Local School Classes Begin August 20th

Goldthwaite Public Schools will open their doors on August 20 for the 1973-74 school year. The first week will be in-service week for teachers.

The first day for students to attend classes will be on Monday, August 20.

It will be a regular school week with buses running and lunches being served.

Superintendent Gilbert Davis reminds parents that all students must have immunizations that are required by the state of

Texas. Shots required by the state are: Diphtheria-Tetanus - (Three shots); Measles (One shot); and Rubella (One shot). The student must have had one of these shots in the past ten years.

Supt. Davis also stated that students wishing to leave the school grounds to go home or elsewhere for lunch or for any other reason must have a written excuse from his parents or guardian. Students driving their own vehicles to school must also bring a written permit from their parents or guardian indicating that they may do so.

The cafeteria will have a good balanced meal each day for students. The menus will be checked by the Texas Education Agency.

KINDERGARTEN

A kindergarten program will be conducted in the Goldthwaite Public School system this year under the sponsorship of the Texas Education Agency.

The kindergarten program will be offered to children who will be attending the first grade during the 1974-75 school year.

The program will be conducted during the second semester of this school year each day - all day, according to Davis.

Regular Head Start program will be sponsored again this year for the first semester of school for children six years of age and under.

Parents wishing to enter their children in Head Start should contact Mrs. Cecil Campbell or Mrs. Herminio Coronado.

Band Pre-School Rehearsal Aug. 13

Goldthwaite High School band members will report to the band room Monday, August 13th, at 7 p.m. to begin a week of pre-school rehearsal.

Students who will use school-owned instruments should come at 6:30 to check out horns.

Attendance at each of the five, two-hour rehearsals is required for participation in band for the 1973-74 school year.

Food Stamp Program Starts Operation Here Oct. 1

The new statewide food stamp program will start operation Oct. 1 in Mills County.

This was announced today by Bluford Mauldin, State Department of Public Welfare.

"The statewide food stamp program will replace the commodity foods program currently operating in this county," explains Mr. Mauldin. "The statewide program was made possible when the 1972 Texas Legislature appropriated \$7.7 million for a state-administered, state-financed statewide food stamp program."

The State Department of Public Welfare will administer the new program and the United States Department of Agriculture will provide the food stamps and bonus stamps.

Eligible households pay a set amount for food stamps and are then given bonus stamps based on size of household and their total net income. Bonus stamps make up the difference between what a household can

pay for food and what is necessary for a nutritious diet.

Also, bonus stamps mean many dollars worth of new business for the community. Bonus stamps represent money that low-income households would not otherwise have to spend at local grocery stores.

A recent study of three rural food stamp communities showed that food stamps repre-

sented from five to ten percent of the total retail food sales.

Households are certified eligible for food stamps at the food stamp office or the local welfare office. Certified households will then receive Authorization to Purchase (ATP) cards in the mail which will tell them how many stamps they are eligible for and how much money, if any, they must pay for them.

The ATP card and the necessary cash are redeemable for food stamps at local post offices.

Participating grocers accept food stamps for the purchase of most foods and food products. Food stamps cannot be used to buy alcoholic beverages, tobacco and most imported items. Participation in the food stamp program is voluntary and does not prevent the household from receiving any other benefits for which the members might be eligible.

Food stamps increase the food purchasing power of low-income households. And food stamps are also good for the community's economy. Studies show that food stamps generate new economy and create new jobs. Certification for eligibility should begin in August. For further information about the food stamp program, contact the local welfare office.

Thurman Head To Receive 25 Year Pin

Thurman Head, Vocational Agriculture Teacher, Goldthwaite High School, will receive his 25 year tenure pin and will be honored by the Vocational Agriculture Teachers Association of Texas in San Antonio, Tex., July 31, 1973, according to Sid Long, Gail, President of the Organization.

Mr. Head is retiring this summer from public school teaching after serving 31 years in the public school; 25 years as a Vocational Agriculture Teacher.

Head graduated from Lometa High School and completed his college work at Tarleton State and Texas A&M University. Member of the Methodist Church where he has worked in the Young Adults Department, choir, and the Board of Trustees.

Other groups he has worked with and served as director for have been Hamilton REA, Texas Sheep and Goat Raisers Association and Vocational Agriculture Teachers Association of Texas.

Mr. Head is not retiring to fish all the time, but will be farming and ranching in the Goldthwaite Community.

The award will be presented at the Annual Awards Program of the Association. The Program is held during the statewide conference of Vocational Agriculture Teachers and the 1973 Conference will emphasize the implementation of new approaches to Vocational Agriculture Education. Leaders in agriculture and education from throughout the state and nation will participate in the four day in-service meeting.

Approximately 1500 Vocational Agriculture Teachers and friends are expected to attend the San Antonio Conference.

In the Consolation game, Dublin roused Bangs 18 to 10. Championship action saw Mills County put Copperas Cove down 6 to 4.

No Government Land Set Aside For 1974

In order to assure adequate supplies of farm commodities for domestic and export markets, the Secretary of Agriculture has announced that there will be no government set aside of land for 1974. The effect of this announcement will be to free farmers to go all out to produce feed grains, soybeans, wheat and cotton. This announcement will also permit farmers to begin making plans for 1974 crops.

In addition, the maintenance of an established conserving base will not be required as a condition of eligibility to receive price support or program payments. Producers with existing Crop-Land Adjustment Program Agreements which continue through 1974 and subsequent years will, at their option, have their opportunity to terminate such agreements.

This announcement has no effect on 1973 program participation. Set aside under the current year must be maintained in accordance with program participation agreements. Further program announcements are expected upon approval of pending farm legislation.

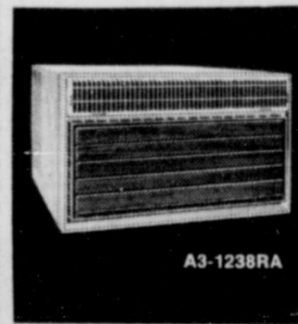

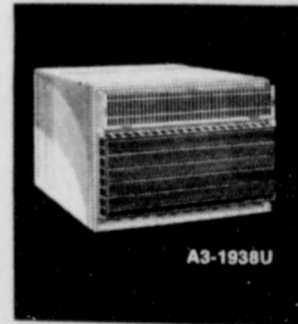

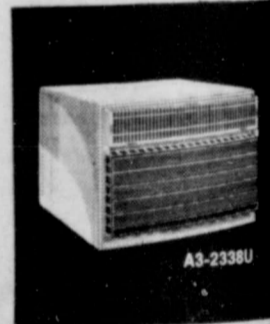

Different kinds of craft was worked at the work period and later was sold.

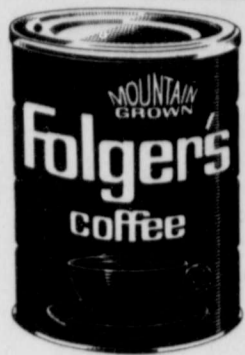

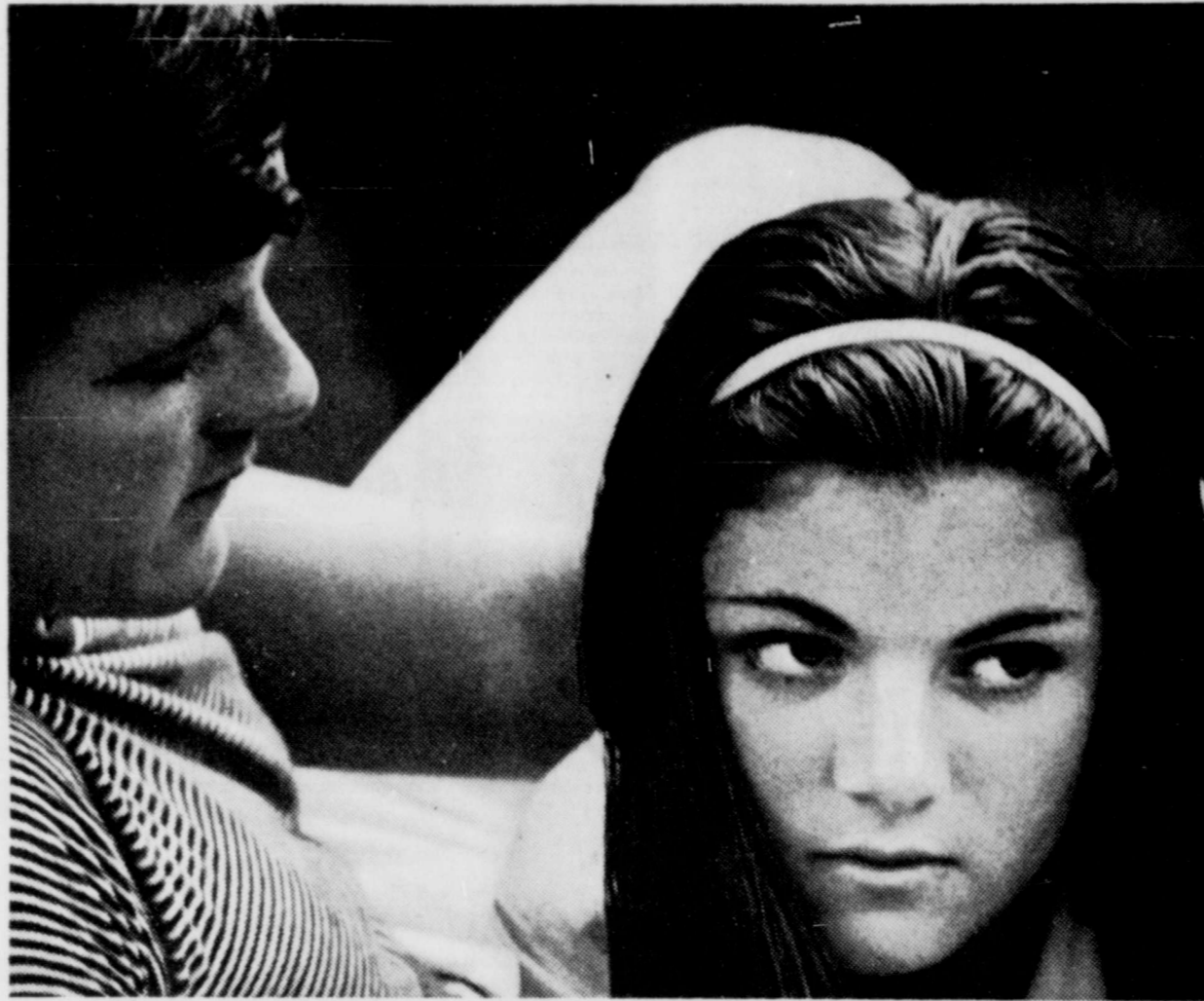
