In the United States there are ways and means to provide leaders with the "opinions of the public."

One way is through the editorial columns of newspapers. This is a method that has been used since before the Revolutionary War, and it has been very successful in relaying public opinion to leaders. However, the ideas expressed in editorial columns often are those of only one or two persons, usually with a wide and varied knowledge of the whys and wherefores of their subjects. And their ideas generally reflect public sentiment, but not all the time. Most newspapers heartily endorse the use of "Letters to the Editor" columns to further feel the pulse of the public. Handled correctly (using good taste and a little manners) the results can be outstanding.

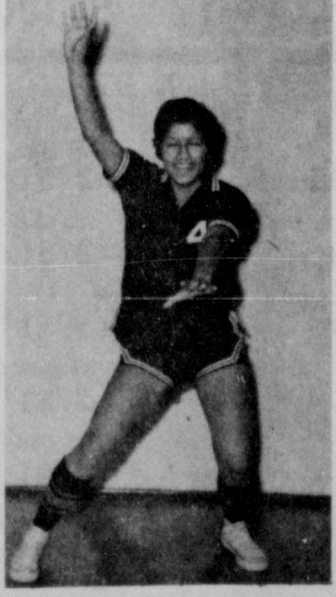

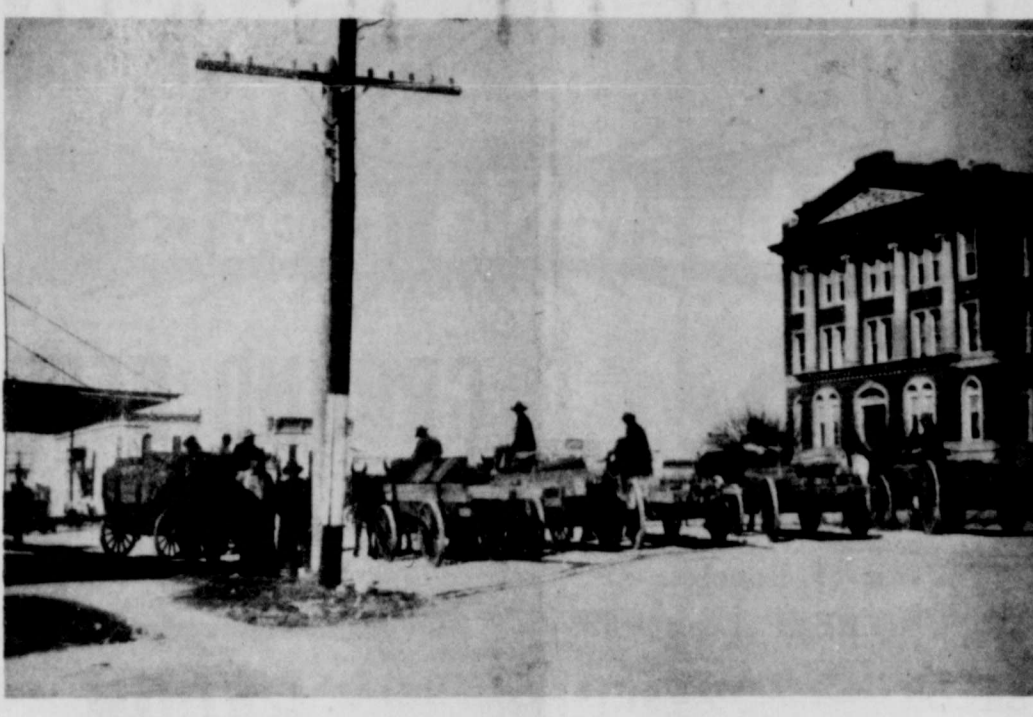

## The Way It Was Goldthwaite And Its History

PART II

Election day, during the early times of the small towns, is worth writing about. For weeks ahead, candidates "beat the bushes" so to speak; some in buggies, some riding horses from house to house; while others tried to catch people when they came to town. Candidates were present at all community functions, picnics, school programs and rallies. People quickly took sides and many heated arguments took place on the streets, in barber shops or any place where groups of men happened to gather. At times, arguments became so heated that fights arose and fines were paid.

Politics were included in almost everything, even advertising, as the following business ads, appearing in The Goldthwaite Eagle in 1894, will tell: "E. S. Kirby treats you all alike, Democrats, Republicans and Populists. He will meet you on the level of low prices and part with you on the square." Also appearing in The Eagle was this news item concerning politics: "At a political rally at Lookout Mountain, there were six candidates, six voters and one fruit tree salesman present."

When the big election day arrived, people arose early and went to the polls. The next morning the chores were done early, a picnic lunch packed, and all went to town. All the votes would not be counted and sent into Goldthwaite until the following day because of slow travel in the outlying communities. They went by horseback, wagons, buggies, hacks, and later by the car loads. Bands sometimes played on the town square, and people stood around in clusters, watching as the count from each community came in.

The men sometimes played a game called "Shooting Anvils". One anvil was placed on the ground and gun powder poured in a pile on top of it. Another anvil was placed on top of the first one, and a long fuse of gun powder poured to some distance away. When the fuse was lighted and had burned to the big charge of gun powder, it shot like a cannon. People jumped, horses shied and tried to run away, babies cried and a good time was had by all.

After much confusion, the first election in Mills County saw the following men elected: J. B. Head, Judge; Phil Clements, County Clerk; C. D. Hammond, Deputy Clerk; James Ewing, County Treasurer; Uvalde Burns, County Attorney; G. W. Cunningham, County Sheriff; Whit Smith, Deputy Sheriff; J. A. Mohler, County Tax-assessor; and W. L. Livingston, County Surveyor.

The first official act of the Mills County Clerk's Office was to issue a marriage license, and the first suit filed in the new county was for divorce proceedings; both black couples.

A special election was held to select a county seat on October 10, 1889, two years after the county had been organized. It was a close race, and Goldthwaite won over Mullin by only thirteen votes.

The platt for Goldthwaite was laid out by A. S. Haynie, an engineer.

In 1888, the town was growing and had several hotels. Across the railroad tracks, to the east of the depot and in the vicinity of the present Sam H. Rahl Warehouse, stood the Pat Rahl Hotel, facing west. This was a beautiful hotel for the times; two-story with a porch running across the front of both floors. The hotel catered to railroad men, and it is said that Mrs. Rahl served delicious meals there.

South of the Rahl Hotel was the home of Hack McLeod, who drove a wagon and delivered merchandise from the depot to any location in town for 15c.

The Bayliss Hotel stood on the south corner of Third and Front Street, facing the tracks; and to the south of the Bayliss Hotel was the Nairn House, another hotel and a saloon.

All people wanted their business places as close to the depot as possible, especially the hotels and saloons, because that is where the activity was. When the train came to town, it was the most important time of the day for the townspeople. They dropped whatever they might be doing, and rushed to the depot as a mass to meet the train. When that envied man, the engineer, stepped down from the big engine

occasionally and chatted with the people gathered around him, giving them a hint of what the great world was like outside, it was the highlight of the village day, and the atmosphere was "electrifying".

It was thought at one time that Goldthwaite would be a division point for the Gulf, Colorado and Santa Fe Railroad, so a switching track was built to a point just southwest of the swimming pool, and a Santa Fe Roundhouse and workshops for the train stood there in the early days of the town. But labor troubles arose, and the division point was moved to another city.

The Red Store, operated by A. J. Gatlin, was located behind the Bayliss Hotel. South of The Red Store was the Bowden Store. D. G. Gentry erected a modern livery and feed stable facing Fourth Street in 1898. Charley Rudd and Jim Cockrum operated the "Moon Buggy and Wagon Place" in 1900. W. W. Saylor and his son, Jacob, operated a transportation company in Goldthwaite. The conveyances were long drays drawn by horses. Several people over town carried freight in their regular wagons, and when business places in town had merchandise to be hauled, they put a certain kind of little flag outside their establishments as a signal to the freighters that they had business for them.

On Fisher Street, just south of the present Baptist Church Center, was the "Dillingham Hall" and the Confederate Soldiers met there. The "Hay-makers" also met there, but not much is known of them, except that they wore mother-hubbard aprons to their meetings and had a hilariously good time.

El Fairman ran a gin in the vicinity of the present stock show barns, and E. L. Eubanks was engineer there in 1898. Mr. Fairman soon sold the gin to his son, Walter, who ran it for a long time. The Greathouse Gin was located to the east of the railroad where the Government Housing Project is now located, and "The Planter's Gin" stood just south of the Greathouse Gin, with Hud Hamilton as manager.

In 1890, a corner lot on the north of Parker and Fourth Street was purchased by R. L. Burns and a blacksmith shop set up. Phil Morris had a blacksmith shop that joined it on the same lot. Later, the Smith Brothers had a garage there, and Chas. Frazier operated the Conoco Agency on this lot before Oscar Burns built the Goldthwaite Postoffice, where it stands today with Norman Duren as Postmaster.

Phil Clements moved his drug store to Goldthwaite from Williams Ranch began declining. Earl Clements, son of Phil, was also a druggist, and operated a drug store on the north side of the square for years until his health began to fail and he sold the store to his pharmacist who had been with him for many years, W. P. Woody. The name of the store was changed to Woody Drug.

About 1907, a young doctor and his bride arrived in Goldthwaite looking for a place to set up practice and rear a family. This doctor started in an office in the back of Clements Drug Store; his name - Dr. J. M. Campbell, who was destined to work his way into the hearts of the people of the county, and will always be remembered as Mills County's "Beloved Dr. Campbell."

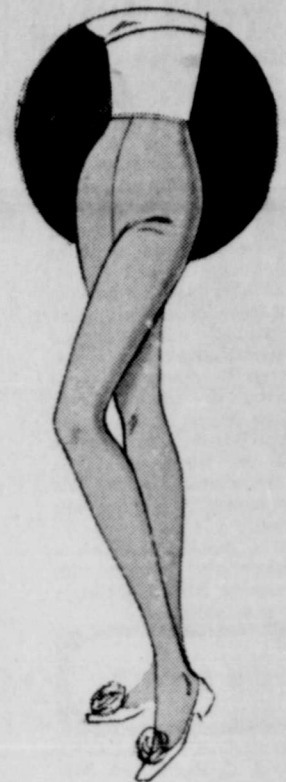

**UTILITIES:** We must work closely with the newly formed Utility Commission to assure fair rates to the consumer.

"The people of this Nation and State are weary of unresponsive government and unfulfilled promises. It shall be my major objective to return the State government to the hands of the people where it belongs. I plan to accomplish this by maintaining close communication with the voters, and seeing that my work in the legislature actually reflects

their wishes and not those of my own."

Schlueter's family originates from the Hill Country towns of Stonewall, Fredericksburg, and Llano. He is married to the former Carol Susan Gannon, an Elementary school teacher. They are members of the Central Christian Church where Schlueter serves as a Deacon. Schlueter is also a member of the Rotary Club, Chamber of Commerce, Bell County Registered Cattle Breeders Association, and the Board of Realtors.

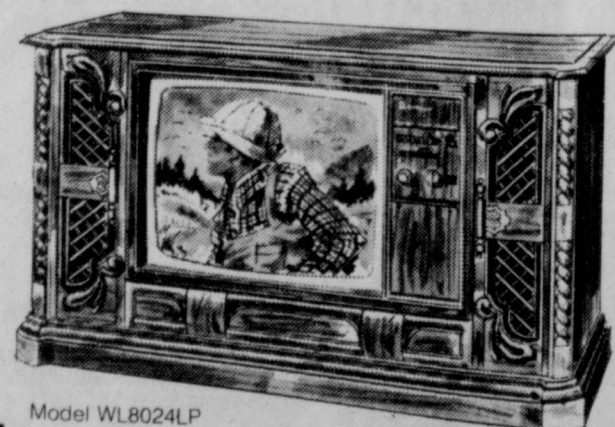
