

## Mills County Farm Bureau Sets Special Beef Session

Livestock producers in Mills County will meet on June 20, 1978 at 8 p.m. in the Mills County State Bank Community Room, according to

Roy Daniel, Chairman of the MCFB Beef Commodity Committee. The purpose of

the meeting is to discuss proposed voluntary contributions for the promotion of beef at 10¢ per head.

Other members of the Committee are James Horton, Thurman Head and James Wells.

Daniel said the Farm Bureau Board of Directors approved a recommendation of the Beef Cattle Advisory Committee to conduct the meeting to discuss activities of the National Livestock and Meat Board, "and what we as an organization can do in promoting our quality product."

Theme of the meeting will be "Building Consumer Confidence in BEEF", and will be conducted by J. D. Jordan, who was named associate director of commodity activities for the Texas Farm Bureau in September of 1977.

Jordan has said the need for stepped-up activities in

promoting beef is seen from the substantial price increases that have come about the past few months as the cattle market has pulled out of a slump. The promotion campaign would be aimed at emphasizing nutritive values of beef in an effort to discourage consumer reaction to rising prices.

The National Livestock and Meat Board coordinates research and promotion for all red-meat products. Full-color, full page ads have appeared in Readers Digest and regional editions of Time, Newsweek, Better Homes & Gardens, and professional journals for doctors, nutritionists, dieticians, and home economists heralding beef as the best source for iron, proteins, and some vitamins, he said. Weekly radio spots have been carried by Paul Harvey News.

"This is a voluntary self-help program for our industry," Jordan emphasized.

## Land Registry Program, Book, Topics For Meeting Of Mills Historical Comm.

Has your land, or any part of your land, been in your family for one hundred years? If so, contact your Historical Commission about registering that fact. There are no obligations nor are there any expenses involved

on your part -- it is a great honor to have your land registered with the Texas Department of Agriculture as having been in the same family since 1878 or before. The deadline for registration this year is August 15. The Historical Commission

will have printed, by the Eagle Press, 650 copies of Mrs. Flora Gatlin Bowles' book, "A No Man's Land Becomes a County". Mrs. Hollis Blackwell has 450 orders for books, and your Commission has reconsidered and decided on 650 instead of 600 to assure copies for those who have not yet ordered one. The proceeds, after expenses, will go to the Mills County Museum. Mary Bowles Piccione and Love Gatlin have given their kind permission for the reprinting. We are grateful to them.

Judge James Ledbetter met with the Commission and reported on the plans for renovating the County Jail in order to bring it up to the standard required for utilization. It was the first building to be erected in Mills County by the newly-organized county government and was built in 1887-88.

## FFA Annual Rodeo Slated For Thurs., Fri., and Sat.

The 24th Annual Invitational Rodeo of Goldthwaite will be held Thursday, Friday and Saturday, June 15, 16 and 17.

This annual event, sponsored by the local FFA Chapter will get under way each night at 8 p.m., at the T. A. Head Arena, north of the Elementary School.

Seventeen schools have been invited to participate this year in the rodeo.

There will be a street parade Saturday afternoon, beginning at 5 p.m. Course of the parade will be down main street to the courthouse and back up the north side of the square. All schools invited to participate in the rodeo are urged to take part in the parade.

Also, business firms, as well as civic groups are invited to be a part of the parade with floats or other appropriate entries. Members of the FFA will appreciate the support of everyone taking part in this event to help make it a success again this year.

Events for the three nights of the rodeo include Wild Horse Race, Bull Riding, Bareback Bronc Riding, Ribbon Roping, Tie-Down Roping and Break-away Roping. Also, Rabbit Race for pre-schoolers, Armadillo Race (6th grade & under), Girls Barrels & Poles (6th grade & under), Jr. High Girls Barrels and Poles (7th and 8th graders), High School Girl's Barrels, and High School Goat Tying. Ribbons will be awarded to the first five places in each event Thursday and Friday nights.

Trophies will be presented to the first three places Saturday night.

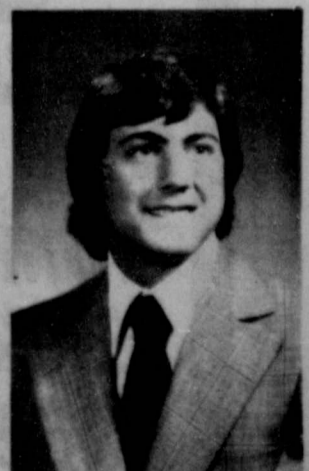
## Kennon McLean Receives Dr. In Dentistry
