County Schools To Dismiss For Holiday Vacation

Students in the four Mills Co. schools will begin observing Christmas Holidays this week. Goldthwaite will begin the holiday vacation Friday afternoon at 3 p.m. and will resume classes on January 3rd. The teachers will have an in-service workday on January 2nd.

Mills County Receives \$20,005 In Revenue Sharing

Mills County was richer by \$20,005 this week as a result of the recently passed Revenue Sharing bill by the Congress of the United States.

The \$20,005 amount represents the County's portion of a five-year program which was signed into law by President Nixon on October 20.

A few "strings" are attached to the expenditure of revenue sharing funds. State governments may expend their revenue sharing payments for any lawful purpose. Units of local governments have discretion to expend their payments on broad categories of priority expenditures described in the Act and on any lawful ordinary and necessary capital expenditure.

However, neither a State nor a unit of local government may

use any portion of its revenue sharing payments to match funds for any federal program, nor use any portion in an activity or program which discriminates on the basis of race, color, national origin or sex.

All recipient governments are required to publish reports of how their revenue sharing funds were used. Existing regulations require that such reports be published on or before March 1, 1974, for the use of the first entitlement check. Simplified reporting forms are being developed by the Office of Revenue Sharing for the 'end use' report required.

The City of Goldthwaite reportedly received funds through this same program but the City Manager was unavailable to report the exact amount.

City Sales Tax Begins Jan. 1

Beginning January 1, 1973, the one per cent city sales and use tax will become effective. All items that are state taxable will also be city taxable. Goldthwaite Merchants will receive a combined state and city quarterly report that they will complete and return to the Comptroller of Public Accounts in Austin. The Comptroller will return the 1 per cent City Sales Tax money to the City.

The 1 per cent City Sales Tax proposition was passed by local voters in an election held in July of this year.

Before the Christmas tree is down, after Christmas sales will be inviting consumers to spend any money or credit they have left—so better be ready.

"Families can save between 15 and 25 per cent on purchases at these sales if they buy wisely by planning, judging and comparing."

"Nothing is a bargain unless you need it and can use it."

"Being an effective sales shopper requires a plan—a plan that gives shopping a purpose. It helps the consumer easily recognize items that meet a need and items with just 'eye appeal'."

"Shoppers should know three things about sale items in order to judge and compare—the original price of the item, store policies on sales and why the item is on sale."

"Year-end sales enable retailers to reduce inventory before having to report it on income tax forms. The less inventory they have, the less time and money they spend taking inventory."

However, the shopper should

look for words and phrases that signal other reasons for sales—words such as "irregulars, imperfect, manufacturer's seconds, comparable value and limited supply."

"The only way to judge an item for its ability to meet a family need is to inspect it carefully for condition, construction and performance, and read labels, warranties or guarantees if they're provided."

"Also, consider shopping at both the start and close of a big sale."

"Best selection is most likely available the first day, but you may find further price reductions the last day."

Turning to often-ignored factors in sales shopping, consumers should consider other costs of the sale item, apart from the price itself.

"Time, effort and money spent getting to the store—or credit used to make sales purchases—may offset some of the price reduction."

"Shopping at sales tempts the consumer to buy without thinking so plan, judge and compare before buying."

The dance will be open to all young people in Mills County as well as out of town young people. College students are also welcome.

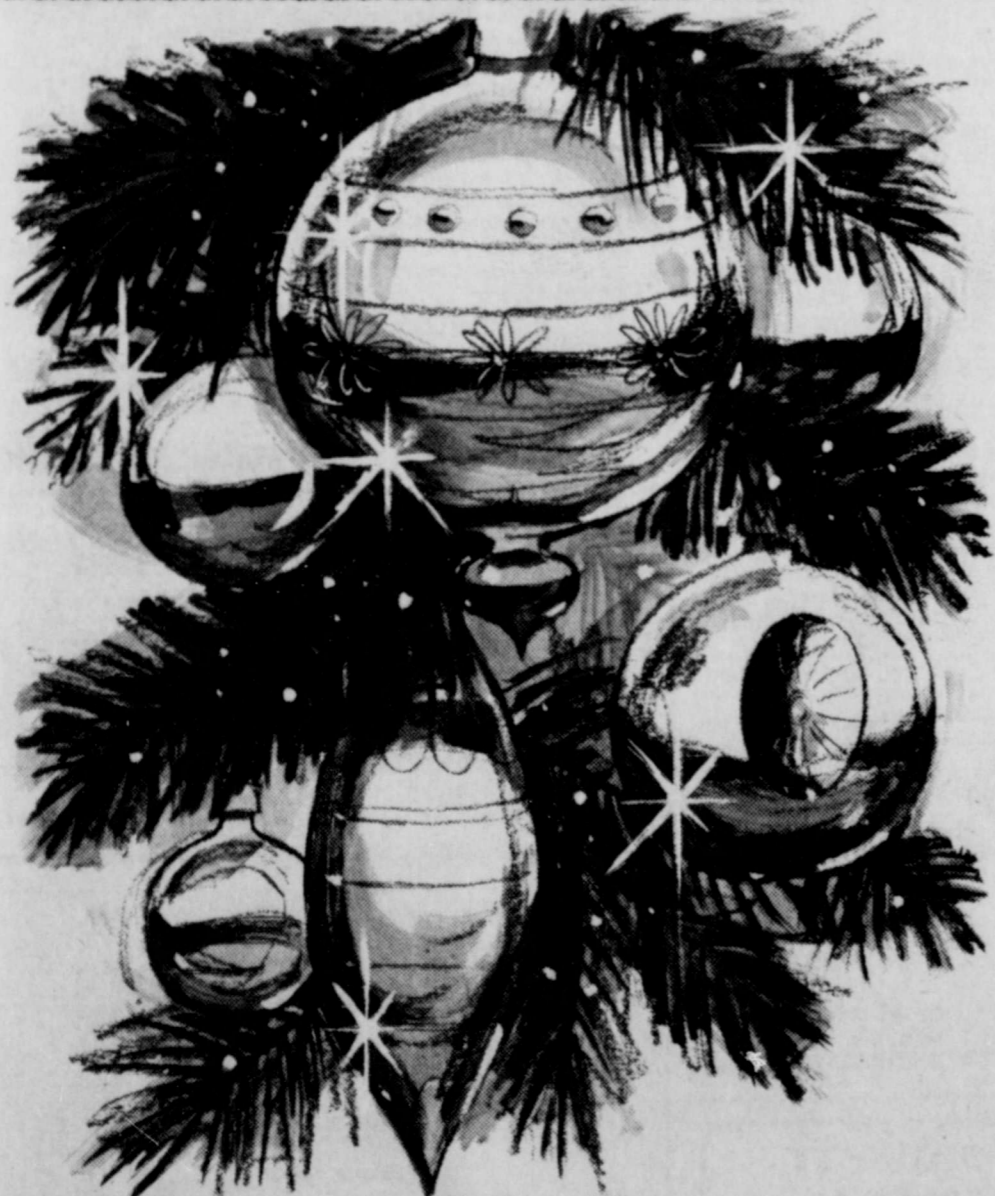
Admission will be charged. The dance will be properly chaperoned.

Santa Claus will be present to give packages to the little children, according to announcement by Rev. Martin L. Emert, pastor of the church.

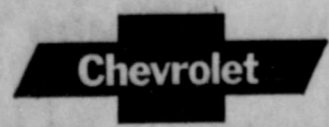

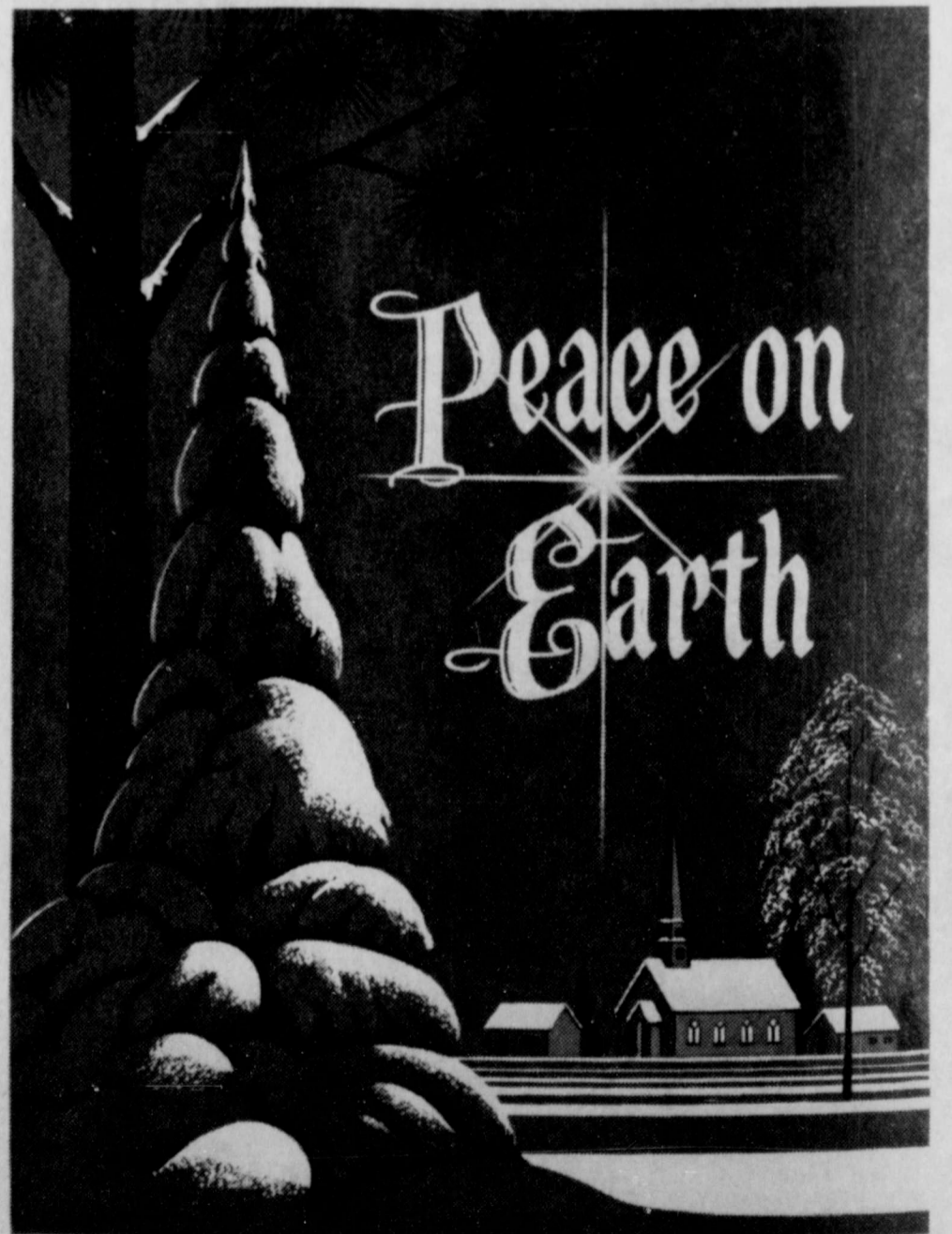
Bill Laughlin Presented In Recital
