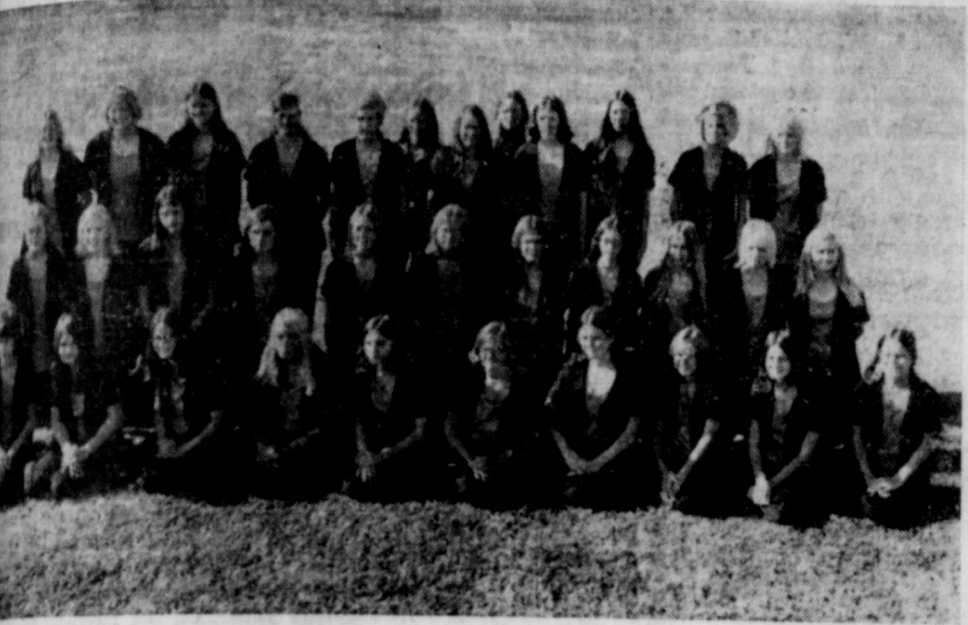

## Eagles Soar High With 23-12 Victory Over Dillos; Host Hamilton Friday

History does have a way of repeating itself. The Goldthwaite Eagles proved that point last Friday night by hanging a 23-12 victory over the AA San Saba Dillos in their traditional season opener. This is the first time since 1965 that the Eagles have defeated the Dillos. Last year the race was close as the Eagles held San Saba back until in the last quarter of the game when they broke through and scored on a five yard run.

Reggie Robbins plunged five yards in the first quarter to put the Eagles on the scoreboard. Quarterback Johnny Johnson's attempted PAT try was blocked. Johnson booted a 20-yard field goal in the second period to give the Eagles a 9-0 half-time lead.

## "B" Eagles Open Season With A 35-22 Win Over Bangs Dragons

The Goldthwaite Eagle "B" team opened their football season last Thursday night with a 35-22 win over the Bangs Dragon "B" team.

SS Dillos got on the scoreboard in the third period on a pass from Tom Epperson to Billy Smith. The same two teamed up for a 65-yard scoring run that put the Dillos back in the game.

In the first quarter the scoring went like this: Larry Elliott scored from 7 yds. out and extra point failed. After a Bangs fumble the Eagles started another drive and capped it off when Terry McLean went 8 yds. on a keeper. Elliott added the two point conversion. Bangs got on the scoreboard on their next possession on a 40 yd. sweep. Goldthwaite scored on their

next possession when Andy Cook broke for a 20 yd. TD. Cook also added the one point conversion.

## Drive Started To Equip New Rural Fire Truck

A fund drive to equip the new rural fire truck which has recently been purchased has been started, according to announcement this week by Roger Horton, assistant fire chief. The Mills County Commissioners' Court has purchased a new two-ton Chevrolet truck chassis for the rural fire truck.

The Eagles took the Bangs kickoff and drove it to the one yd. line before losing the ball on downs, but the Eagles had succeeded in running the clock down to but one minute and 30 seconds left in the game.

Eagle "B" team then played tough defense and put the game on ice with an interception by Andy Cook. QB Terry McLean ran the clock out to end the game at 35-22 and start the Eagle "B" team off the right way, winning. Ball control and team effort were the two most important factors in the game.

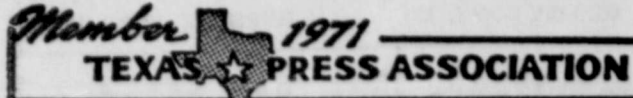

## PUBLIC NOTICE

AN ACT  
S. B. No. 249  
relating to the recording and re-recording of livestock brands and marks, and declaring an emergency.  
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

Section 1. This Act shall apply to every county in this state. In all the counties each owner of any livestock mentioned in Chapter 1 of Title 121 of the Revised Civil Statutes of 1925 shall within six months after this Act takes effect have his mark and brand for such stock recorded in the office of the county clerk of the county. These owners shall record the marks and brands whether the brands and marks have been previously recorded or not.

(b) The owner shall have the right to have his mark and brand recorded in his name who according to the present records of the county first recorded the brand and mark in the county, or in event it can not be ascertained from the records who first recorded the brand and mark in the county, then the person who has been using such mark and brand the longest shall have the right to have the brand and mark recorded in his name.

(c) After the expiration of six months from the taking effect of this Act all records of marks and brands now in existence in the county shall no longer have any force or effect and after the expiration of six months only the records made after this Act takes effect shall be examined or considered in recording marks and brands in the county.

(d) Immediately upon the taking effect of this Act the county clerk of the county shall have this Act published in some newspaper of general circulation in the county for a period of thirty days. The publication shall be paid for by the county out of the general county fund.

Sec. 2. All clerks in re-registering brands shall comply with Articles 6890 through 6899, inclusive, of the Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, 1925 as amended, and with Section 1, Chapter 273, Acts of the 41st Legislature, 1929, as amended (Article 6899a, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), and shall also be aware of and comply with Articles 1464, 1465, and 1466, and of the Penal Code of Texas, 1925.

Sec. 3. All brands and marks registered under the provisions of this Act shall be re-registered every 10 years in the manner prescribed in Section 1 of this Act.

Sec. 4. The importance of this legislation and the crowded condition of the calendars in both houses create an emergency and an imperative public necessity that the Constitutional Rule requiring bills to be read on three several days in each House be suspended and his Rule is hereby suspended; and that this Act take effect and be in force and after its passage and it is so enacted.

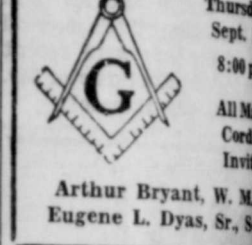

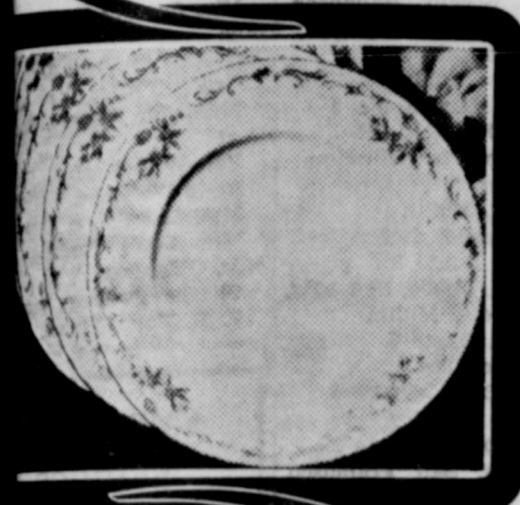
