





"The district is thankful for the scholarships and the speakers that traveled here for this event and appreciative of those that chose to attend," Maggio said.

Sales Tax Distributed **To County**

Texas Comptroller Carole Keeton Rylander sent monthly sales tax payments to local governments.

The November sales tax rebates include local sales taxes collected in September by monthly filers and in July, August and September by quarterly filers, and reported to the comptroller in October. The next sales tax allocation will be on Friday, December 13. Parmer County cities of Bovina, Farwell and Friona received a total of \$30,221. The breakdown is Bovina, \$3,244; Farwell, \$4,877; and Friona, \$22,100. The monthly payment was an 11.45% increase over October of 2001. However, for the year, Parmer County is still slightly below last year's revenue. For 2002, the county has received \$303,552, broken down as Bovina, \$26,467; Farwell, \$47,237; and Friona, \$229,848. The total received for this period last year was \$310,918, an overall decrease of 2.36%.


many years. He was a member of Lee Street Baptist Church in Dimmitt, where he was active in church ministries.






