# Doings by

BY LARRY DANIEL COUNTY AGENT



The Mills County 4-H Horse Club will meet at 9:00 p.m. Monday, August 14 at the show barn in Goldthwaite. All members and interested boys and girls are encouraged to attend.

An alarming fact: Since January of this year Mills County has recorded a total of 77 cases of confirmed screwworms. This figure is actually greater than the total number of all cases for a 10 year span. This figure will go even higher. If every producer does not begin an intensive fight against the screwworm on his own livestock the screwworm can reach numbers as high as those 15 years ago. Inspect animals closely, collect samples of worms and mail in, treat all wounds, and wait if possible until cool weather for castration, dehorning, etc.

Spraying application for the pecan weevil or "red head" should be made around the 12 to 15 of August. The best way to determine actual spraying family, the Lelland Meyer famshould be made by placing a sheet under limbs and jarring the limbs with a pole. When 3 or more weevils are found per tree, a spray application should be made. Sevin is the recommended spray for the weevil.

The hickory shuckworm frequently causes severe injury to pecans. In late summer and in early fall, shucks are tunneled out. As a result, nuts are slower to mature and kernels do not develop properly. Shucks stick to the nuts and fail to open, thus increasing harvesting difficulty. Chemical control should begin in mid August or as shells har-



Anaplasmosis, an infectious blood disease of cattle, takes a toll in animal lives and in beef and milk production which is difficult to measure. Symptoms are high temperature, heart beat doubled, labored breathing, 75 per cent red blood cells destroyed, and sudden drop in temperature below normal before death. Transmission of the disease is mainly by insects such as ticks, etc., however, cows can transmit the disease to their young before birth, but not by contact or through feces or urine. Drugs in the tetracycline group (Aureomycin and Terramycin) will prevent animals from becoming infected when fed at the level of 0.5 grams per 1,000 pounds of body weight continuously through the heavy insect season.

Any person within this state engaged in the business or producing, or causing to be pro-duced pecans for commercial purposes in the amounts of 300 pounds or more total over the last three years is eligible to vote, including owner of farms and their tenants and sharecroppers, if such person would be required to pay the assess-ment proposed.

Any person qualified to vote at the referendum may place his name in nomination for his name in nomination for membership on the proposed pecan producers board by application to the above organization signed by himself and at least ten other persons eligible to vote in the referendum. Such applications must be filed at least 30 days prior to the election date.

Any person qualified to vote who does not receive a ballot may obtain one at his local County Agent's office.

## Texas Court Revision Proposal To | Program Prepared For Central Texas | It's A Girl Be Submitted To Legislature Soon By Alcohol Safety Action Project

A proposal for the first complete modernization of the Texas court system in 96 years will be submitted to the state legislature next January.

The heart of the modernization plan is a new judiciary article to replace present Article V of the state constitution.

The new article was drafted by the Chief Justice's Task Force for Court Improvement, headed by Robert W. Calvert, Chief Justice of the Texas Supreme Court.

The plan is designed to improve the quality of justice in Texas courts and permit cases to be handled more quickly and efficiently. All present judges and other personnel would be absorbed into the new system, and no increase in the number of courts or judges would be re-

"This proposal will benefit every county in the state," Calvert said. "For example, it will give every country the advantages now enjoyed only by the 26 counties that have county courts at law."

In the more populous counties in Texas, the legislature has created county courts at law, which are staffed by fudges who ler counties, however, all county-level cases must be heard by the county judge, who in most also has administrative duties as head of the county commissioners court.

The Task Force's proposal calls for a statewide system of county-level courts staffed by

fulltime lawyer-judges. Each incumbent county judge who is not a lawyer would continue to preside over the county commissioners and would devote full time to his administrative responsibilities as head of the ties government. Under the proposed new judiciary article, the present courts of civil appeals would be renamed courts of appeals, and would be permitted to hear criminal as well as civil cases. In all except the most important cases. the decision of the court of appeals would be final.

The Court of Criminal Appeals would be merged with the Supreme Court to create a single court of last resort for important cases, whether civil or criminal. 'he goal is to streamline the appeals process by reducing multiple appeals and de-

held it first class of the Alcohol Information for Drivers (A.I.D.) Course Monday, July 24, at the

An agency of the Central Texas Council of Governments, (CTCOG), CTASAP is one of 4 such projects in Texas - others are in Houston, Dallas and San Antonio - and numerous ones across the country that spearhead the alcohol-traffic safety efforts of the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, United States Department of Transportation.

The purpose of the A. I. D. Course is to provide a supplementary method of reducing alcohol-related traffic offenses by re-educating convicted offenders and motivating them to avoid future DWI offenses. The course will consist of a series of four two-hour classes held on successive Monday evenings with each class covering a different aspect of the drinking and driving problem.

The re-education will endeavor to make the participants aware of the magnitude of alcohol-related offenses by demonstrating the impairment in perception, judgment, and emotional control caused by the excessive consumption of alcohol. Participants are helped to identify their specific drinking/ driving problems and are en-

the day the accused DWI offender is scheduled to appear before the court. Prior to talking to the Judge, the defendant is interviewed by a county prosecutor and a CTASAP probation officer. Based on material gained from this interview and any past records the defendant may have, the probation officer makes recommendations to the Judge concerning possible probation conditions. If the probation officer believes that the defendant would be receptive to the re-educative material presented at the school and would be likely to re-orient his driving habits to avoid driving while drinking, the A. I. D. Course is suggested as a condition of pro-

If, after studying these recommendations, the judge decides to make the school a probation condition, the defendant is assigned to a particular session of the A. I. D. Course.

In addition to the new signs, there are major adjustments in superimposed red circle and the use of color lines for pavement markings.

Yellow lines will be the only color used for centerline markings on two-way roads and white will remain on multiplelane highways - for separating traffic flows in the same direc-

A broken yellow centerline will mark the division of the road where passing is permitted. A solid yellow line to the right will mean no passing is allowed for traffic in that lane. Double solid yellow lines will denote areas where no passing is permitted by traffic traveling in either direction. double yellow lines will mark the centerline of multilane di-
