Such complaint must be filed not later than 180 days after the alleged discrimination, or by such later date to which the Secretary of Agriculture or the Rural Electrification Administration extends the time for filing. Identity of complainants will be kept confidential except to the extent necessary to carry out the purposes of the Rules and Regulations."

Among the pending projects for the development of our area I suppose we must rate the Central Texas Parkway as number one. For almost half a century I have sought to establish a Parkway in the Eastern Hill Country. As a Member of the Legislature of Texas. I proposed a Parkway along Bull Creek northwest of Austin. This area is now flooded by the Colorado River Dams but we are now well on our way to the beautification of around 400 miles of Parkway from Granbury to San Marcos, by Dinosaur, Meridian, Mother Neff, Longhorn Cavern, Inks Lake. Enchanted Rock, and LBJ State Parks. This route will run from Granbury to Belton, Stillhouse Hollow, Max Starkey, Lyndon B. Johnson, Inks and Buchanan Lakes. It will pass through such interesting spots as Glen Rose, Salado, Lampasas. Llano. Fredericksburg. the LBJ country. Blanco and San Marcos. It will give a view of the free world's largest military establishment, Fort Hood, at Killeen. It will pass the first nuclear generating plant in our State between Granbury and Glen Rose. It will serve our largest cave -- Longhorn Cavern. It will traverse the Central Mineral Region, the early German settlements with their European-type towns, the historic location of President Johnson's birthplace, boyhood and the 'Texas White House." We already have about 80 workers assigned to this project. We have received some equipment from the Surplus Property Administration, and we expect to obtain more. We have the full support and cooperation of the State Department of Parks and Wildlife and the State Highway Department. Gov. Briscoe has been most interested and helpful. The socal counties and "Small Cities" along the way have given fine support. The Federal Departments of Interior and of Agriculture are hoth giving aid; and, in this connection, we are very hopeful that the National Headquarters for "Parkways" will be established in Central Texas. We are the first to get a Parkway of this kind anderway. There have been a number of "Parkways" built for that sole purpose, but we are setting a new precedent of using existing roads and doing much of the work with labor that costs nothing EXTRA. (That is, it is paid for whether we use it or not.) This Parkway will be within 75 miles of approximately 50% of the people of Texas. It is primarily for their pleasure and enjoyment, but it will be used by thousands of out-of-state visitors. These visitors will all spend money. It will undoubtedly be most helpful to the economy of our State.
