Santa Fe Station Closing Hearing To Be Held Here

New increased sales tax rate will go into effect Thursday, (today) July 1.

Since Goldthwaite does not have a city sales tax the four cent rate will apply here.

The increased rate will mean a sales tax of one cent on items starting at 13 cents where formerly it started at 16 cents.

Armyworms in maize — wonder what will be next. This is the way J. D. Hopper of Priddy feels. After walking over his field of maize we found a light infestation of armyworms in the whorl of his maize. This is not an uncommon thing for armyworms to be in maize during the pre-boot stage. Most of the time armyworms go unnoticed because of the small damage they cause. Eggs are laid on the leaves and hatched into larvae which feed in the whorl. However, these larvae are cannibalistic and usually only one larva completes its development in the whorl. For this reason and the fact that control is hard to accomplish, it is seldom economical to spray for the armyworm in maize. If control is warranted, an insecticide such as Sevin at the rate of 2 pounds per acre can be used.

The sorghum midge is the next culprit which is in line to get a shot at the maize crop. Females deposit eggs in the blooming floret and the larvae prevent seed development, causing "blasted" heads. Only adults can be controlled with present insecticides. Maize heads are susceptible to the adults during the entire blooming period.

Apply insecticide treatments when approximately 50% of the maize heads have begun to bloom where adult midge are present in the field. A second and third application after 3 to 5 day intervals may be necessary if midge are still active. Several insecticides are recommended for midge control: Sevin, rate 2 pounds per acre; Diazinon — ½ pint per acre; or Parathion — 1 pint per acre.
