## And Beard Selected All District 6-Man Team

Hunt and Jesse Beard both been selected for the All District Football Six-Man Team.

Hunt completed 43 of 75 passes for 552 yards and 7 TD's. He caught 15 passes for 307 yards and 4 TD's. He kicked 9 TD's and kicked extra point. Hunt also intercepted 3 passes this past season and ran one back for a TD. This year he got 54

unassisted tackles and 60 assists for 114 tackles.

Beard completed 35 of 93 passes for 687 yards and 7 TD's. He caught 8 passes for 88 yards and 3 TD's. He also rushed for 8 TD's and returned a kickoff for 70 yards and a TD. Beard kicked 10 extra points and defensively this past season he made 45 unassisted and 68 assisted tackles for 113 total tackles from his end position.

## Eagle Roundballers Bring Home Trophies From Rising Star Tourney

The Goldthwaite Girls and Boys basketball teams were entered in the Rising Star Invitational tournament which was held the third weekend in December.

The boys returned home with the team championship trophy while the girls brought home the consolation trophy.

### GIRLS' RESULTS

The first game was with district rival Cross Plains, who defeated the Eagles 49-36. High scorers for the game were Barbara Davis, 19 points and Marilyn Roberts, 13.

In the second game Goldthwaite defeated Putnam 52-34 with Davis scoring 29 points and Roberts scoring 17.

Goldthwaite also had a fairly easy time defeating May for the consolation trophy. The final score was 51-39. However, in this game Kathy Curtis received a knee injury which may prevent her from playing in the next few games. In the May game Davis scored 35 points and Roberts added 14. Davis made the all-tournament team and was top scorer of the tourney with 83 points.

The girls will play in the Early tournament December 30, 31 and January 1. The Eaglettes will play Talpa-Centennial on Thursday, December 30 at 11:40 a.m. in the Early gym.

### BOYS' RESULTS

The Eagles played their first

game against a tough May team and defeated them 46-40. High pointers in the game were Benny Humphries, 13 points; Clinton Wesson, 13; and Johnny Johnson with 12.

In the second game the Eagles met Putnam and played one of their better games this year by downing them 54-29. High point boys were Johnson, 16; Wesson, 11; and Joe Hudson, 10.

This placed Goldthwaite in the finals against district rival Early. The final game was close up until the final minutes of play when the Eagles began to stall the ball and pull away by going to the foal line.

The Eagles showed improvement throughout the Rising Star Tournament and probably

had their best game as far as shooting goes in the finals Saturday night. Against the Longhorns they shot 45 per cent from the floor and 54 per cent from the foal line.

Johnson and Humphries were placed on the all-tournament team. Johnson scored 57 points throughout the tourney, had 18 rebounds and averaged 67 per cent at the foal line. Humphries had a total of 36 points, 25 rebounds and shot 43 per cent from the foal line.

The Eagles will play against Early at Early on January 4, at 7:30 p.m. to start their district games.

Ralph Duren has announced his candidacy for Commissioner of Precinct 3, in the Democratic Primary to be held May 6, 1972 in Mills County.

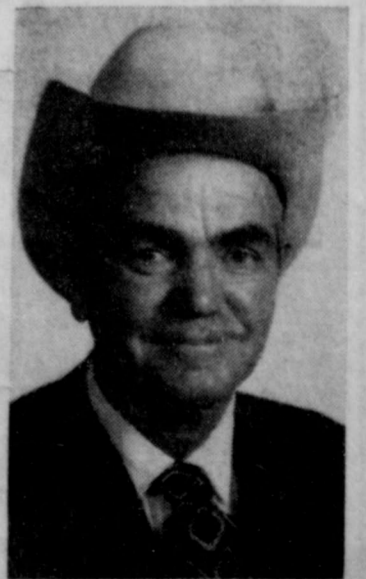

### Chet Brooks Is Candidate For Re-Election To Senate

State Senator Chet Brooks, son of Mrs. Julia Biddle of Goldthwaite has announced for reelection subject to the 1972 Democratic Primary and General Election.

Sen. Brooks, author of the Texas Open Meetings Law and numerous education and health care measures, represents a major sector of Harris County in the Texas Senate.

Some of the landmark legislation he has authored during his 10 years in the Legislature includes the open meetings law, the Technical-Vocational Education Act of 1969, the Brooks-Bass Medical Training Act which established the University of Texas Medical School at Houston, the bill creating the University of Houston at Clear Lake City, the law permitting the Coordinating Board to contract with Baylor College of Medicine for the instruction of Texas medical students, the law requiring immunization of Texas school children to prevent epidemics, and the measure creating the Governor's Committee on Human Relations.

If he wins reelection, Senator Brooks will be the senior senator from Harris County and will rise from ninth to sixth in Senate seniority rank. At 36, he is the second youngest member of the Senate.

## Special Legislature Session Open Governor Smith Surveying Angles

Gov. Preston Smith is keeping everybody guessing on timing of the important 1972 special legislative session.

The Governor said he will wait "until the last minute" to call the session, primarily for passage of a 1972-73 state appropriations bill, hoping latest revenue estimates will curb the inevitable tax bill.

On the other hand, he said he could not rule out possibility of calling the lawmakers back to Austin smack in the middle of the primary election campaign between the February 7 filing deadline and the May 6 first primary.

Smith did make clear he is giving little consideration to pleas by some state representatives for an early 1972 session on replacement of Speaker Gus Mutscher. Mutscher's bribery trial is set for February 28 in Abilene.

"It is my responsibility to call

a special session because emergency," said Smith, placing the speaker in an emergency of that importance. The speaker has very little to do between sessions.

The Governor pointed out that a U. S. Supreme Court ruling may invalidate poll taxes and create an emergency demanding a special session early in the year. A bill attacking the old filing structure is pending in the Supreme Court. A new bill challenged the 1971 filing deadline last week.

"It is entirely possible we have to call a special session after January 1 if the filing fees are held unconstitutional," Smith commented in a news conference.

July 1 (after the second primary) would be about the date for summoning a session that could pass a budget

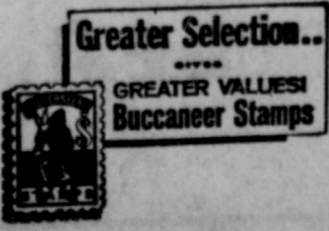

Cattle producers in Mills County should be alerted to the fact that an outbreak of cattle scab (psoroptic mange) has occurred in the High Plains of Texas. A state and federal quarantine has been placed on 34 counties effective December 11 and 14, respectively.

Scabies is caused by tiny parasitic mites which live on the skin and cause scab formation. It is highly contagious and it spreads easily from animal to animal by direct contact or infested brushes or grooming equipment. It is not transmissible to other species of animals. The mites cause an intense itching and scab formation with a loss of hair in affected areas. Animals become weak and may succumb if not properly treated.

Officially approved treatment consists of the use of toxaphene or lime-sulfur dips at 10 to 14 day intervals. Toxaphene is cheaper than the lime-sulfur which must be heated. Treated animals must be withheld from slaughter for 28 days following the treatment with toxaphene to avoid residuals in the meat.

Livestock owners who notice any abnormal skin conditions in their animals to contact their local veterinarian for a closer check.

Now is the time to treat horses for botflies. Bots are the larvae or maggots of three flies that lay their eggs on the nose, lips, throat, chest, and legs of horses from June until November. The eggs hatch and when the horse licks a spot where the eggs are attached, the maggots first invade tissues in the
