Dairy To Hold Ground-**Breaking On Saturday**

Groundbreaking for a multi-million dollar dairy southeast of Friona is scheduled for 11 a.m. Saturday, January 26.

The public is invited to attend the ceremony. Location of the new dairy is seven miles east of Hub on

Highway 86. Harry and Margret DeWit, Holland natives, who have owned and operated dairies at Stephenville, are announcing plans to relocate to Parmer County.

Thus, the local area, which was and continues to be a leader in cattle feeding and processing, will be in on the "ground floor" of the dairy industry, which is beginning to get a toe-hold in this region.

DeWit will begin immediate construction on High Plains Dairy, with completion expected by July of this year.

"Phase one" of the development will include facilities for some 2500 milk cows and 500 dry cows and

This is one of the occupational hazards of being a writer and trying to read something that someone else has published. You end up proof reading everything, even the stuff on the back of the cereal box sitting on the breakfast table.

As far as the old apostrophe goes, it doesn't command very much respect anymore. I guess Bill Ellis and a few elderly English teachers are the only people left in America who have an inkling of why we bother with them at all. My usage of apostrophes leans mostly toward "when in doubt, leave it out."

A recent news release from our alma mater of higher learning in Lubbock discussed the well-known radio play which was performed like a news broadcast, "H.G. Well's War of the Worlds." So from this we now know that they are not teaching the proper placement of apostrophes at Texas Tech. Having a name that ends in 's' does present certain

problems when it comes to ownership. Attention those of you with names like: Jones, Wells, Flores, Knowles, Duggins, Morales, Hromas, Mays, etc.; the following information applies to everyone with names ending in 's.' The plural of Wells is Wellsesor Jonesesor Dugginses ...or Moraleses, and so forth. The singular possessive of Wells is Wells' but it is pronounced like Wellses;

which is quite confusing because the plural possessive of Wells is Wellses'. Here are some examples: (We'll switch to Jones for the example, but remember, this applies to any and all names ending in 's.') The Tom Joneses are coming to visit (plain old plural, no apostrophe is needed). Tom Jones' pig won first place at the stock show (singular possessive; pronounced Joneses). The Tom Joneses' car ran out of gas while they were

on a trip to Amarillo (plural possessive). I know this because I once had a nice simple name like Stone, but have been stuck with one of those "ending in s"

names for the past 44 years.

Leave it to the English who foisted this language upon us! Some folks in England have formed the The Apostrophe Protection Society. When they see a sign reading "Apple's and pear's for sale" they march into the establishment and get cranky with the owner. They have reported that the worst example they have found so far is a menu listing "chip's, sausage's, roll's, egg's, etc." at an eatery that calls itself "Bennys Cafe."



Bovina Band Has 43 Qualifiers For All-Region

Band Director Last week the Bovina Band once again proved their ability to match musical skills against the toughest region in Texas. Region 16, the Greater Lubbock area, dominated the state marching finals in December. Three of the top five bands were Smyer, Sudan and Whiteface.

The All-Region Bands are comprised of 117 of the best musicians in A and AA bands for high school and middle

school students. Last Tuesday (Jan 15), the middle school students from Bovina competed at New Deal against 580 musicians. We had 43 students tryout and successfully seated 23 in the All-Region Band. The next best band was only able to seat 12 students.

On Thursday (Jan 17) the high school students competed in Abernathy against 315 others. We took 32 students and successfully seated 17 in the All-Region Band. Our next best competitor placed 9 students. In all we were able to seat 43 students in the All-Region Bands this year, which is up from 29 last year and 13 the year before.

All of these students will be performing a concert on Saturday, February 2, at the Civic Center in Lubbock. The middle school group will perform at 2 p.m.. The high school will perform at 3 p.m. and the Honors Band will perform at 3:30 p.m.

Everyone is welcome to come watch and listen as our students perform musical selections such as: "Rough Riders," Crouching Tiger, Hidden Dragon," An American Portrait," and other great selections.

The price is \$2 per person at the door. Our high school students will be wearing their new band uniform and they look great.


