Mrs. Merle Claborn, organist, played traditional wedding music and accompanied Mrs. Jimmy Ethridge, sister-in-law of the bride, and Miss Cathy Linebarger of Leander who sang "Let It Be Me."

A white net draped arch with suspended wedding bells and garlanded daisies centered the altar. Beneath the arch a bouquet of yellow and white gladiolus, chrysanthemums, and daisies was placed upon the pulpit. 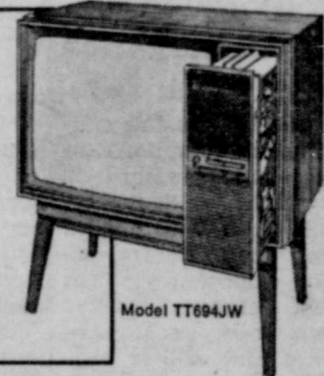

The pecan industry in Texas has become a very valuable and important part of the economy of the state. Much publicity has been provided for the Pecan Growers Referendum set for later this year. In an effort to ex-

plain the referendum and other phases of pecan work, an educational meeting has been set for Friday, August 25 at 10:00 a.m. in the Lower Colorado River Authority Auditorium in San Saba.

A leading member of the Texas Pecan Growers Association from this area will be on hand to introduce the program and explain the referendum. Dr. William E. Black, Economist-Marketing, Texas Agricultural Extension Service, will discuss the nature of the check-off with a slide presentation. Dr. Benton Storey, Secretary-Treasurer of the Texas Pecan Growers Association will explain a few areas of urgent need in research, education and promotion where the Pecan Board might reasonably be expected to spend their funds.

Dr. Arlie Powell or Blufford G. Hancock will be present to discuss pecan orchard management problems with growers. The entire meeting should be less than 2 hours in length.

All pecan producers and interested persons are invited to attend the meeting.
