Next Tuesday, Nov. 6th Is General Election Day

The General Election will take place in Mills County next week Tuesday, November 7.

Polls will be open at 8 a.m. and will remain open until 7 p.m.

Mills County voters will cast their ballots in the ten (10) voting boxes. This includes the absentee voting box.

Since this is a presidential election year, a record number of voters are expected to turn out for the election Tuesday.

The ballot for Mills County this year contains five columns with the first column listing the offices and the others in the following order: Democratic Party, Republican Party, Raza Unida Party, Socialist Workers Party, and Write-In.

In addition to the columns for political parties and write-ins, the ballot also contains 14 proposed constitutional amendments to be voted on.

The Democratic Party has a full list of candidates for all offices to be filled from president down to the precinct level.

Republican Party column has candidates for the offices of president and vice-president, U. S. Senator, governor, state treasurer, and railroad commissioner.

The Raza Unida Party column has candidates for U. S. Senator, governor, lieutenant governor, state treasurer, and railroad commissioner.

Socialist Workers Party col-

umn contains candidates for president and vice-president, United States Senator, governor, lieutenant governor, attorney general, comptroller of public

accounts, and commissioner of general land office.

The amendments are listed on a sample ballot on Page 2.

G'waite Homecoming Game Upset By Glen Rose 7 To 6 Friday Night

The Goldthwaite Eagles were short one point for a tie game with favored Glen Rose on Eagle Field last Friday night. The Homecoming game ended in the Tigers' favor 7 to 6 with the Eagles nearing the goal line when time ran out.

Glen Rose now stands with a 2-0 lead in the 11-A district contest with Goldthwaite now two games out.

The Eagle-Tiger game turned out to be a defensive battle with neither team scoring in the first and third quarters.

Glen Rose put their seven

points on the scoreboard late in the second quarter when Tommy Thompson, halfback, scored from the one yard line. Ricky Williams kicked what ended up to be the winning point.

Early in the fourth quarter defensive player, Robin Reid, intercepted a Tiger screen pass and ran it back sixty-five yards for the only Eagle touchdown. The warbirds, trying hard for a two point running play, were stopped short of the goal line.

The Eagle defense proved to be too powerful for the Tigers with Lee Browning and Andy Cook covering two of Glen Rose's fumbles.

Larry Elliott, GHS fullback, was the lead ground gainer for Goldthwaite, carrying the ball eighteen times for a total of ninety-eight yards.

Coach Johnson reported that he was proud of the way his team played even though they had a few bad plays and missed some good passes. After seeing the film, he stated that the Eagles out-played Glen Rose all over the field and he had never seen the Eagle offense and defense so aggressive.

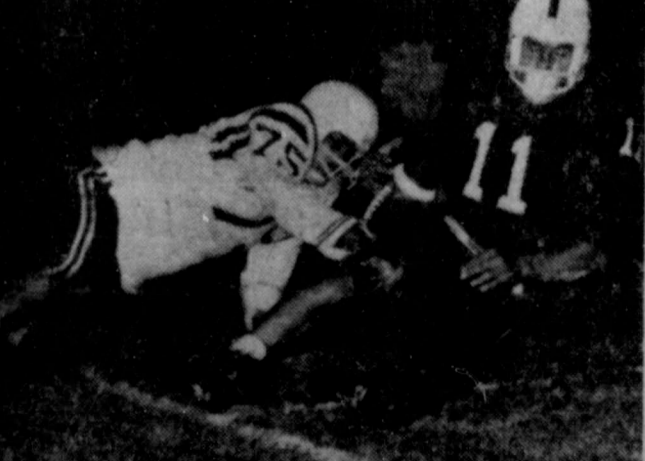

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

1. AGAINST The constitutional amendment to provide annual salaries of \$8,400 for members of the Senate & House of Representatives
- No. FOR
2. AGAINST The constitutional amendment abolishing the Lamar County Hospital District.
- No. FOR
3. AGAINST The constitutional amendment to require the commissioners court in all counties of the state to compensate all justices of the peace on a salary basis.
- No. FOR
4. AGAINST The constitutional amendment providing for a constitutional revision commission which precedes the convening of the members of the 63rd Legislature as a constitutional convention in January, 1974, for the purpose of submitting to the voters a new constitution or revisions of the existing state constitution.
- No. FOR
5. AGAINST The constitutional amendment allowing certain tax exemptions to disabled veterans, their surviving spouses and surviving minor children, and the surviving spouses and surviving minor children of members of the armed forces who lose their life while on active duty.

'72 Screwworm Outbreak Heavy During October

MISSION — "If reporting of screwworm cases is anywhere near normal, we believe that the second and third week of October will be the heaviest infestation period of the 1972 screwworm outbreak."

This word comes from Dr. M. E. Meadows, Jr., who is in charge of the Screwworm Eradication Center at Mission.

"In five of the past 10 years, more cases were confirmed in October than in any other month of the year. With the exception of 1962—the initial year of the eradication program—in every year when more than 400 cases were confirmed, October has been the worst month," Meadows said.

A gradual reduction in case numbers should begin after the third week of October, he replied.

"Based on the history of the eradication program, we had anticipated that September and October would be the heaviest months of screwworm infestation. However, it appears that September will show less confirmed cases than August, based of course on fewer overall samples received," the Eradication Program director said.

This situation, however, is believed to reflect the generally poor reporting of cases by the livestock industry, rather than representing a reduction in actual cases, he added.

"We do believe that a significant drop in cases has occurred in the overwintering area, where the sterile fly release rate has been increased to 3,200 per square mile," Meadows said.

Additionally, he pointed out that the increased fly drop in this area and the onset of cold weather north of the drop area could result in rapid case reductions during mid-November and thereafter.

Now is the time to treat fruit trees for the borer insect which causes much damage to trees each year. Trees should be treated between October 20 and November 15 when the soil is dry and soil temperature is 55 degrees F. or above. Remove the weeds, loosen and level soil about 1 foot from the tree trunk. Then place Paradichlorobenzene crystals (moth balls) in a narrow circular band, preferably in a groove about 2 inches from the trunk.

Then place several shovels of clean soil over the crystals and mound the earth into a cone-shaped pile about 6 inches high around the base of the tree. Avoid pushing any of the material against the tree, since the crystals can cause injury to the tree if touching it. Compact the soil. Be sure to remove the earth mounds in early spring.

The amount of crystals to use is 1/2 ounce to 1 ounce on mature trees. Also for better percentage of control, the tree trunk should be sprayed in early June and in mid-August with Dieldrin spray.

Any livestock producers in Mills County that is having predator problems should contact my office. A government trapper has been hired by the Mills County Program Building Committee and is available to livestock producers throughout Mills County. No charge is made to the producer except on a donation basis once a year in December.

VOTE ON NOVEMBER 7

The Constitutional Amendments are very important to the citizens of Texas. After careful study, we the Board of Directors of the San Saba County Property Owners Association, submit the following explanations of each amendment and our decision as the best way to vote:

Proposed Constitutional Amendments

AMENDMENT NO. 1 FOR

Reason: Basically the position of a legislator is a full time job. An increase in salary would have a tendency to free them from becoming obligated to lobbyist.

AMENDMENT NO. 2 FOR

Reason: This is a local matter for Lamar County, and since they seem to want it we would vote for it. It does not affect anyone else except Lamar County.

AMENDMENT NO. 3 FOR

Reason: Fines should not be for the purpose of raising money for Government operation. This amendment would remove any personal interest in the case from the Justice of Peace.

AMENDMENT NO. 4 AGAINST

Reason: We are not sure the constitution needs rewriting. It seems to be mainly the big city people who want the constitution re-written. Rural people will be out numbered in the legislature when it is re-written, also when it is submitted to the people for a vote. It is probably to the rural peoples advantage to leave it as it is.

AMENDMENT NO. 5 FOR

Reasons: The exemptions granted the disabled veterans seem to be reasonable.

AMENDMENT NO. 6 FOR

Reason: This amendment permits the local political subdivision to determine whether this should or should not be done on a local basis.

AMENDMENT NO. 7 AGAINST

Reason: We feel there is danger that this amendment would create innumerable problems and complications concerning our property rights under the community property laws of our state.

AMENDMENT NO. 8 AGAINST

Reason: Since there is no limitation on the number of terms the governor serves, two four years terms would allow the governor to dominate all state boards and commissions.

AMENDMENT NO. 9 FOR

Reason: This amendment would exempt soil and water conservation districts from the constitutional ban on dual office holding and make available more people to occupy these positions and will not create any conflict of interest.

AMENDMENT NO. 10 AGAINST

Reason: We are opposed to this amendment because of lack of publication of the entire amendment. It only requires a brief statement of the amendment to be published rather than the amendment in its entirety. We feel that the public will be better informed by the amendment continuing to be published in full.

AMENDMENT NO. 11 AGAINST

Reason: The Lt. Governor and Speaker of the House are furnished quarters in addition to present salary, and we feel the proposed increase is excessive.

AMENDMENT NO. 12 FOR

Reason: Similar to number nine, this amendment makes available more people to occupy these positions and will not create any conflict of interest.

AMENDMENT NO. 13 FOR

Reason: It is necessary to be able to compete in the bond market.

AMENDMENT NO. 14 AGAINST

Reason: We feel that this amendment, if adopted, would soon deplete the permanent school fund. We feel it is in the interest of the schools that only the income from this fund be distributed.

We strongly urge other county organizations be formed and join us in the effort.
