After a night's lodging at a hotel, he continued on to Priddy, Texas, where he settled for the next few years. He employed at the C. F. Jeske Store and the Pfluger Gin until the General Mercantile Store was purchased from Henry Morris in Star, Texas.

That meant a move for Jeske, but it was a move in the right direction - a move in which he found his place in the world. On August 13, 1915, Jeske started the Star Cash Store, formerly the General Mercan-

tile Store in Star. In those days, the merchan-dise for the store was hauled by team and wagon in bulk quantities from Goldthwaite to Star, and for many years Jeske purchased cotton, wool, mohair, pecans, grain, poultry and eggs

in quantities to accomodate the residents of Star.

Although the store changed, and Jeske's life changed - he Emma Louise Schwartz in 1921 and they had two children, Gilbert and Mildred - his love for the community he had made his home never faltered.

Dick Jeske operated the Star Cash Store for 44 years, closing it finally in May, 1959. But life for the man who had been a twenty-year member of the Star School Board and a fiftyyear member of The Woodmen of the World Society, did not end in that year. He continued his drive for progress in the community, as well as the

After having seen the landing of the United States astronauts on the face of the moon, which he considered a major sign of progress, Jeske died on September 19, 1972.

To the day of his death, he was proud of having chosen Star as his home; proud of the friendships and acquaintances he had cultivated there and happy with his life.
