# \$14,049.40 Paid At Livestock Show Sale

Mills County Livestock Boosters paid approximately twice the premium that they did last year for the sale of animals at the auction of livestock following the 35th Annual Livestock Show.

The auction held last Saturday evening following the 2-day livestock show gave Mills County 4-H and FFA boys and girls a chance to sell their animals.

Stock show boosters were present at the auction from all around—Goldthwaite, Lampasas, Priddy, Mullin, Lometa, San Saba and Hamilton.

The 119 animals sold brought a total of \$14,049.40.

1972 sales total was just over \$7,400.

According to Layton Black, chairman of the committee, it was a very good sale with tremendous response from the buyers.

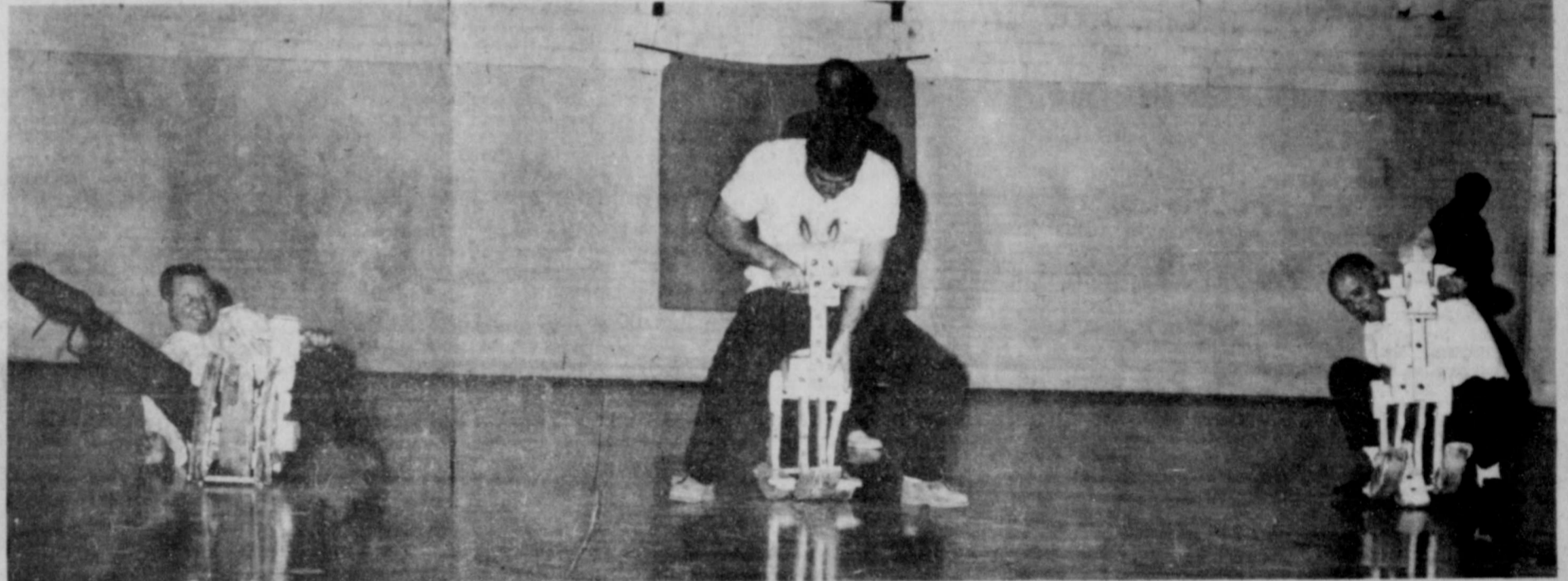

## Mohair Council Meeting Reset For January 31

The annual membership meeting of the Mohair Council of America has been rescheduled for 10 a.m. Wednesday, January 31, at the Hotel Cactus in San Angelo.

The meeting, one of the most important business sessions to be held by the Council this year, had to be rescheduled when the severe, icy weather kept a quorum of members from being present on the January 10 meeting date.

"It's absolutely essential that every mohair grower who possibly can attend this meeting so they can take part and help direct the Council's activities," said Noel Fry of Del Rio, Council president.

"The money being spent on advertising, promotion, publicity and new market development program is grower money," Fry declared. "Every grower should be interested in how his money is being used to help the mohair industry."

Fry said every grower that received a mohair incentive check in 1972 is a member of the council.

General business activities will include election of new directors and officers, approval of the 1973-74 budget, decision on a proposed by-law change, and special reports on current and future advertising, promotion and publicity programs and new market development work.

## Environmental Authorities Study Sheep Feedlots In County

Federal and State water pollution control engineers toured sheep feedlots in Mills County last week to study exemplary waste management practices in Texas Sheep Feedlot Industry. The information collected will be used by the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency as a basis for establishing later this year "effluent limitations and guidelines" and "national standards of performance for new sources," as required under the Federal Water Pollution Control Act Amendments of 1972, which were passed last October.

Government agency representatives present on the tour were as follows: Ozzie Linquist, Environmental Protection Agency; Dwight Pittman, Joe Morgan and Ray Janek of the Texas Water Quality Board; and Art Davenport, Hamito Sandard Division of United Aircraft (Windsor - Locks, Connecticut). EPA's contractor in charge of the study. Assisting with this fact-finding tour were Larry Daniel, Mills County Agent, and Dr.

John M. Sweeten, Agricultural Engineer - Animal Waste Management with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service in College Station. Frank Bridges, editor of Goldthwaite Eagle attended the tour also.

The group also visited several turkey feedlots in the Central Texas area.

Income Tax: What a way to start the new year. However, it comes around every year as sure as the sun shines and every

person needs to know as much as possible about income tax and record keeping.

A very informative and educational Income Tax and Record Keeping Workshop is planned for Thursday, January 25, 7 p.m. at the Mills County State Bank Meeting Room. The workshop is sponsored by the Extension Service with James Denton, Management Specialist, as speaker. Techniques of income tax preparations and filing will be covered in depth and record keeping procedures will be discussed.

The workshop will be free of charge to the public. There will be plenty of time for questions from the audience.

The use of animal feed containing DES (diethylstilbestrol) after January 1, 1973, constitutes a criminal act with the user liable to punishment as view by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA).

Farmers, ranchers, feedlot operators and those involved in the manufacture, sale or distribution of animal feeds are cautioned to dispose of feeds containing DES. Either burial or use as a fertilizer are the suggested means of disposal. Uses as fertilizer should involve shallow incorporation into the soil. The FDA will request premix manufacturers to recall all outstanding stocks of their product from the market place for supervised disposal.

The action was required under terms of certain sections of the Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act.

These terms as described contain the so-called Delaney clause and require that there be no detectable residue. Evidence that DES residue was present in the liver of steers 3, 5, and 7 days after the feeding of a single dose of the chemical was cited as requiring the withdrawal of approval for use even though there is no known public health hazard resulting from its use.

In announcing the ban in the August 4, 1972, issue of the Federal Register the FDA emphasized that the Commissioner has no reason to believe that the use of DES in animal feed represents a public health hazard and, farther more, that no human harm has been demonstrated in over 17 years of use. 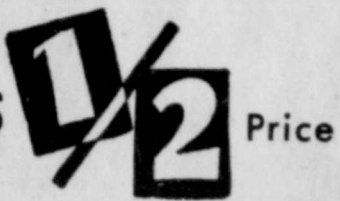

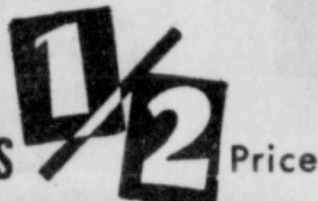
