Sewer Bonds, Sales Tax Pass By Wide Margin Here

City of Goldthwaite voters went to the polls last Saturday and voted for both propositions on the ballots, the sewer bond

issue and the 1 per cent City Sales Tax, in a good turn-out of voters.

The sewer bond issue, carried by a wide 156-80 vote. The \$150,000 bond issue will be used to construct a new sewer plant and a large extension to the present Goldthwaite sewer network.

The sales tax proposition carried by over a 2 to 1 margin. Actual vote was 171 for and 81 against. Persons shopping in the city will start paying the penny tax as soon as the State Comptroller gets the city on his records in Austin. This usually takes between 60 and 90 days. Local merchants will be notified by the Comptroller when to start collecting the additional tax. Then it will be another three months before the City will realize any money from the sales tax. This date will probably be around January 1 of next year before a check is received.

City Manager W. C. Barnett praised the citizens of Goldthwaite for a fine turnout at the polls Saturday and for the citizens' reaction to the urgent needs of the city government. The City Council will meet in special session Monday night to officially canvass the votes.

The All-Star games are planned for Thursday, July 20, Friday, July 21, and Saturday, July 22, nights.

Hunt and Bufo will be participating in the basketball tilt which will be played at 8:30 p. m. July 20 in Brownwood Coliseum.

Beard and Smith will be among the players in the six-man football contest which is on tap at 8 p. m. July 21 in Lion Stadium.

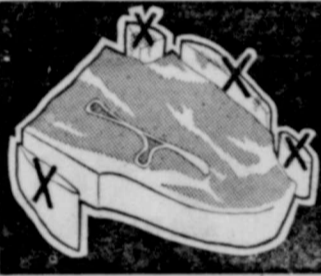

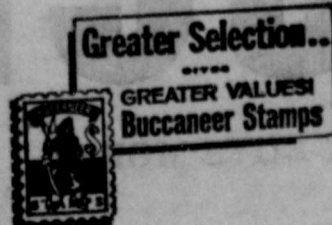
