There has never been a time in the history of man when mankind did not live under tension. From the earliest accounts of man - from the temptation in the garden of Eden, there have been three kinds of tensions. Tension between man and God, between man and man and man in tension with himself.

God is righteous and requires rightness of us. Since our nature is such that it is, we love to do what is forbidden much rather than to do what is bidden. This earns punishment for us and separates us from God. It is also natural for man to ignore God, to go. his own way and in a sense feel liberated.

Tension between man and man has manifeste itself in history. From the beginning, Adam tried to blame his mate for the difficulty they got into. Then one son, Cain, killed his brother Abel out of jealousy, and so it has been down through history. Men have learned to resent each other. Jealousy develops and bad feelings lead to evil acts. Especially is this true when one feels superior to another and feels threatened by the other. This holds true not only for individuals, but also for nations. Since we give in to this old nature we have wars and threatenings of wars and thus feel insecure and live under the tension of fear. We may not always be conscious of this fear, but it's there.

Tension within oneself is most often not recognized. Symptoms are sometimes thought of as being the disease. Seldom is a disease cured by the treatment of the symptom only. The root cause must be found and treated. One knows what he should be, but is dissatisfied with what he is. Result — internal tension.

Since our society is in a sense 'artificial" we join it in order not to be different. The struggle we have within us causes us to treat symptoms. We struggle to find what we are looking for. We have artifically induced sleep. We take sleeping pills, many of which are drugs. Then we stimulate ourselves to be alert - that with other drugs. We seek moments of joy, also by artifical means. No wonder a drug culture has developed.

> By the year 1940 Goldthwaite had begun to have trouble with the plant and the quality of the water down stream. 


