner nor to administer nor to prescribe any drug or physical treatment whatsoever, unless such optometrist is a regularly licensed physician or surgeon under the laws of this State."

Sec. 2. The foregoing constitutional amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this State at an election to be held on May 18, 1971, at which election the ballots shall be printed to provide for voting for or against the proposition: "The constitutional amendment removing the limitation on the total State appropriations for assistance grants for the needy aged, the needy disabled, and the needy blind, and setting a limitation on total State appropriations during any fiscal year for assistance grants for needy dependent children and the caretakers of such children."

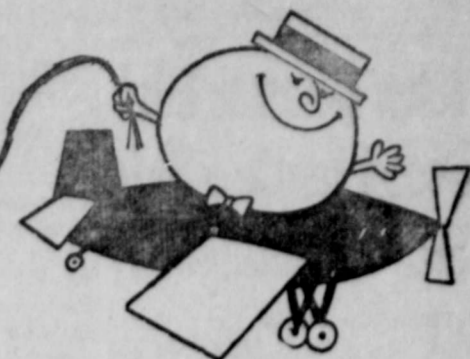
## PUBLIC NOTICE

**Proposed CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT**  
NUMBER ONE ON THE BALLOT (SJR 15)  
Special Election May 18, 1971

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: Section 1 That Article III, Section 24, of the Texas Constitution, be amended to read as follows: "Section 24. (1) The State Ethics Commission is created as an agency of the State. The commission consists of nine members. Three members shall be appointed by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Texas with the advice and consent of the Associate Justices serving on the Court, three members shall be appointed by the Presiding Judge of the Court of Criminal Appeals of Texas with the advice and consent of the other Judges serving on the Court, and three members shall be appointed by the Chairman of the State Judicial Qualifications Commission with the advice and consent of the other members of the commission, of each group of three appointees no more than two shall be attorneys engaged in the active practice of law. In addition thereto there shall be two ex officio members, one from the House of Representatives and one from the Senate to be elected on the first day of each Regular Session of the Legislature by a majority of the membership of each House for a term ending on the first day of the next Regular Session. (2) With the exception of the initial appointees, each member shall hold office for a term of six (6) years and until his successor is appointed and has qualified. In making the initial appointments, each appointing officer shall designate one (1) appointee to serve a term of two (2) years, one (1) appointee to serve a term of four (4) years, and one (1) appointee to serve a term of six (6) years. Interim vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as vacancies due to expiration of a full term, but only for the unexpired portion of the term in question. The membership shall designate one of its members to serve as chairman for a period of two (2) years. (3) The members of the commission shall be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties. (4) The commission shall recommend the compensation, per diem, and mileage allowance of members of the Legislature, and may recommend the salary of the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Lieutenant Governor as an amount higher than that of other members notwithstanding any provisions to the contrary of Article IV, Section 17, of the Texas Constitution. (5) The commission shall promulgate rules of ethics to govern the conduct of all legislators, legislative officers and all officeholders, appointive or elective, of any office, department, district agency, commission, board or any governmental unit or branch established by or under the authority of the constitution and laws of the State of Texas and all persons who shall use any privilege of the floor in either House of the Legislature. The Texas State Ethics Commission shall further promulgate rules providing that each member of the Legislature and each of the hereinabove named officeholders upon election and any appointee to any of these offices shall file with the State Ethics Commission a statement under oath setting out a complete financial statement in detail within 10 days after being elected or receiving an appointment. This information shall be privileged information to be used only by them to determine if there exists a conflict of interests or if there is or has been a violation of any of the rules of ethics promulgated by the Texas State Ethics Commission or any laws of the State of Texas. The Legislature shall enact statutes dealing with unauthorized disclosure or misuse of said privileged information. (6) The commission may hold its meetings, hearings and other proceedings at such times and places as it shall determine but shall meet in Austin at least once each year to review existing rules of ethics, legislative compensation rates, mileage allowances and per diem rates, and to make any changes deemed necessary. (7) All rules of ethics, compensation rates, mileage allowances or per diem rates currently in force, as well as all changes and recommendations by the State Ethics Commission shall be promulgated before the convening of any session of the Legislature by filing a certified copy of the proclamation with the Secretary of State. (a) Each rule of ethics or change thereof made by the commission shall take effect on the 15th day of the legislative session following the proclamation unless discontinued before that day by resolution of either House of the Legislature. (b) All rates of compensation, mileage allowances or per diem rates and all changes and recommendations made by the commission thereof shall not take effect until approved section by section by resolution of both Houses of the Legislature. (c) All votes on these resolutions or parts thereof shall show the individual votes in the respective journals of both Houses. (8) The commission shall investigate any alleged violation of any rule of ethics promulgated by it and report its findings to the appropriate State agency, official, legislative body, grand jury or district attorney. (9) Until otherwise provided by the commission, each member of the Legislature shall receive from the public treasury an annual salary of Four Thousand, Eight Hundred Dollars (\$4,800) per year and per diem not exceeding Twelve Dollars

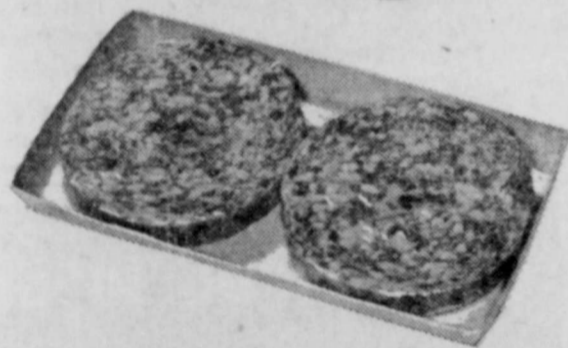

## Firing Squad For Dope Peddlers Brings Drug Problem Under Control

WASHINGTON, D. C. — In football the only sure way to break up a forward pass is to block the passer. Iran, one of the heaviest producers of opium has applied this tactic to dope peddlers with what they say is maximum effects.

Poppy farmers in Iran are under Government supervision. The acreage devoted to poppy raising is allotted and all production is sold to the Iranian Government at a fixed price. As would be expected there is also a large amount grown outside that allowed. It is sold illegally at a higher price than that sold under regulation. The same situation exists in Turkey, where there is even larger poppy production.

Poppies sold on the black market are crudely processed in clandestine plants in Iran and Turkey. The rough product is then taken to France where, again, it is illegally refined into heroin and other drugs for illicit sale, a large amount of which finds its market in the United States.

Our country's representatives have been in consultation with Turkey and Iran in its efforts to curb the illicit traffic of drugs to this Country. A subsidy to the farmers of both countries to reduce acreage has been considered, with the U. S. contributing.

In the meantime, we are discussing with France her responsibilities of taking action against dope refineries. It seems some headway has been made but certainly more needs to be done.

Iran itself has a narcotics problem and has recently invoked the death penalty against peddlers convicted of a second offense. Iranian officials say that since a number of peddlers faced a firing squad, their drug problem has come under control.

The drug problem in this country is common knowledge. Even one addict is a problem to someone — himself and to the family. Multiplied by two million or more — and no one really knows for sure — it becomes a crisis. To make the matter more sad and alarming is the fact that addiction has spread to grammar school children. This is known to be happening here in Washington and is declared to be the case in a number of our large cities.

Murder in the first degree, since about the beginning of time, has been the most serious offense under any kind of legal order. In this century the murder of the soul of a child might well be considered a more dastardly crime than the killing of the physical body of a man.

The dope addict not only becomes the victim of the drug seller but a menace to all society. A victim in the awful grip of addiction is under compulsion to satisfy his habit which may run to a cost of \$100 or more a day. As a result a huge percentage of the crimes of violence are committed to obtain money to buy drugs. Our Nation's Capital is an appalling example.

Vast sums of money are being spent for the care and treatment of narcotic victims. The numbers continue to grow—the results in treatment appear doubtful.

This is not a dissertation on the normal question of the death penalty — a subject of many dimensions. It is however, an issue currently debated in many State legislatures. Also debated is the distinction for punishment between the possession of narcotics by the user and the possession by the dope pusher. There is obviously a great difference if it can be identified.

The observation of President Thomas Jefferson might be appropriate when he noted that "the choice of two evils is often a necessity of political life." The most severe penalty on the dope peddler, as between the conversion of school children to drugs, is the lesser of evils. It is not a matter of the care of the criminal but rising to the defense of children.

For thousands of years, man has defined crimes against property and against his physical person. It remained for the scientific 20th Century to produce crimes against the soul.
