For the second time in as many years, the Goldthwaite Band Boosters Club will hold its band carnival along side the Festival in the Park.


This sidelight, features many games, booths, and

Stampede! Cows Run In County Museum

Cows have invaded one of the changing cases in the Mills County Historical Museum. Mrs. Marion Kirbo of Mullin has placed her fantastic collection of cow-creamers on display. Each

little cream pitcher is in the shape of a cow; the cream comes out the cow's mouth and the cow's curved tail is used as a handle.

This collection is very rare, as cow-creamers are now hard to find. They were popular around the turn of the century, or earlier, but have not been manufactured in many years. Mrs. Kirbo has also placed several cow-plates and a cow picture in the display for interest; a trip to the museum to see the cows will be well worth your time.

The tall changing cases now feature assorted antiques from Mills County and surrounding area, displayed by Naomi Langford Wittenburg of Lometa. The display in these cases include a very old quilt, blue milk-glass, early cut crystal, old hand-painted plates, a silver spooner, a crystal spooner and an 1876 Centennial commemorative brass bell. You will enjoy this display, also.

Mrs. Robbie Dalton is now showing her oil paintings in the changing art space. Robbie's pictures are beautiful and interesting; they show still-life, landscapes, and her talent as an artist. Be sure to see them when you go to the museum during the next few weeks.


Lester Wayne Saathoff ...G'waite Salutatorian





Memorial Service For Rev. Mrs. R.L. (Alma) Flowers Held May 12 at San Marcos

A worship service in memory of the Rev. Mrs. R. L. (Alma) Flowers was held May 12, 1978 at the Pennington Funeral Chapel, San Marcos, Texas. The Rev. Gordon Talk, United Methodist Church, Fredericksburg, held the service assisted by the Rev. Ben Welch, Goldthwaite United Methodist Church.

Rev. Flowers was born in Ellis County, Texas December 16, 1886, and died in Georgetown, Texas May 10, 1978. She attended Southwestern University at Georgetown, Texas Wesleyan at Ft. Worth, and also Scarritt College and Vander-

bilt University of Nashville. It was while she was attending Scarritt that she met her husband, the late Rev. R.L. Flowers. They were married October 17, 1911.

For more than forty years this couple held more than 2,000 crusades reaching from New York to the North-western states. During this time more than 75,000 persons were converted, the majority joining the Methodist Church. At this time the two Rev. Flowers served under the Board of Missions and later under the Board of Evangelism of the Methodist Church.

After the uniting of the Methodist Church, South and the Methodist Church, North, in 1939, the Rev. Mrs. Flowers was the first licensed woman minister of the combined church.

After the death of her husband, Mrs. Flowers became the director of Christian Education at the First Methodist Church, Victoria, Texas. She has also held positions of teaching and youth work at Methodist Churches in Lubbock. She served as pastor of the Telferner, Texas, Methodist Church.

During the years of World War II she and her husband lived in Goldthwaite, making this town headquarters while carrying on evangelical work in this part of the country. Thus it was that she retired here nine years ago.

On June 2, 1971 she was ordained a deacon by the presiding bishop of the North Texas Conference, Kenneth W. Pope, at the Annual Conference held in Dallas.

The Rev. Mrs. Flowers continued her work within the church after returning to Goldthwaite. She taught several of the youth confirmation classes, and was in great demand as a speaker as she served on the staff of the Goldthwaite United Methodist Church. She was a life member of the United Methodist Women and of the Mills County Ministerial Association.

She was preceded in death by her husband and a son, Richard L. Flowers, Jr. The son served in World War II, and upon returning to the states became a well known college professor serving in several Methodist Colleges. At the time of his death in 1964, he was head of the Alcoholics Department of H.E.W. for the State of Washington.

Survivors include a daughter-in-law, Mrs. Leatrice Flowers, Dallas; a foster daughter, Mrs. Gerald (Carolyn) Porter of Pleasanton, Texas; and a number of nieces and nephews.

The Goldthwaite Head Start Center, located at 3rd and Hutchings St., offered developmental services to 21 children this year, ages 3 years 7 months, to 4-5 year olds. An income guideline was used to determine who was eligible for the program. There was no fee for admittances.

To achieve its goals, Head Start provided for the educational needs, social, psychological, health and nutritional requirements. It provided for a physical, dental

Mrs. Dumas and her RSVP volunteers helped to screen the children at the beginning and at the end of the year.

They also helped with the Easter Party. Mary Lou Galoway volunteered in the classroom one day. Peggy Patterson gave a talk about her services of Family Planning and the available resources in the community. Liz Long also spoke to the parents about the MHMR program in town.

The Head Start parents themselves accomplished many tasks for Head Start. First of all, they were present at the parent meetings, they baked for a Bake Sale, made puppets, set up a swing set, made a coat rack, helped in the classroom, on field trips, gave birthday parties, repaired facets and windows. The volunteers that were able to give the most time were Carol and Randy Hudspeth, Lonita Steve, Gayl Germany, Maria & Estaban Vacquero, Michelle Brown and Mino Coronado.

The children enjoyed many activities which included learning games of counting, sequence, rhymes, patterns, shapes, & colors to name a few. They participated in many cooking and science

experiences. They enjoyed field trips to the lumber yard, grocery store, post office, Heritage Home, to the San Saba Head Start Center, to see a helicopter land, and to see spring bloom.

The center had many visitors this year. One was Irma Quezada from Texas Tech University Regional Training Office in Lubbock. She came twice to check the files and help the staff to get ready for validation. Validation time came May 3 & 4, when a team of seven representatives came to the Center. At this time the files were examined to see if the staff had accomplished their requirements. The team gave real good comments about the center and the program.

Virginia Coronado received her credentials for a CDA May 11. On her LAT Team were Ruth Dumas, trainer; Josie Valencia, parent representative; and Jane Jamison, Consortium representative. Donna Mangham has begun her portfolio in preparation for the CDA credentials in the fall.



The Farm Bureau has long been working to help the livestock situation in Texas. We have had a leadership role in several programs that have affected Mills County livestock producers.

One of the finest things that has happened to us since Rural Electricity (REA) came

to our county has been the screw worm eradication program. Not only has this program given us much needed relief with our domestic livestock, it has been a big boom to the wildlife population.

Mills County landowners are getting more income

each year from hunting leases and many dollars in livestock losses are being avoided by the effectiveness of this program. There are a number of things we should do to help keep our county and state relatively free of screwworms. We should do as little dehorning, tail docking or castrating as possible during the seasons when the screwworm flies are normally present. We should contribute to the financial support of the screwworm program when it is needed. We must send samples of worms to the proper authority if we find a case of worms so that drops


