1970 Incentive Checks For \$393,798 Go To County Wool-Mohair Producers

Mills County wool and mohair producers earned \$393,798 under the 1970 wool and mohair incentive program, it was announced this week. This compares with \$255,443 under the 1969 program, officials of the Mills County ASCS office stated.

The 1970 payment rate for wool is based on the difference between the incentive price of 72 cents, which is set by law, and the 1970 national average market price for wool of 35.6

cents received by growers. Each grower's wool payment is figured by multiplying his dollar return from the sale of his wool, less marketing charges, by the 1970 payment rate of 102.8 per cent, which is the difference needed to raise growers' returns to the 72 cent incentive price.

This means that for each \$100 the grower earned from the sale of his wool in 1970, he also earned an additional \$102.80 in-

Livestock Association To Sponsor Benefit Auction Sale To Pay Debts

The Mills County Livestock Raisers Association will sponsor a benefit auction sale on Monday, May 3, at 4 p. m. to raise funds to pay some outstanding obligations.

Members of the association voted to have this benefit sale at a special called business meeting at the show barns in Goldthwaite last Thursday night.

The association sponsors the annual Mills County Livestock Show for the benefit of the 4-H, FFA, and FFA boys and girls of Mills County.

Glenn Sanders, president, presided at the meeting and a treasurer's report prepared by Houston Duren was presented.

The finance report shows the association is more than slightly in the red. Sanders told the group that the association needs money to pay some outstanding bills.

The association as of April 7 had a cash balance of \$2.35 and owed a total of \$709.94. Of this amount \$281.44 is for accounts payable including city utilities, a balance due on 1971 Stock

Show Catalogs, and a three year insurance policy on the show barns. The balance of \$428.50 is for a note plus interest at the bank on a loan the membership voted last year to make some badly needed repairs on the show barns.

The only anticipated income the association has will be \$30.00 from the Community Action Program for their share of the January, February, and March utilities for use of the show barns.

The group discussed the possibilities of a solicitation campaign for contributions and decided on the county wide benefit auction sale instead.

Livestock may be brought to the sale barn on Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday the day of the sale. If possible the association would prefer to have the livestock delivered to the sale barn on Friday.

Glenn Love, owner of the commission company, has announced that no commission will be charged on the sale of livestock for this purpose. The entire proceeds from the livestock sales will go to the Breeders Association.

Plans are being made to handle a large number including a wide variety of items. The sale will be conducted on the courthouse square.

Persons who have items that they would like to contribute to the sale are requested to bring them in or contact any of the four vocational agriculture teachers in the county and arrangements will be made for pick up service.

3,092 Vehicles Are Registered In Mills County

A total of 3,092 vehicles were registered in Mills County for 1971 as of Monday morning this week, according to H. G. Brooks, Tax Assessor-Collector and his office deputy, B. H. Jernigan.

This number covers all license tag sales including cars, trucks, pickups, trailers and boats. It reflects a considerable increase over the number issued during the same period last year.

Mills County received \$59,566.84 from the tag sales while \$9,051.04 went to the state from the total collections.

This year, the office issued more tags to transient vehicle owners than last year, tax officials stated.

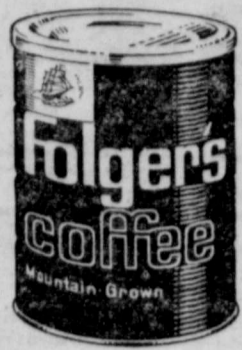

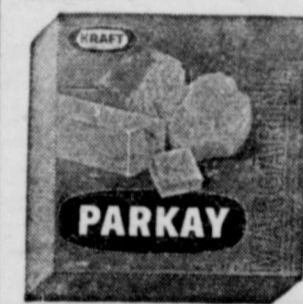

Farmers-Ranchers Urged To Protest Proposed Truck Driver Regulations

Farmers and ranchers are urged by Homer McCasland of Goldthwaite, president of the Mills County Farm Bureau, to let the federal government know how proposed farm truck driver regulations would affect their operations. Letters should be addressed to John A. Volpe, Secretary, U. S. Dept. of Transportation, Washington, D. C. 20515, McCasland said.

Proposed U. S. Dept. of Transportation regulations pertaining to farm truck driver qualifications will become effective on July 1 unless farmers and ranchers can convince the government that they should not be put into effect. The regulations were scheduled for last January 1, but were postponed to permit Farm Bureau and other organizations to study the regulations and file statements.

The regulations would affect drivers of all farm trucks — including pickup trucks. Although

the new regulations would be applicable to interstate commerce, recent court decisions indicate that the interstate commerce clause applies to anything and everything which might at some time enter interstate commerce.

Proposed regulations would include the following requirements for drivers of farm trucks:

- (1) Be at least 21 years of age.
- (2) Carry a certificate, executed by a physician during the preceding 24 months, evidencing fitness to drive a truck.
- (3) Pass a road test in truck operation.
- (4) Take and pass an examination on the federal Motor Vehicle Safety Regulations.
- (5) If driver is employee of farmer, he must supply the farmer with evidence of compliance with the four preceding requirements, plus an application for employment which shall disclose traffic violations and disposition thereof, plus an annual supplementary statement relative to traffic violations.

(6) A farmer who employs a driver would be required to "verify" the driver's driving record — and to maintain for each driver a file containing items 1 to 5 above, plus a record of the employer's verification of the employee's driving record.

Also, Congressman Omar Burleson and the two Texas Senators should be contacted and requested to intervene with Secretary Volpe in the matter of retaining present exemptions, or at least in modifying proposed regulations so that they will not be so damaging to agriculture.
