## Eagles Win District Opener 55-14 Over Early; Homecoming Friday

The Golden Eagles came home "proud birds" Friday night after winning their first 10-A district contest for the '71 season against Early by a score of 55-14.

Goldthwaite unit scored twice in the first period of play with the first touchdown coming with 10:30 remaining in the quarter. Reggie Robbins, Eagle halfback, ran 18 yards for the score and quarterback Johnny Johnson made the kick good to make the score 7-0.

Robbins scored again on a 12 yard run with 6:03 showing in the first period. Johnson's kick failed.

With 45 seconds remaining in the quarter Early's halfback Bryan Horner scored from one yard out. Chris Boyd ran the ball for two extra points.

Gary Summy intercepted a pass on his own 40 yard line in the second quarter to set up another TD for the Eagles. Two plays later Johnny Miller scored from the 10. Johnson and Joe Hudson connected for two extra points.

Just before halftime Bill Bishop scored from the 10, however the extra point failed. Goldthwaite led at the half 27-8. Johnson passed to Bennie

Humphries in the third quarter for a 25 yard touchdown. Kick was good. Johnson and Bishop teamed up for a five-yard TD with 3:03 remaining in the quarter.

When Early had to punt, Goldthwaite's Joe Hudson returned the punt 67 yards for a touchdown.

In the fourth quarter Randy Wright scored from two yards out. Fisher's kick was good.

Early's last TD came on a 45 yard pass from Lance Blackwell to Dellwyn Hughes. Extra point failed.

The 55-14 victory over the Longhorns brought the Eagles record to 4 wins and 2 losses.

Reggie Robbins carried the ball 10 times for a total of 124 yards, average 12.4; Bill Bishop 15 for 114, average 7.6; Johnny Miller, 10 for 87, average 8.7; Randy Wright, 6 for 16, average 2.7; Johnny Johnson, 3 for 4, average 1.3.

On passes Bennie Humphries caught 3 for 68 yards, Joe Hudson, 2 for 35, Reggie Robbins, 2 for 16 and Bill Bishop, 1 for 6. Goldthwaite played 76 plays while Early played 79.

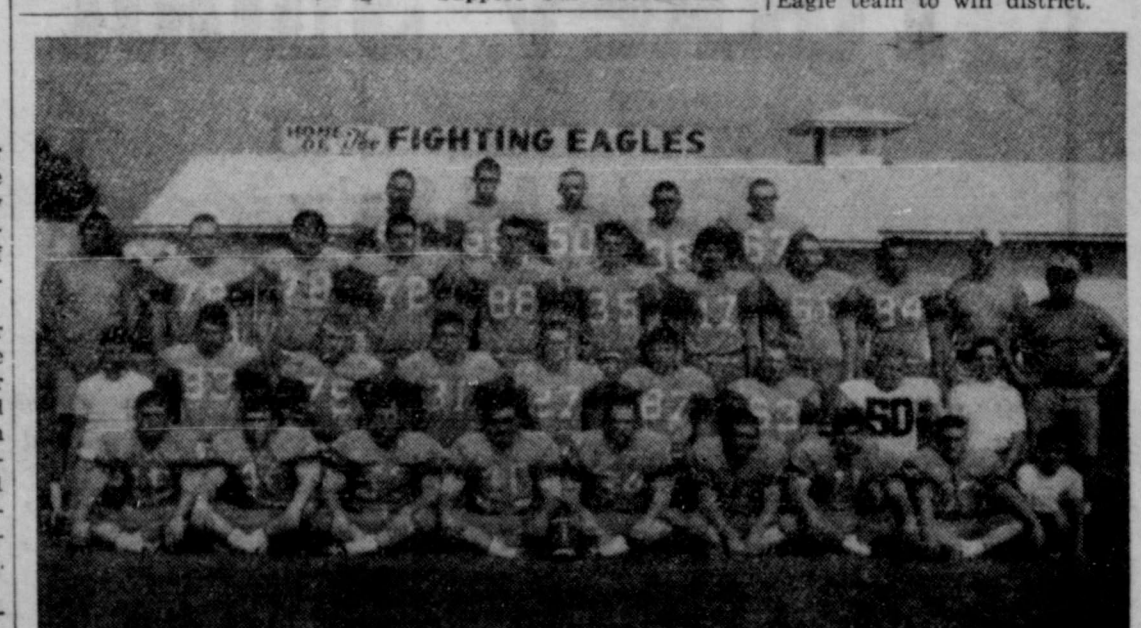
## Dinner Given In Honor Of Mrs. Lily Attaway

**NEWS from YOUR COUNTY AGRICULTURAL AGENT**  
TEXAS A. & M. COLLEGE EXTENSION SERVICE

Livestock producers have had their hands full with all kinds of problems the past year which is actually a part of the industry. With winter coming on, more problems will arise and one major problem is the build up of the tick population. Ticks can cause tremendous losses to cattle through loss of blood, weakened condition, reduced feed conversion efficiency and increased susceptibility to diseases and nutritional disorders. Many troublesome ticks attack primarily during winter months when animals are in their poorest nutritional state, thus creating an extra burden on the animal's defenses. Effective tick control can be accomplished economically through the use of modern spray and dip materials. Some sprays and dips available include: Sevin, Co-Ral, Lindane, Malathion, Toxaphene, Ronnel, and others. Cattle should be checked thoroughly for ear ticks and treated with a recommended ear tick insecticide.

Producers should keep a watchful eye for screwworm cases. Several cases have been confirmed in the county and more are sure to pop up. Samples of all cases of worms found should be sent off to be determined if screwworm or maggot. Through help of every producer, the screwworm outbreak can be stopped.
