



"Most children have some riding experience, but unless they learn the rules of safety. serious trouble lies ahead, warned Dorthy Taylor, family life education specialist at Texas A&M University.

Like shoes, purchase bicycles to fit, not to grow into. Bikes too large for the rider are too hard to handle safely

A bicycle is a vehicle, so teach the child to ride the bike on the right side of the street.

"Instruct your child in the use of hand signals," the specialist advised, "Teach him the meaning of such terms as 'right-of-wal' and 'intersection'.

Are the seat and handle bars safe and comfortable? No one style is safer than the otherlightweight, middleweight, racing or touring bike or the popular high-rise bike.






