## Group Pledges Plant Support

"If we don't turn the (worker's comp) situation around in 60 days, we're not going to be able to do business in Texas--that is the bottom line," Excel's Terry Wilkerson told a group of local leaders Wednesday at the packing plant.

Among those attending the meeting, sponsored by the Friona Chamber of Commerce, was state senator Teel Bivins. The meeting was arranged for the purpose of discussing the worker's compensation problem as it pertains to the local packing plant.

However, Wilkerson stressed that Excel is committed to turning the situation around, pointing out that the company has invested \$10 million on its Texas plants in the last five years.

"But we didn't do that (big investment) to lose money. We feel we have an excellent work force, and the cattle supply here is good. We are committed to stay, but we need your help," Wilkerson told the crowd.

The local Excel plant manager said that the company badly needs tips on worker's compensation abusers, and asked those with such tips to call the company's "hotline," 295-8477.

Wilkerson pointed out that

Excel spent roughly \$1.5 billion last year on the live cattle market, and spent an additional \$40 to \$50 million on labor at its two Texas slaughter plants (Friona and Plainview).

It was stated that in the last two weeks, 11 company employees who had been collecting worker's comp insurance had returned to work. "But we still have 150 employees out, collecting insurance," Wilkerson said.

It was stated that nationwide, the number of worker's comp cases that involved attorneys was approximately seven per cent. In Texas, the figure balloons to 50 per cent, and Excel officials said that virtually 100 per cent of their worker's comp cases involve attorneys.

Due to Texas' complicated system, a number of attorneys consider worker's compensation to be their "bread and butter."

Bivins said that he believed that the legislation passed late last year by the Texas lawmakers would go a long way to address the systematic problems of worker's comp.

"Unfortunately for Excel, however, this doesn't take effect until January 1, 1991, and that

# Parmer Ranks High In Cattle Statistics

Feedlots within the area served by Southwestern Public Service Company (SPS) during 1989 fed the highest number of cattle on record, according to SPS's annual Fed Cattle Survey.

Feedlots in the SPS service area fed 5,468,350 head of cattle, a 2.5% increase over the 1988 total of 5,335,603. The previous record was set in 1987 with 5,406,975 cattle fed.

The survey also showed that the one-time total capacity of area feedlots in 1989 was 2,785,475 head, up from the one-time total capacity in 1988 of 2,758,662 head.

"The 1989 study shows how important cattle feeding is to the area's economy," said Dave Krupnick, SPS manager of agricultural and wholesale marketing. "Although prices for feeder cattle remain up, 1989 was

still a record year for this area."

SPS annually prepares a Fed Cattle Survey covering feedlots in its service area. The electric utility serves a 52,000-square-mile area comprising the Texas and Oklahoma panhandles, the Texas South Plains, eastern and southeastern New Mexico, and southwestern Kansas.

Additionally, the survey found that 4,694,852 cattle were slaughtered last year at 13 beef-packing plants in the SPS service area, Krupnick said. The facilities have an annual slaughter capacity of 4,818,320 head.

"Each year feedlots and packing plants are very cooperative in supplying information for this survey, and we really appreciate that," Krupnick said. "We continue to receive requests from across the United States for this

survey, and it helps highlight this area's agriculture and food-processing industries."

The report also shows that the total number of feedlots in the area has grown to 117, and the one-time capacity of these lots is still on the increase. The report also includes a chart on the ten-year history of fed cattle and the one-time capacity of surveyed feed lots, as well as information on the number of feedlots with 5,000-head capacity or above and a county breakdown of lot capacity and numbers fed.

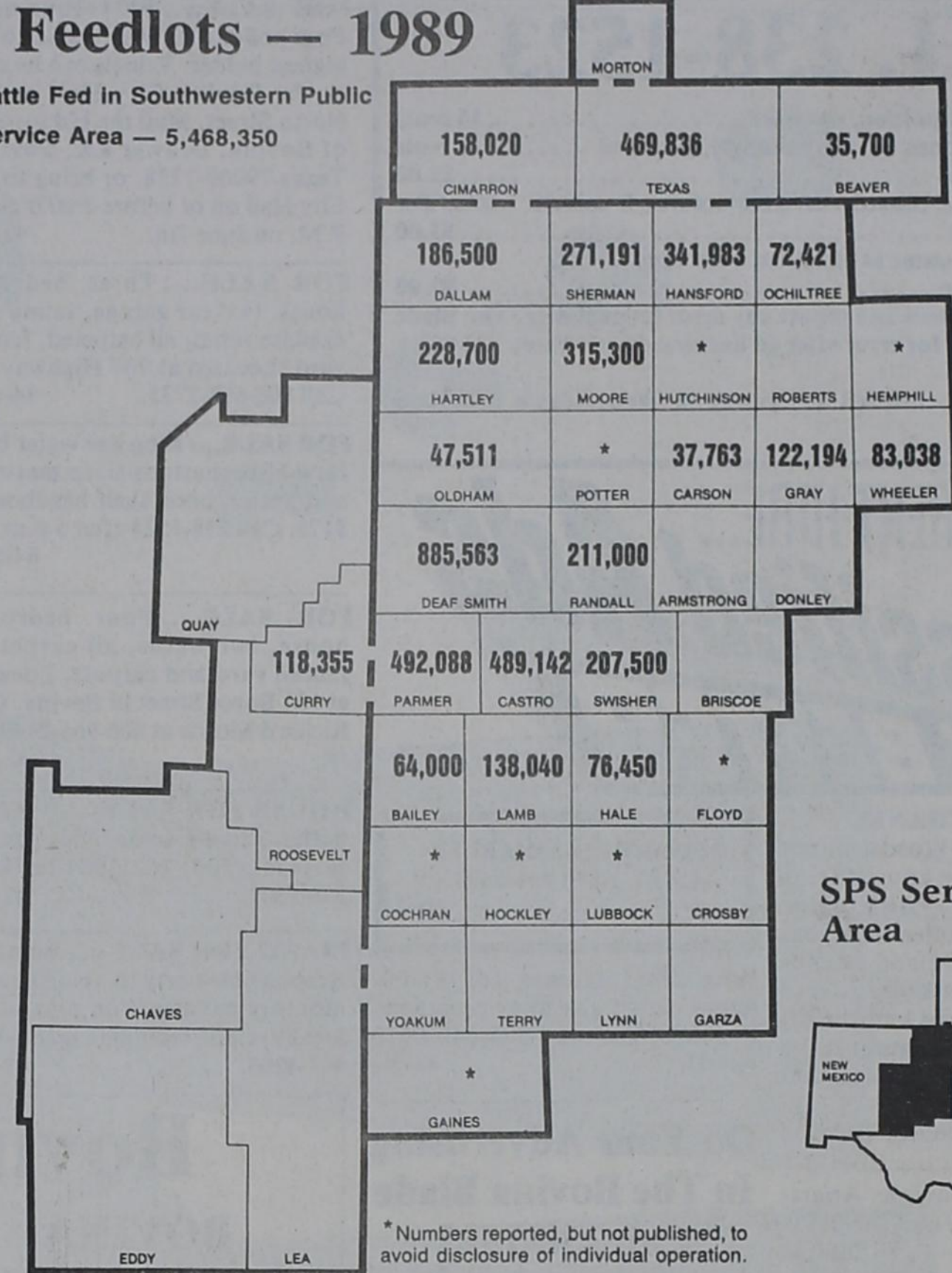

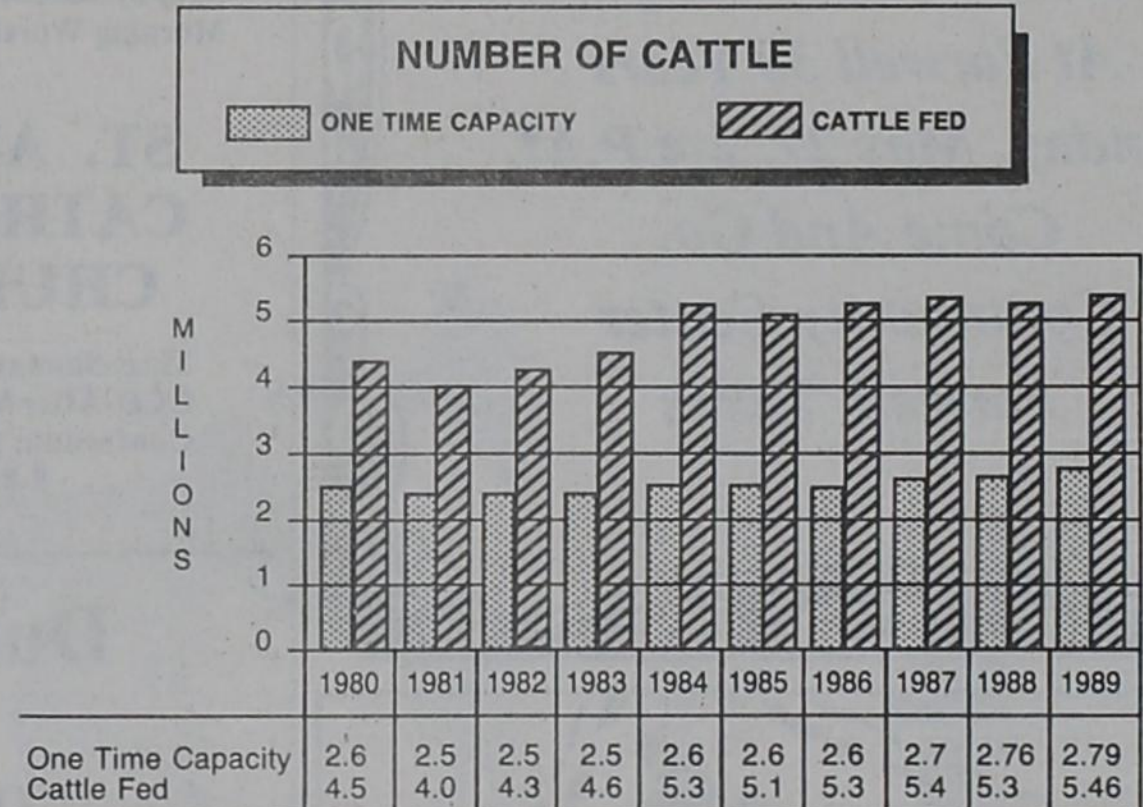
