Janell Sherwood To Reign At Southwest Farm Show

Growing up on a ranch near Goldthwaite, Janell Sherwood likely daydreamed the dream of all little girls: to be a queen in a faraway castle.

Janell, now married and with a two-year-old son, never moved to that faraway land. She still lives on a ranch, not far from the one where she grew up. And she wouldn't trade it for any

But that other part of her dream - to become a queen did come true. And next month, March 8 to be exact, when she snips the ribbon to open a threeday run of the Southwest Farm Show in the Fort Worth Convention Center, she'll be observing the first anniversary of her crowning as the Texas Natural Fibers Fashion Queen

Janell won that title at the Southwest Farm Show in 1973. She was named winner in the Texas Natural Fibers Fashion Review in which she modeled the dress she had designed and sewed herself — a long navy and white plaid shirt dress made from 100 percent cotton.

This year, along with cutting the ribbon to open the show, Janell will be one of the judges deciding which young homemaker did the best job in sewing a garment using a fabric containing at least 50 percent one of the Texas natural

cotton, wool, or mohair.

Natural fibers are favorites of Janell, who was named Miss Mohair in 1965, "I always look for cotton and wool fabrics for my family," she says. Her hus-band Charles produces sheep and goats and Charolais cattle.

Janell was a member of the Future Homemakers of America chapter at Goldthwaite when she was in high school. Follow-ing graduation from Southern Methodist University in Dallas with degrees in English and Spanish, she returned to her hometown to teach languages and drama, and direct the choir and drill team. She is still an active member of the Mills County Young Homemakers Chapter.

Mrs. Charles (Janell) Sherwood won the Texas Natural Fibers Fashion Review in 1973 with this long all-cotton shirt dress. The young homemaker from Goldthwaite, will cut the ribbon opening the Southwest Farm Show to be held in the Fort Worth onvention Center March 8-9-10. Then she will be one of the judges selecting her successor in the Texas Natural Fibers Fashion Review, which is one of the attractions of the three-day Southwest Farm Show and Trac-






