Eagles Make 'Good Showing'

At First Scrimmage Of 1974

The Eagle varsity squad made good showing against the AA Junior Bulldogs at their first scrimmage this past Friday night. Even though the Eagles picked up only one touchdown while the Bulldogs four, the Eagles did not have a single turn over during the entire game.

"Considering that Burnet is probably one of the biggest and better teams the Eagles will be against this season, the boys did a pretty good job of holding their own," commented head coach Gene Auldridge.

"During the first half the boys played a vigorous game, but became a little tired the latter part of the scrimmage. This is probably due to the fact that Burnet had 35 boys to our fifteen."

Guamero Siller performed a good job as back during the scrimmage, while Alijandro Siller showed up good with his blocking duties.

Johnny Truitt and Terry McLean also came through the game with some mentionable plays. As a group the Eagles did a

fine job with the scrimmage, and appear to be further ahead as a team this season than they were at this same time last year," Auldridge stated. "The boys' blocking has improved considerably. What it took the boys to achieve by mid-season last year, they appear to be doing already this year."

Other coaches working with Auldridge are Danny Spradley and Perry Farley.

According to official report by weatherman Glenn DeWitt, Goldthwaite received approximately 5 inches of rain. At the weather station north of town 2.40 inches was recorded.

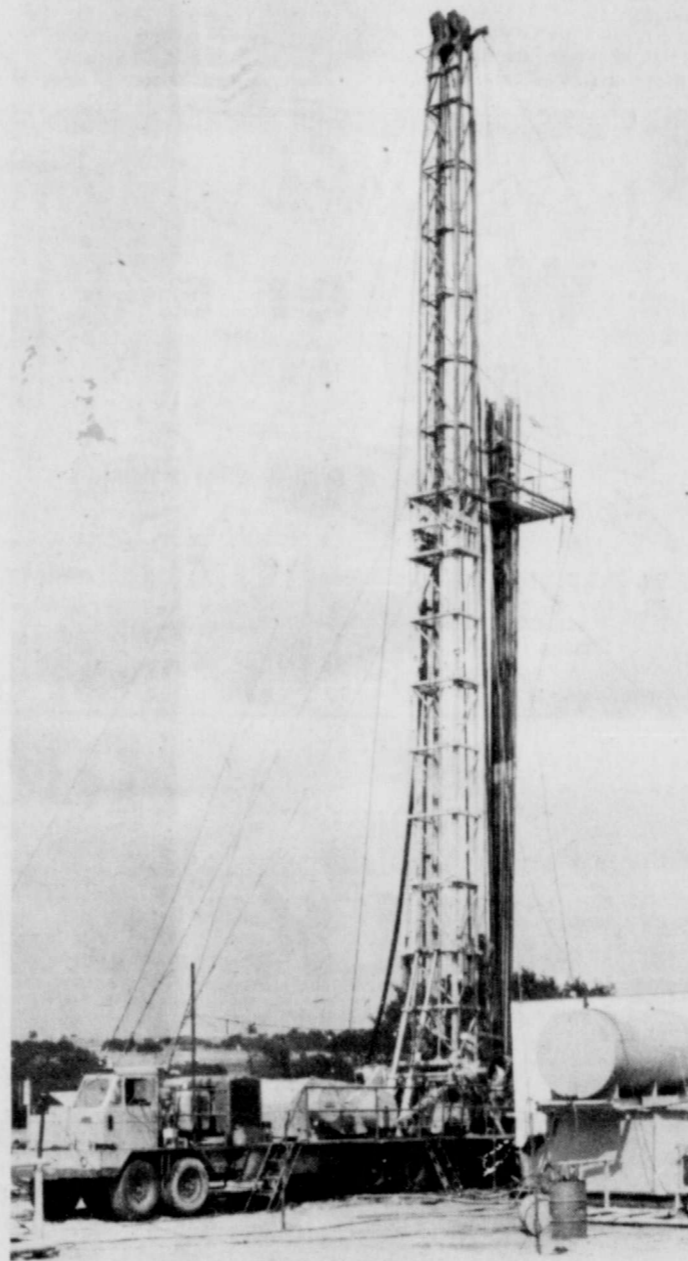
Reports from other areas in the county indicated as much as 2 1/2 to 3 1/2 inches were received. Total rainfall for the month of August totals 6.20 inches.

Three Escapees Apprehended Near Stephenville Mon.

Several Mills County law enforcement officers assisted in the manhunt and road block set up in Erath County this weekend

that ultimately led to the death of one escaped convict and the capture of two others.

Killed was Richard Mangum, 22, of Denver, Colorado and captured were Dalton Williams, 29, of Snyder and Jerry Ulmer, 22, of Garland.

They escaped from the Colorado State Penitentiary last Friday and pursued a four day killing and terror spree across three states.

An all-day manhunt using bloodhounds finally resulted in the nighttime confrontation which led to their demise.

The ranch where the convicts spent most of their time near Stephenville was supposedly operated and leased by some Mills County ranchers.

Mills County officers assisting were Highway Patrolman Bobby Wilcox; Game Warden Bennie Schriver; and Sheriff H. G. Brooks.

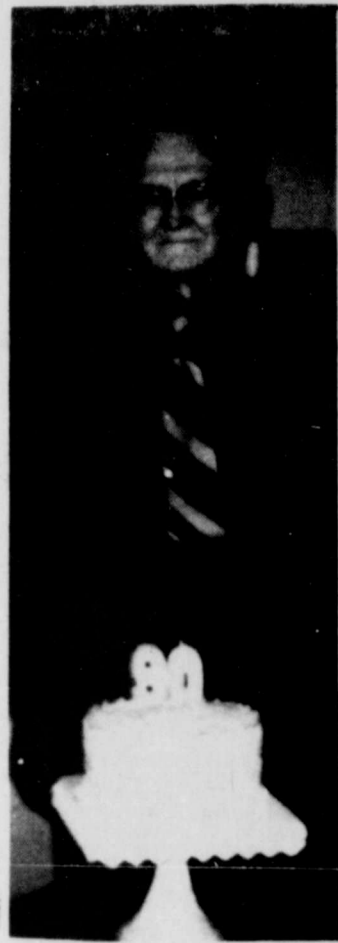
Star Baptist Enrolls In Achievement Program
