Regional Job Bank Now Available

Those persons seeking employment will now have the assistance of a job referral bank for the region. This program, the Job Information Service, will be provided by the Mills County Office of the Central Texas Council of Governments. This office will be in daily contact with other area offices concerning job openings in the region. They are also receiving packets on job openings in Dallas, Ft. Worth, Waco, Brownwood, Lampasas, Belton, Temple, Cameron, Copperas Cove, San Saba and Hamilton. These openings are in many fields, both skilled labor and professional positions and unskilled jobs, requiring no previous experience, some with training on the job. For those people looking for a particular area of work that is not available in this county and are considering either commuting or moving to a different area, this will give them an opportunity to view openings that are as current as possible.

The J.I.S. program is operated through the Central Texas Council of Governments with the hope that it will be of service to those seeking employment. In cooperation with this program, any local businesses seeking placement in a particular position in their operation can list this opening with the Mills Co. Office and it will be recorded in the region along with the job openings from the other towns. Skilled positions requiring certain background and training can be viewed by all persons in the area, creating a broader scope of possible applicants.



Eagles Downed 39-0 In Conference Opener, Travel To Dublin Friday

Friday night the Eagles were "buffaloed" out of their first 10-A conference game 39-0. On first possession of the ball, Cross Plains went over the goal line for a six pointer. Goldthwaite then took the pigskin, maneuvered toward the goal line, and with first and ten to go fumbled the ball to their opponents. No doubt, Cross Plains took advantage of the Eagle fumble and racked up a touchdown, plus the extra points. Before half time the Eagles' opponents scored again, leaving the locals trailing 19-0.

Apparently, things weren't much better for Goldthwaite in the second half, as Cross Plains

racked up three more TD's. "We knew before we left Friday we had a tough team to play and that is just what they were," commented Head Coach Gene Auldridge. "They are the best team we have played so far this season. Goldthwaite is capable of playing a much better game than what was executed on the field Friday night. We hope this will prove so in our game against Dublin Friday night."

Guernaro Siller racked up the most yards rushing for the Eagles Friday night and was the leading rusher for the Eagles with a total of 61 yards.

Tigers Receive Defeat

A strong Jarrell team downed the Star Tigers 59-12 in their last non-conference game of the '74 season. Star's Bill Brown was credited with the Tigers' two TD's on runs of 34 and 8 yards. Star had three touchdowns called back due to penalties. Jarrell's Gordon Crumb had an outstanding night as he ran for five touchdowns and passed for five more.

Savings Bond Sales Total \$1,283

Series E and H United States Savings Bond sales in Mills Co. during the month of August totaled \$1,283, according to County Bond Chairman W. P. Duren. Sales for the eight-month period were \$36,389 for 61 percent of the 1974 sales goal of \$60,000. Texans purchased \$18,667,526 in Savings Bonds during the month, while sales for the same period last year totaled \$17,913,390 - an increase of 4.2 percent. Year-to-date sales amounted to \$154,751,211 for 65 percent of the sales goal of \$236.8 million.

Mills County Farmers & Ranchers Eligible For Emergency Loans

Farmers and ranchers in Mills County who sustained production losses as a result of damages and losses caused by prolonged drought from July 26, 1973 through August 22, 1974 may be eligible to receive an emergency loan from the Farmers Home Administration. The emergency loan became available for Mills County effective October 4, 1974.

Those who have not received an emergency loan to assist them in recovering from their loss may apply for such a loan at the Farmers Home Administration county office at 209 South Greenleaf in Brownwood before close of business December 2, 1974 for physical losses and July 7, 1975 for production losses.

These loan applications will be taken under the terms of a new law enacted January 2, 1974. Individual examination will be made of each application to determine date of the disaster occurrence and emergency loan benefits for which the applicant is eligible.

Loans based on qualifying production losses may include funds

to reimburse applicants for production expenses which went into damaged or destroyed crop and livestock enterprises, but not to produce new crops during 1975. Payment terms depend on the purposes for which the loan is used and the applicant's payment

ability. No land loan may exceed the actual loss sustained. The interest rate for these loans is 5 percent and there will be no principal cancellation. These loans must be secured by crops, livestock, farm machinery, or real estate.

Fall Screwworm Buildup Arrives With 1098 Confirmed Cases

The fall screwworm buildup arrived in September with 1,098 laboratory confirmed cases in Texas livestock, including one case in Mills County. The biggest share of these were in the hill country and West Texas.

The pattern continued into early October with 41 cases confirmed in Val Verde County the first four days of the month. This followed 132 confirmed cases of the live flesh eating parasite in that county during September.

Shearing season for sheep and goats, and its attendant wounds, is underway in the region. Female screwworm flies oviposit their eggs on edges of wounds. Hatching larvae enter the wound to feed for about a week.

Second hardest hit county in September was Crockett with 122 confirmed cases. The year's first

screwworm cases were confirmed in Hudspeth, Winkler, Ector, Mitchell and Lampasas counties during the month.

Counties reporting one case each in September were El Paso, Hudspeth, Culberson, Ector, Mitchell, Coke, Rimmels, Coleman, Mills, Concho, Lampasas and Reagan.

Winkler and Jeff Davis each reported two cases; three were confirmed in Brown, Burnet and Kimble; four in McCulloch; five in Kendall, Kerr and Kimble; six in Real, Bandera and Medina; eight in Presidio; and nine each in Menard and Tom Green.

Brewster County recorded 24 cases; Pecos, 55; Terrell, 87; Crockett, 122; Irion, 25; San Saba 46; Comanche, 11; Llano, 20; Mason, 13; Gillespie, 10; Edwards, 65; Sutton, 39; Schleicher, 34; Kinney, 68; Uvalde, 22; and Medina, 16.

Mullin Overtakes Jonesboro

The Mullin Bulldogs took a victory over Jonesboro by one touchdown last week. Mullin racked up 30 points to their opponents' 24. Steve King and Tony King each caught passes from Phil Hickman for Mullin TD's. Tony King also ran one touchdown over the goal line and Ricky Shelton took the pigskin over twice for TD's.


An immunization service aid, Mary Keys, makes home visits in Mills County to urge parents to complete immunization on their infants and young children.

District Attorney Joe Carroll is Horace Brook's guest at the regular Lions Club meeting Tuesday night.

Carroll talked about the problems in our courts today, and thinks there are many - ranging from not allowing oral confessions to federal judges who are appointed via the "spoils" system and not specifically on merit.

And, more courts is not the answer according to Carroll. The load, such as it is, would be an additional 13 courts in the 27th Judicial District alone, with one costing at least \$200,000 a year to maintain.

The "between the lines" message of the D.A. seems to be that too many crimes are committed because the law does not punish hard enough to curtail the law. If more and stiffer penalties were assessed, there would be fewer crimes.

If prosecutors and law enforcement officers were allowed to use a very few new methods, outlawed by federal court decisions, the number of criminals prosecuted would be increased for the crimes justly merited.






