

At a Saturday noon meeting of the Bovina Junior Chamber of Commerce in Bovina Restaurant, members decided to accept a proposal from Claborn Funeral Home, Friona, to drive an ambulance belonging to that firm to all home football games during the 1957 season.

A.W. Anthony, Jr., who lives and farms six miles north of Friona, has been named conservation farmer of the year in the Parmer County Soil Conservation District.

For the second time in about 18 months, Keith McCutchan, seven-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. E.E. McCutchan, has broken his right arm. He had right arm. He had undergone three operations since the first break.

40 Yrs. Ago--Sept. 5, 1962 Burglars got only trouble for their efforts when they robbed Bovina Post Office and Bovina Variety early Sunday morning. Alertness of two Bovina men, Bill Don and Darrell Read, kept the

Mr. and Mrs. Reggie Jones of Amarillo celebrated their 25th anniversary with a reception at their home. The event was hosted by the couple's children.


