




festivities. After the parade, everyone headed over to the city park and enjoyed games, bar-be-que, snow cones and visiting with neighbors.





#### Cottonseed Futures Scheduled Seminar

A free seminar designed to show how to use cottonseed futures and options contracts has been scheduled for Lubbock on August 1, 2000.

The purpose of the seminar is to demonstrate how newly available cottonseed futures and options contracts can aid in the task of price discovery and risk management for all segments of the cotton industry.

Scheduled discussion topics include an Introduction to Cottonseed Futures, Hedging examples, an Explanation of the Futures Delivery System, and an Introduction to Options. All seminars will conclude with a Q&A session.

The seminar is being cosponsored by the Minneapolis Grain Exchange, the National Cotton Council and Cotton Incorporated.

Similar seminars will also be held in Memphis, Tennessee, July 11; Cordele,

Georgia, July 12; and Fresno, California, July 26. All of the seminars are free, although pre-registration is required.
