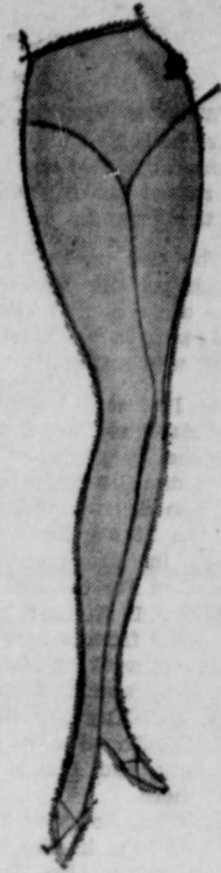

### Program "Operation Crime-Stop" Launched By Gov. Preston Smith

STIN — A statewide effort to reduce crime by stimulating public awareness and participation in law enforcement was launched today from the office of Governor Preston Smith. The appeal to Texas newspaper publishers, Governor Smith asked them to initiate, promote and publicize "Operation Crime-Stop" in their respective communities as part of the Governor's Crime-Stop Program. The plan has been endorsed by the Board of Directors of the Press Association, to the most of the publisher benefit. It seeks "to enlist the aid of newspapers across the state to join them with other agencies in their home communities in the campaign to involve citizens in crime prevention control." The role of the law enforcement agency (police or sheriff's department) in Crime-Stop, Governor explained, is principally of providing a home number for citizens to report suspicious person circumstances, and of making the necessary response calls. Though the police naturally prefer to know the identity of all callers, they assure that those who wish to remain anonymous will do so. Beyond this, the program is

largely one of creating public awareness of the crime problem, advising citizens of precautions which can be taken to prevent certain crimes, and persuading citizens to observe suspicious persons and circumstances and to report them by calling the Crime-Stop number. "Because so much of Crime-Stop's success depends on publicity, newspaper publishers are being asked to head up the effort. It is not a matter of their usurping the role of the police department or sheriff's office, but of offering the resources of the newspaper to help make the law enforcement agencies' job easier and more effective." The Governor asked that news media and police work together as a team. The law enforcement agency would set up and man the Crime-Stop telephone. The newspaper would campaign to stimulate public awareness of the pervasiveness of crime, appealing to citizens to assist police by reporting suspicious persons and circumstances and by providing helpful information. Governor Smith also advocated involving other groups in the community, including radio and television stations, civic clubs, chamber of commerce, schools, and business firms. Crime-Stop, he said, has a place in communities of all sizes. While the public information staff of the Criminal Justice Council will provide aids and suggestions to the newspapers, the program must be tailored locally to fit the needs of the individual community, he added. In addition to editorial aids to the newspapers, it was announced, the Criminal Justice Council also will provide technical assistance to police agencies in need of it for establishing the Crime-Stop procedure.

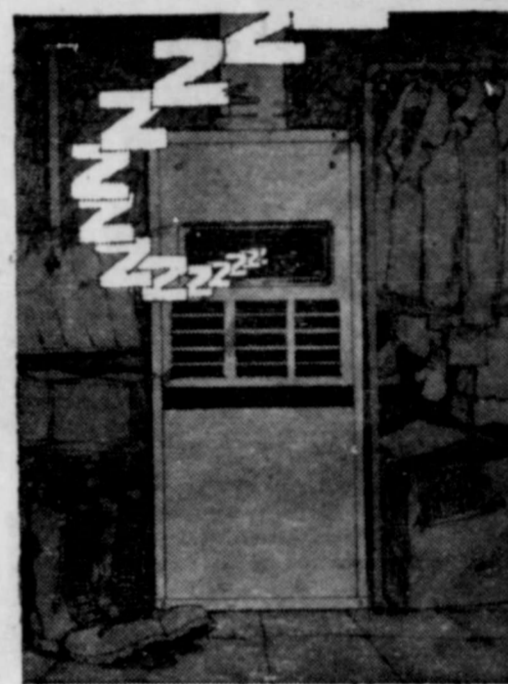

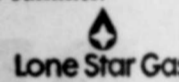

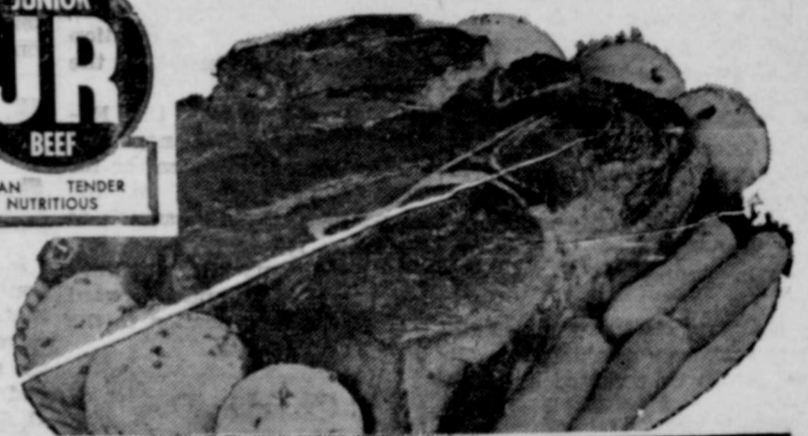

## Rising Welfare Costs To Bankrupt State Unless Brakes Applied: Barnes

AUSTIN, Tex. — Steadily-rising welfare costs will "bankrupt" state government unless prompt braking is applied, Lt. Gov. Ben Barnes has warned.

Barnes — acknowledging that a tax bill which may climb to nearly a billion dollars is necessary to balance the Senate's \$6.99 billion version of the biennial state budget — named a special committee to recommend how to effect welfare economies.

Senate, meanwhile, approved the record budget while a subcommittee drafted a tax bill. The house is expected to move out this week with its appropriations bill.

Only one year of welfare financing is included in the Senate bill. With a half-way welfare budget, about \$668 million in new taxes will be needed this year. Appropriating for welfare in a later special session will require nearly \$300 million more, unless the federal government steps in with additional aid.

Barnes' staff calculates Aid to Families with Dependent Children rolls are increasing by 3.10 per cent per month. Where 288,326 AFDC beneficiaries are anticipated by September 1 this year, 906,236 are seen by August 31, 1973. The latter figure would bring the AFDC cost to \$76

million a year — \$16 million above the proposed new \$55 million annual ceiling to be voted on May 18.

The Lieutenant Governor also noted that Medicare costs have increased from \$22 million in 1968 to an estimated \$144 million for next year. He said state medical services to the needy — financed through Blue Cross family insurance policies which will cost nearly \$72 per family next year — are better than those received by all but the very wealthy.

"I am convinced we are going to have to reduce the cost, or the state is going bankrupt," said Barnes.
