

## Runoff Election Is Set Here Tuesday

With no local or county races contested, a light turnout of voters is expected for the Democratic and Republican runoff primaries next Tuesday.

In Bovina, the two local precincts will be consolidated for this election only. All voting will take place at the Bovina EMS Building. Voters who would ordinarily vote at Ridgelea School are asked to vote at the EMS Building.

Four races will appear on the Republican Runoff ballot, for statewide races.

For justice of the Texas Supreme Court, place 2, Elizabeth Ray and Dale Wainwright are the runoff candidates.

For Judge of the Court of Criminal Appeals, Place 1, Tom Price and Tim Taft are the candidates.

David Richards and Paul Womack are the candidates for the Judge of the Court of

Criminal Appeals, Place 2.

For Judge of the Court of Criminal Appeals, Place 3, candidates are Cathy Cochran and Guy Williams.

The only race on the Democratic runoff ballot in Parmer County is for the nomination for U.S. Senator, being vacated by Phil Gramm, where Ron Kirk, Dallas mayor, opposes longtime educator Victor Morales.

IF TELEVISION had been developed to the point it is today in the 1940s, there is every chance that everyone living in the United States at the present would be speaking either German or Japanese.

Either that, or we would be in the second or third generation of Americans being enslaved by either Hitler or Hirohito, working to achieve whatever those rulers so desired.

Ye editor gets frustrated at the three major TV networks, as well as the satellite networks of CNN and Fox News, for the reports they make on a daily basis which make it hard on those trying to manage the War on Terrorists to achieve their goals.

As one of my favorite columnists, the late Lewis Grizzard liked to say: "I don't believe I'd have told that!"

A few weeks ago, the television newscasters announced to the world that the constant patrolling of the air space around New York City and Washington, D.C. was being ended, to be replaced by just random flights at rare intervals.

For a number of weeks after the destruction of the World Trade Center, National Guardsmen were dispatched to many airports, to assist in the matter of airport security.

Some time later we heard a newscast proclaim that the Guardsmen were being dismissed from the airports, and in addition, the usual employees working on airport security would be replaced by government employees.

Why should we make announcements to the terrorists about these decisions?

I had made it a habit to watch the daily press briefings by Secretary of Defense Donald Rumsfeld, but I finally became so frustrated by the STUPID questions by some of the reporters that I try not to watch this segment anymore.

One day recently, a reporter asked Sec. Rumsfeld why he wouldn't answer a particular question, to which he replied "Because we don't want the entire world knowing what we know or don't know, and what we are planning to do next."

When the U.S. suffers casualties which may have been caused by our own forces, the newscasters have a field day. Home forces suffering casualties from "friendly fire" has existed all the way back to the Revolutionary War, and probably before that.

The only thing was, there wasn't a reporter behind a tree or in the foxholes, anxious to tell the reporter's audience about how bad a job our forces were doing.

One distinguished military leader once proclaimed that "War is hell," pointing out that you can't write a script as to how everything is going to work out, and exactly how your opposing forces will react to your initiative.

I've always felt that the "big boys" of TV news report 'way too much in telling our country's enemies of certain weaknesses we might have in certain areas, complete with "how to," for those who might be contemplating the overthrow of the USA.

That was bad enough during the good times. The events of last September 11 should make such reckless broadcasts obsolete. But they still crop up. I don't know what reporters are thinking when they ask imprudent questions. Perhaps that's the trouble—they're not thinking about the possible consequences.

## Grand Jury Indicts Orozco in Shooting

The Parmer County Grand Jury on Tuesday, returned an indictment of aggravated assault against David Orozco, 19, in the shooting of Eric Rubio, 18, on Monday, March 18.

Parmer County Sheriff Randy Geries said the grand jury also increased Orozco's bond from \$40,000 to \$50,000. No explanation was given for the increase.

The aggravated assault charge is a 2nd degree felony that is punishable by a jail sentence of two and not more than twenty years, and a fine not to exceed \$10,000.

Geries said that Rubio remains in stable but critical

condition at Northwest Texas Hospital in Amarillo from the gunshot wound to the head, which is reported to have been a tragic result of horseplay among a group of teenagers partying at the rural residence.

In a related case, Geries said that Roxanne Mendoza, 31, of Friona received a sentence of 30 days in Parmer County jail and more than \$1,200 in fines for her role in supplying alcohol to the minors.

Geries said that Morgan Baize, 18, also charged with supplying alcohol to minors has retained an attorney and is free on a \$1,500 bond pending a court hearing in the case.

Orozco remained in Parmer County jail at press time.

## AHA Grant May Help To Restart Your Heart

Thanks to the American Heart Association, the Lazbuddie Fire Department and the Parmer County Sheriff's Department will soon

carry automated external defibrillators (AEDs) in their vehicles.

These life-saving devices are used to restart the heart

when a person suffers from sudden cardiac arrest.

The American Heart Association has awarded more

than \$800,000 in matching grants to help rural communities obtain the AEDs. Each AED unit costs about \$2,000.

The Lazbuddie firemen will receive two units and the sheriff's department will receive five AEDs.

"In rural areas, often the sheriff's deputy or fire department volunteers arrive on the scene critical minutes before the ambulance gets there. In many cases, having an AED onboard these first-responder vehicles means that a cardiac arrest victim will get the shock needed to restart their heart within the first couple of minutes of collapse. In some remote areas of Texas, the ambulance response time can be much longer," says David Loose-Mitchell, Ph. D., president of the American Heart Association Texas Affiliate.

The grant award requires each agency to purchase their AEDs within 90 days of the award. Except for a few agencies where training will be needed, the AEDs can be put to use within 24 hours of delivery.

## EMT Class Is Scheduled In Friona

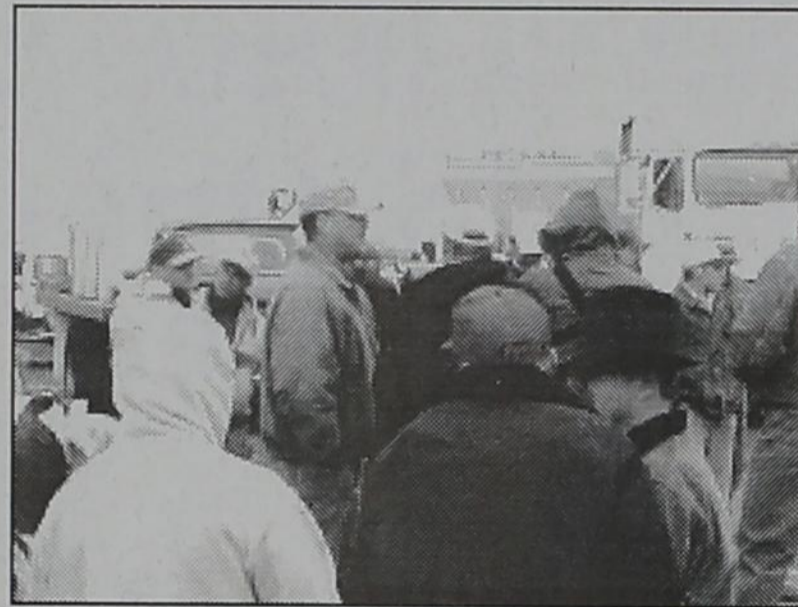

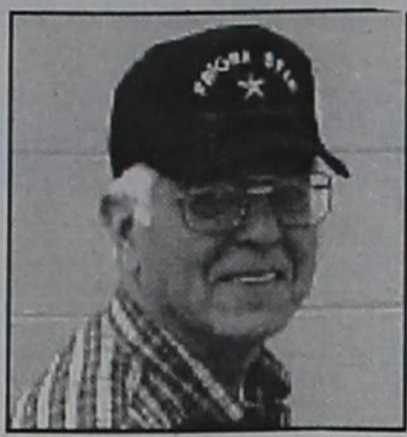

"Saints & Martyrs Are Big This Year"

A shrine erected in honor of a martyr is called a martyr.

A martyrology is a catalog of Roman Catholic martyrs and saints arranged by the dates of their feasts, or an ecclesiastical history treating the lives and sufferings of martyrs.

A martyrologist is a writer of or a specialist in martyrology.

So for the next few seconds, call me a martyrologist 'cause I want to talk about this martyr thing that America seems to be so scared of.

A martyr is not always a saint, and saints sure ain't always martyrs. A saint is said to be one officially recognized through canon-

ization as a preeminent for holiness.

In other words, to be a saint, you pretty much have to perform a miracle or two, or at least do something that people believe to be miraculous.

In the first place, by definition, martyr is singular. A martyr is one person that millions of people are supposed to remember throughout history. Like Joan of Arc or Pancho Villa.

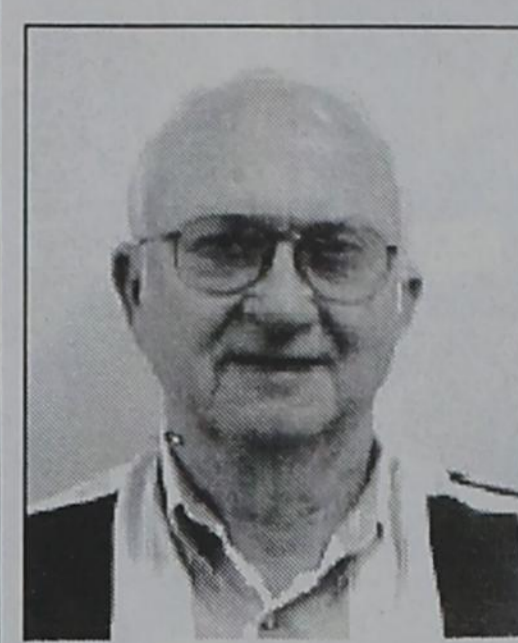

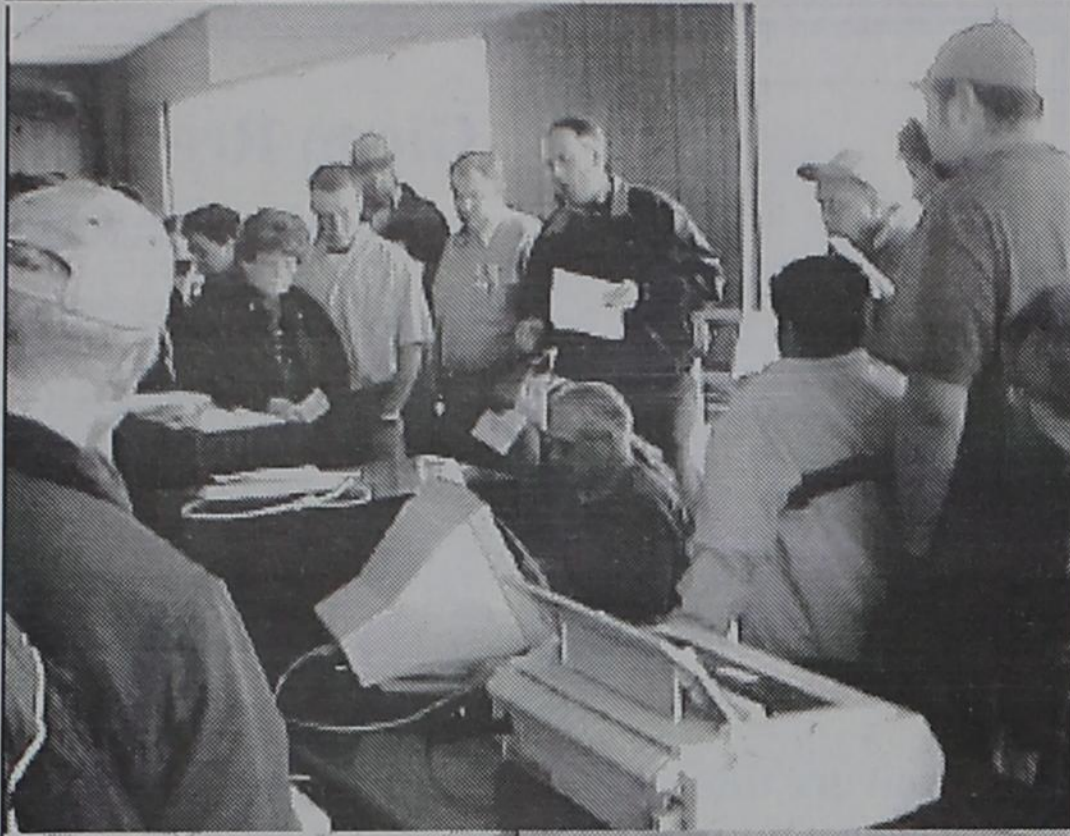

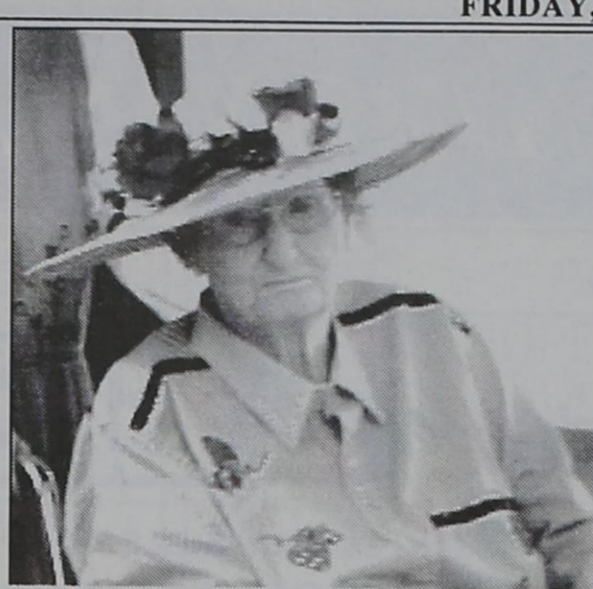

## Bovina Woman Writes Novel About Trials, Tribulations In West Texas

As a full-time farmer's wife and mother of three little girls, Elisabeth Schilling, better known as Lisa, doesn't have much time to spare.

Regardless, in the wee hours of the morning during the past two years, she crafted a novel that told of a family's trials and tribulations in a small town in west Texas and succeeded in having it published.

The publication of a first book is no small feat, as anyone who has tried to break into the publishing world knows.

"I thought what you did was you wrote a book and you sent it off and you got it published and you live happily ever after," Schilling said. "I didn't know what all you had to do to go through all of this. It's been an experience."

The trials that Schilling faced were nothing compared to the characters in "Forever Avenley," her novel that encompasses the family saga of the Lawrences, a proud passionate family in a small west Texas town rocked by tragedy, tested by misfortune, and blessed with the character and strength to overcome.

"I have always wanted to write a book," Schilling said. "I don't know what hit me, but one day I just sat down and decided I was going to do it. I was up very late every night and then the next day I would wake up and take care of the kids and then start again once they were in bed."

Schilling said she lived in an imaginary world every night for about nine months.

"I almost forgot while I was writing it that these characters weren't real," she said. "As the people became real to me I could picture them in my head just as if I had met them. I could almost feel what that person would say or what they would do because it was honest-to-goodness like it was when I would play with my Barbies when I was little. My husband thought it was the strangest thing. I would tell him things that were happening in the story, and he would be telling me, 'It's not real, Lisa.'"

After she finished writing the book, Schilling said that she spent another nine months combing through it, reformatting it and getting it ready to send to publishers.

That was where the real challenge came.

"I sent out I don't know how many manuscripts," she said. "A lot of them didn't even read it. They just said, 'We're sorry but we have more than we can read as it is and you're a nobody.' I was a first-timer and no one wanted to take a chance."

Schilling said the publishers wanted a sure bet. She talked to agents, and they would say, "Well, you need to have a book published before you get an agent."

Then she would talk to publishers, and they would tell her, "Well, you kind of need an agent before you can get a publisher."

Schilling said she felt like she had hit a brick wall. At

that point, she said she had just about given up.

Then one day while on the computer at home, she came across PublishAmerica.com and asked herself, "Why not?"

Schilling e-mailed them a synopsis of her book, and a month later, they e-mailed back requesting a manuscript. She sent it in and waited another three months before they e-mailed back and told her that it had been accepted.

"When I read that e-mail, I just about fell through the floor," she said.

But the work wasn't over. The first time around, a lot of the promotion for the book is up to the author, Schilling said.

Meanwhile, she has been waiting for the reprint of the book after she made some fine tuning, and then she plans to send it to media outlets such as Barnes and Noble, Hastings, and even Oprah.

Schilling also contacted the *Washington Post* to see if they would review her book.

"As soon as the reprint is finished, they have granted me permission to send a copy of my book to them," she said. "You can't just send it. It has to go through the proper channels."

They have granted me permission to send it to them for a review, and that's really scary because if they don't

like it, they'll print that, too. But you've got to do it."

"I have had a few friends order it and read it, and you can't imagine how scary that is," she said. "All of your insecurities come out because you think: Is it all right? Am I awful? It's the neatest thing that has ever happened to me, and it's also the most frightening. It's like putting yourself out on the chopping block because there are going to be people who love it, and there are going to be people who hate it. You've got to kind of get thick-skinned."

Schilling, formerly Lisa Osborn, was born and raised in Clovis, New Mexico and now lives four miles south of Bovina with her husband, Todd, and three daughters, Olivia, Gabrielle and Mallory. She attended Zia Elementary and Yucca Junior High and was a Wildcaddette at Clovis High before she graduated in 1987.

Golf coaches Bryan Jones and Bruce Scroggins were pleased with the progress of this year's golf teams.

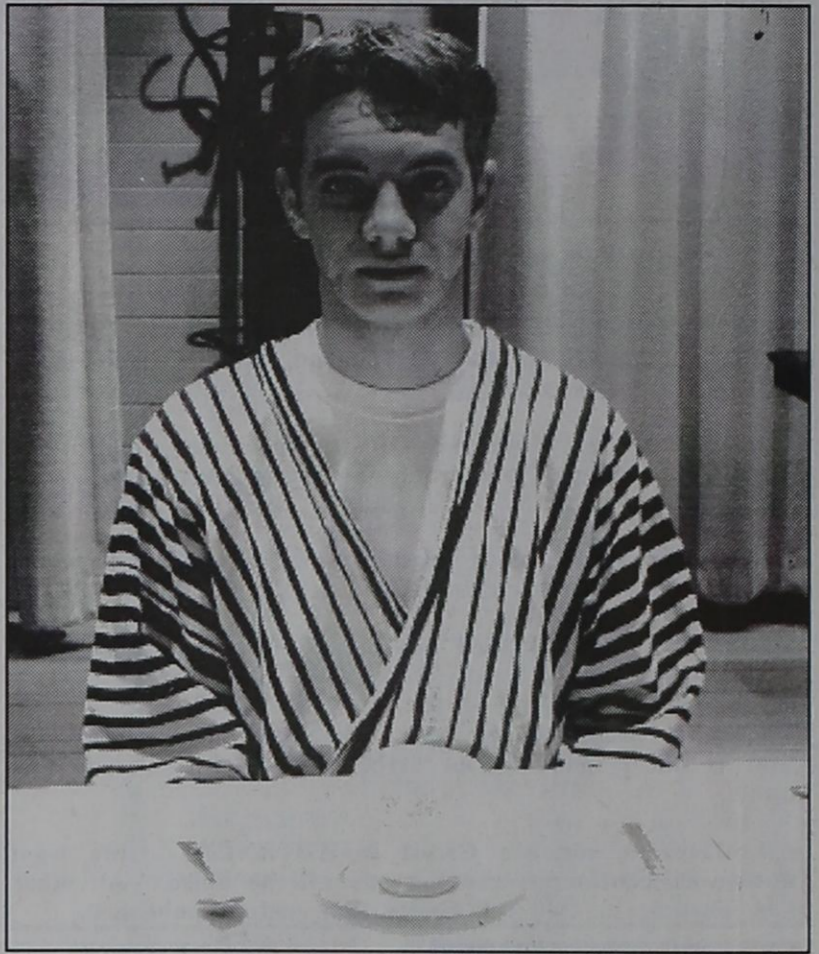
The girls placed 4th in the district golf meet held in Farwell. The team shot a 463.

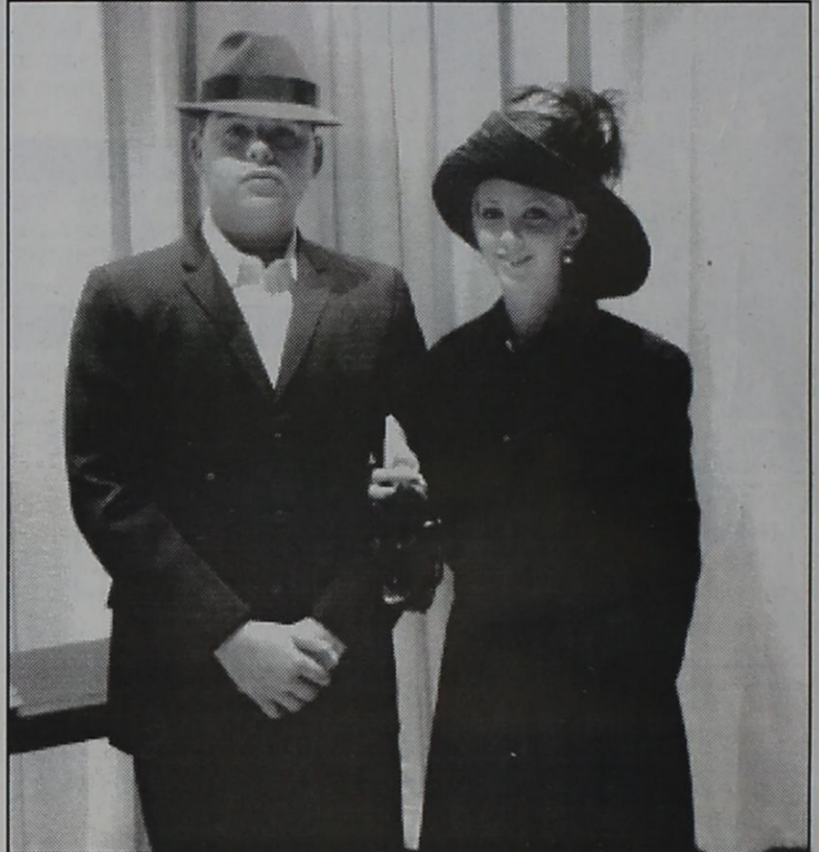
In the boys district match, played at Colonial in Clovis, they finished 6th.

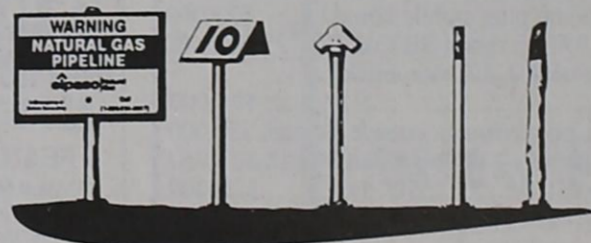
