And if that isn't enough to shatter your diet, consider the Lions Club fish fry, beginning at 4:30.

The Lions Club event will feature fresh water catfish and all the trimmings, and will be prepared by the "fishiest" looking crew you ever saw. The fish will be fried right on the spot, insuring freshness and flavor. The slight wait for the fresh fish has always been well worth the time.

The arts and crafts and flea market area will be as good as ever, according to officials of the Lions Club, festival sponsors. The area adjacent to Highway 183 will be the site of the booths. 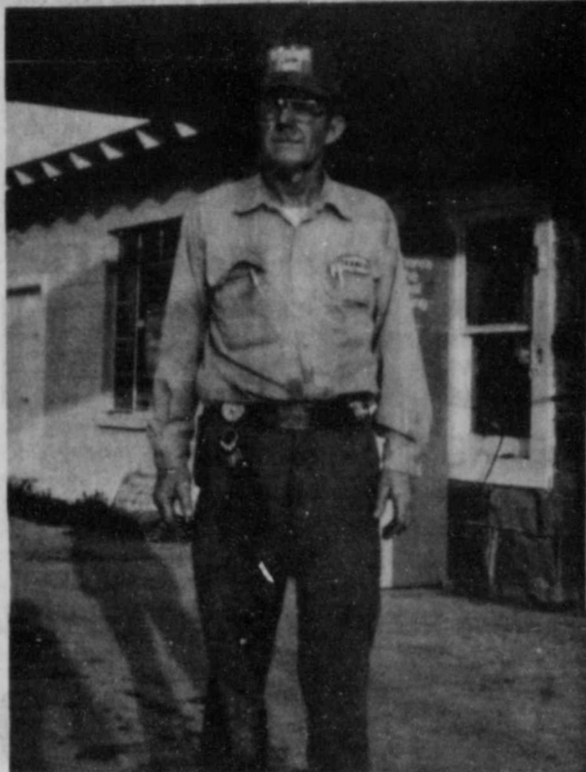
Official Welcome

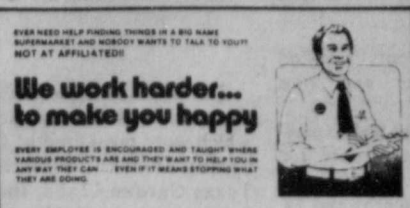

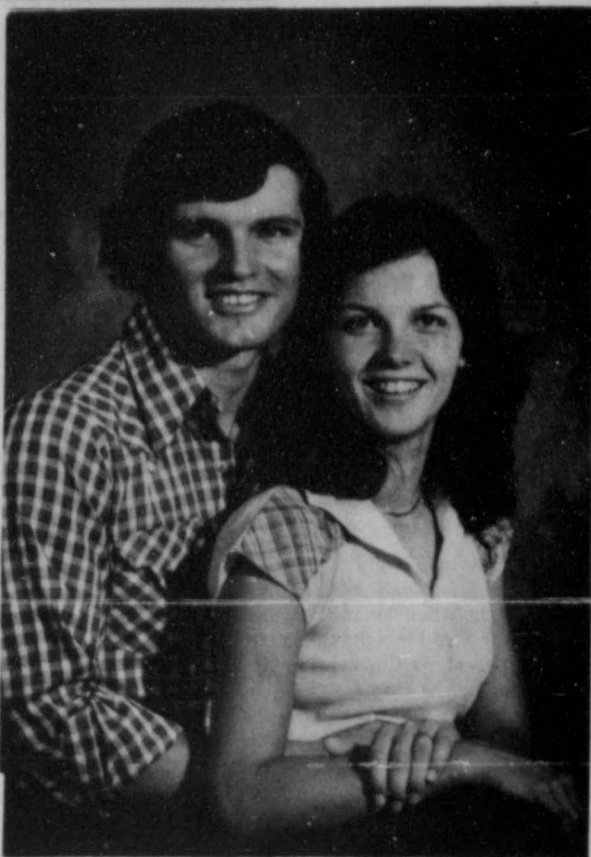

Water Under The Bridge
Had the opportunity to visit a little while Tuesday afternoon with Congressional candidate Marvin Leath. This wasn't our first visit, and I hope it won't be the last. He came to Goldthwaite to meet with some of his supporters for a brief meeting. He reaffirmed his positions in the campaign, and predicted that history would probably run its course again in the runoff election of June 3rd. He said that about 50,000 voters out of the potential of 250,000 in the 11th district would turn out to the polls. This is a sad prediction, but, alas, it is true.
At least it is true as far as previous runoffs are concerned. But it doesn't have to be true in Mills County.
Mills County voters turned out almost 60% strong in the regular primary, compared to 40% over the district. This proves that the people of Mills County recognize that the only way to change the face of our government is to go to the ballot box and carefully and patriotically voice your opinion.

It's no secret that things are going badly in the federal ranks. The tide is turning to the Eastern establishment and organized labor forces. These groups are literally spending millions of dollars on House of Representatives elections. Why? That's simple. To insure their power, they will stop at nothing to effectively "buy" votes. And people hereabouts do not want that sort of things upsetting the apple carts that have been producing and doing all right for many years.
The voters of the county need to know the facts in this congressional election. The facts come from one source in reality. The record of campaign contributions that each candidate must file. These contributions will determine the allegiance of the candidate. It always has, and it always will. A candidate who has received a large percentage of his funds from out of the district sources, and especially from out of the state sources, cannot have the best interest of his district at heart when it comes time to vote in Washington. Much of Mr. Lane Denton's contributions, as he has so stated in his reports, have come from these sources.
On the other hand, what about the contributions received by Marvin Leath. They have come from people of the district. Sure, there have been bankers who have contributed, Mr. Leath has many fine friends who are bankers. But the key is who they are and where they are. They do not hide behind any curtains or organizations. Banks cannot contribute to political campaigns, only bankers can. The men themselves must personally contribute. This is a fine line, perhaps, but the truth is that independent people, and independent rural bankers, can only want the best for their friends and customers. That's why they support Leath. He is a principled man with a fine knowledge of business and community affairs.
