"POP" Bottle Is Reminder Of Pioneer Business

An old fashioned glass "POP" bottle with imprint on the side is a reminder of an early day business enterprise in Goldthwaite.

James Hardy found the bottle buried under about two feet of other trash near an old house on his ranch about 10 miles west of Lometa.

Inscription imprinted on the side of the bottle reads: "Goldthwaite Bottling Works, Goldthwaite, Texas." The bottle was equipped with a wire loop attached to the stopper, or cork, which was apparently made up of three layers for sealing purposes. The wire loop was used in earlier days to pull the stopper, or cork, to open the bottle.

A pioneer bottler in Colorado who has long since passed on reported to the Eagle some years ago that the various bottled soft drinks got their name "POP" from the early day bottle that had a very pronounced pop when it was opened by pulling the cork, or stopper, with the wire loop. Mr. Hardy reported that his wife is a collector of bottles so this find is certainly a gem to add to her collection.

Last Minute Call Is Issued By Park Committee For Contributions

The Mills County Park Committee has issued a last minute call this week for financial support of the park maintenance fund for this year. The \$1,200.00 goal is now in sight and from all indications should be reached during the next week. This amount is needed to insure caretaker for the park for the 1971 season.

One of the latest boosters to join the Park Fund Honor Roll is the new Eagle publishing family, Mr. and Mrs. G. Frank Bridges of Schulenburg. They sent in their check the past week with the following note: "Read in your paper that you are still in need of Park Fund money, so we felt we wanted to contribute some too. After all, we will be a part of the community in only a few short weeks."

Response to the committee's appeal for financial support has been very good. With a few more contributions the committee feels that the drive will be completed and the goal reached.

The committee has conducted the voluntary contribution drive for the past several years in order to provide money for the park upkeep project.

When the plan was first adopted it called for enlisting 100 interested persons to give \$12.00, or more, to the park maintenance fund each year to take care of the project. With a little more help this can be done again this year as it has in the past.

Quite a number gave more than the suggested \$12 during the past several years. This has been a great help to the committee in reaching the goal without personal solicitation campaign.

The drive will be closed shortly and a list of all who have joined the park maintenance fund honor roll for 1971 will be published in the Eagle. In order to complete the job those who have not sent in their donations are invited to do so. Checks should be made out to the Park Fund and turned in at Mills County State Bank or to any member of the park committee.

In Big Valley Elbert Hoffman at Leonard Farms reported 19 inches.

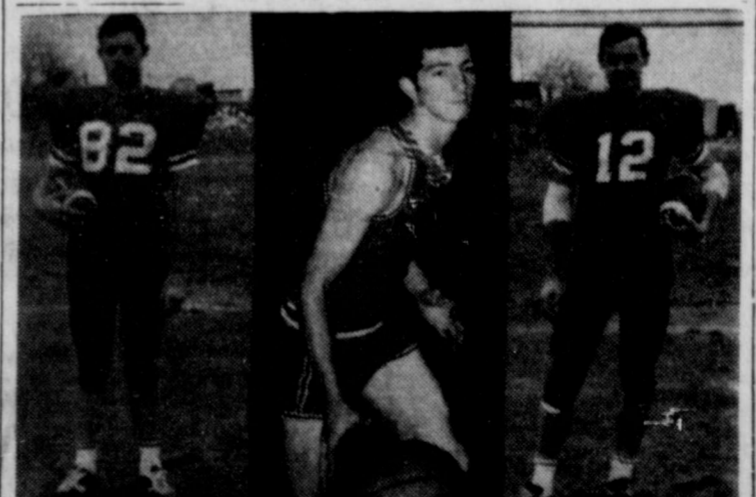

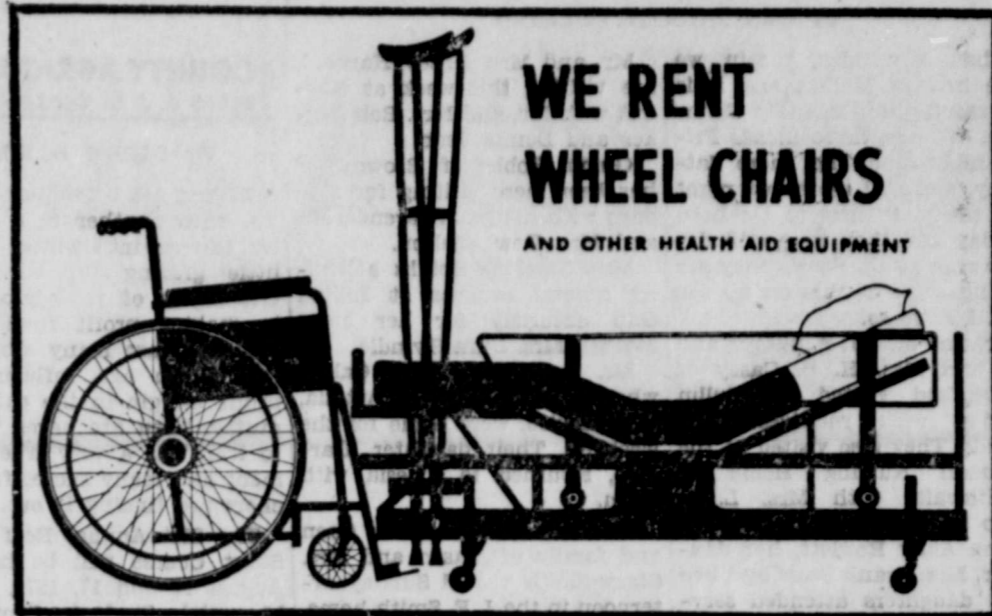

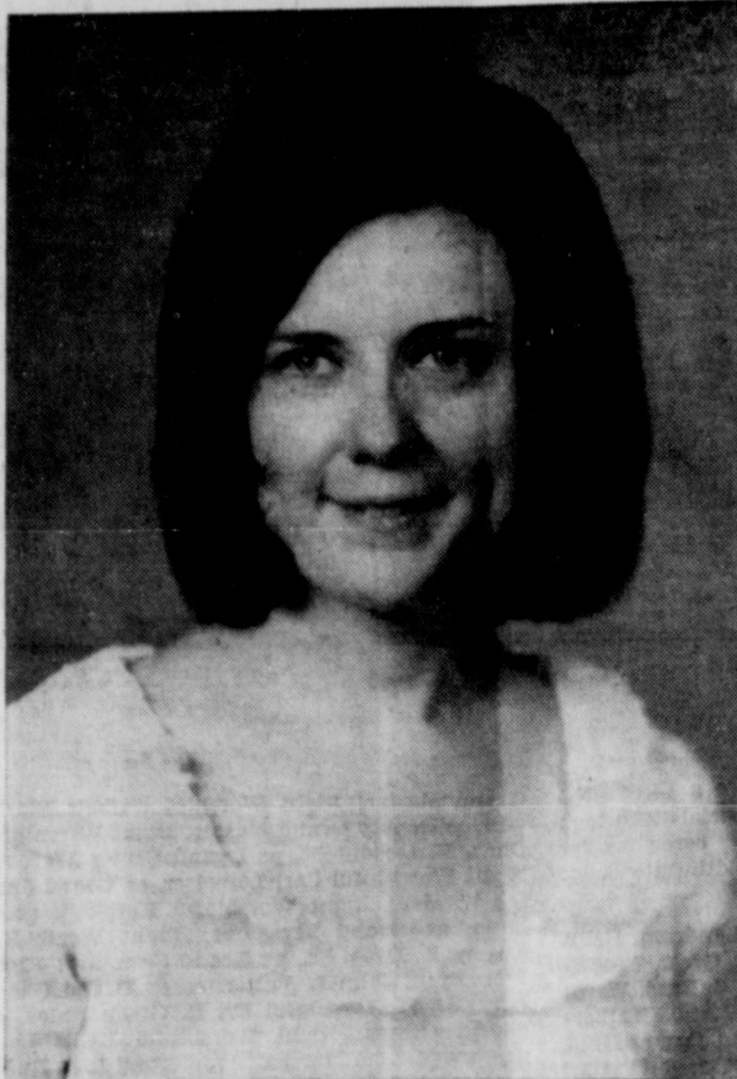

All Texas Students Need "Shots" To Comply With Immunization Law

All students enrolled in schools and institutions of higher learning must have immunization against certain diseases to comply with a new Texas law that is now in effect.

Following is the immunization schedule according to grade or age groupings released by the Texas State Department of Health.

Kindergarten and grades 1-5 or children ages 5-11 in ungraded schools:
Polio — At least three doses of oral vaccine, provided one or more doses have been received since the fourth birthday.

Diphtheria-Tetanus — Minimum of three doses, with at least one dose having been received since the fourth birthday. It is usually given as DTP for children less than six years of age and Td for children six years of age or older.

Measles — One dose of vaccine, or history of measles.

Rubella — One dose of vaccine, not required past 12 years of age.

Smallpox — One vaccine within the past 10 years.

Grades 6-12 or students years of age or older in ungraded schools other than institutions of higher learning:
Polio — At least three doses of oral vaccine, provided one or more doses have been received since the fourth birthday. Vaccine is not required for sons 19 years of age or older.

Diphtheria-Tetanus — Minimum of three doses with last dose within the past 10 years; booster dose only if initial series. Pertussis is not given past six years of age.

Measles — The majority of children in this group will have obtained natural immunity through infection. Immunization is recommended only if history of vaccination is thought to be negative.

Rubella — Not required past 12 years of age.

Smallpox — One vaccine within the past 10 years.

Institutions of Higher Learning:
Polio — At least three doses of oral vaccine, provided one or more doses have been received since the fourth birthday. Vaccine is not required for sons 19 years of age or older.

Diphtheria-Tetanus — Minimum of three doses with last dose within 10 years; booster dose only after initial (Td adult type).

Smallpox — One vaccine within the past 10 years.

All schools will be required to maintain records of the immunization status of individual students. The State Health Department is designing a form for this purpose.
