Food Stamp Program Starts Operation Here Oct.

The new statewide food stamp program will start operation Oct. 1 in Mills County.

This was announced today by Bluford Mauldin, State Department of Public Welfare.

"The statewide food stamp program will replace the commodity foods program currently operating in this county," explains Mr. Mauldin. "The statewide program was made possible when the 1972 Texas Legislature appropriated \$7.7 million for a state-administered, statefinanced statewide food stamp program."

State Department of Public Welfare will administer the new program and the United States Department of Agriculture will provide the food stamps and bonus stamps.

Eligible set amount for food stamps and are then given bonus stamps based on size of household and their total net income. Bonus stamps make up the difference between what a household can pay for food and what is necessary

for a nutritious diet. Also, bonus stamps mean many dollars worth of new business for the community. Bonus stamps represent money that lowincome households would not otherwise have to spend at local grocery stores.

stamp office or the local welfare office. Certified households will then receive Authorization to Purchase (ATP) cards in the mail which will tell them how many stamps they are eligible for and how much money, if any, they must pay for them.

ATP card and the necessary cash are redeemable for food stamps at local post offices.

Participating grocers accept food stamps for the purchase of most foods and food products. Food stamps cannot be used to buy alcoholic beverages, bacco and most imported items.

Participation in the food stamp program is voluntary and does not prevent the household from receiving any other benefits for which the members might be eligible.

stamps increase the Food food purchasing power of low-income households. And food stamps are also good for the community's economy. Studies show that food stamps generate new economy and create new jobs. Certification for eligibility should begin in August. For further information about the food






